FROM THE CHAIRPERSON'S DESK



THE RIPPLE EFFECT IN REAL LIFE

The theme of this year's Endeavour is "Every Ripple Starts with an Opportunity," and that is such an important statement. While opportunities present themselves in small moments, we tend to seize them because we see something beyond that moment. It may be only a small spark, giving us an idea of a different, yet still distant, future. It may be just a glimpse of something we hope for but are not even sure is possible. That future is yours to shape and make your own.

When you had the opportunity to join this program, you became part of something bigger. Applying and interviewing for the UWB-FSF family can be compared to throwing a stone into the water. Once selected, your parents, your fellow students, the supportive team at FSF and UWB, the alumni of this program, and future students all trust you to create more ripples.

The first ripple is very personal; it is part of your unique journey. You overcome the financial barriers to studying and can go on to increase your knowledge, build your confidence, and pursue your career. The second set of ripples is the effect this has on your family. Many of you are first-generation university students. Your parents have often sacrificed a great deal to help you complete your twelfth standard. You are the face of change. While you are certainly the pride of your parents (and of us), you also show your younger siblings, your extended family, your neighbours, and others in similar situations that there are options, there are opportunities, and change is possible.

Despite underemployment being a realistic challenge in the current economy, many of you prove that education can help change the socio-economic status of your family, making life easier for your parents and younger brothers and sisters.

The third set of ripples extends even further; it impacts the wider community and, hopefully, Indian society at large. This happens when you grow in your academic or professional career, mentor juniors, refer jobs, guide students to programmes such as this one, contribute to society, and give back—not only financially but also through your time, knowledge, and support.

Honestly, seizing an opportunity can feel like a great responsibility. We understand. Starting this ripple effect does not mean the journey will always be smooth or easy. Where there are ripples, there can be instability too. Seizing opportunities rarely comes without challenges. Change and growth usually require stepping outside your comfort zone.



When you start college, it may not be what you expected. Perhaps you are away from your familiar surroundings for the first time. Perhaps the courses are not at all what you imagined. The language may be challenging, the people different from the friends you have known, the housing and food unfamiliar, your first examinations more difficult than expected, or your first boss more demanding than you anticipated. These experiences can all cause tension and anxiety, and there is nothing unusual about experiencing such growing pains. It is important to realise that you are not alone.



There is no shame in asking for support to sustain the positive ripple effect, nor is there any shame in seeking help when you feel overwhelmed by what is happening in your life. We are here for all the ups and downs, through every ripple. We have seen many students graduate, secure rewarding careers, start successful businesses, continue their studies, clear civil service examinations, support their families, build homes, raise children, and sponsor students who once stood where they did.

We have also seen students who needed more guidance along the way, and that is perfectly fine—we are here for all of it. One single opportunity can change the course of your life, both present and future, and that is one distinct kind of ripple. However, the beauty of the ripple effect is that it spreads in many directions and often leads to unexpected outcomes. This is something we are privileged to witness in your lives and, I believe I can speak for everyone involved with FSF and UWB, in our lives as well.

This project itself began as a ripple. That ripple originated in friendship, deep mutual respect, and an unwavering belief in the power of education. It was a small idea from Roelf and Fenny that has continuously been supported by Tinoo, Yasmin, Shivinder, and Dhanu. Over time, that ripple became a wave. These friends support not only the project and me personally but all of you as well. None of this would have been possible without them, and I remain deeply grateful for this ripple.

From the very beginning, this project has been about more than financial assistance. It has been about supporting you as students and encouraging the ripple effect so that your future families, communities, and country can benefit from your growth.

This is why we support you and organise activities, including student get-togethers, to strengthen your network and equip you with tools to navigate challenges. Ultimately, this is why we strongly encourage you to apply your talent in India after graduation. Creating a ripple effect through families, communities, and generations has always been the intention, and witnessing these ripples travel further and wider than anyone could have imagined is truly extraordinary.

With the incredible and deeply committed team at UWB–Nilam, Meera, Reshma, and Jaimin–working alongside you to amplify the ripple effect, you can seize any opportunity that comes your way. We have a responsibility towards you, and we care about that deeply.

Celebrate your achievements, but remain humble. Keep reaching back to support those still searching for their first opportunity or just beginning their journey.

Do not let anyone tell you that you started at a disadvantage. Your background did not weaken you; it gave you the hunger, resilience, and determination to persevere. We have seen it. Please remember it, and support those who need it.

The stone has been dropped. The opportunity is now in your hands. Keep showing up, make the most of everything this programme and its incredible family of students and alumni have to offer, and let your life create ripples that change the future of young students like yourselves–and the future of India.

In 2005, **United Way of Baroda** joined hands with **Stichting Fusion Study Foundation**, Netherlands, to launch the **Fusion Study Foundation (FSF) Project**. Supported by the generous contribution of the Van der Wijk family, the initiative was established to help deserving students pursue higher education in engineering, medical, and other professional fields.

The project focuses on creating opportunities for students from underprivileged backgrounds by not only supporting their education but also strengthening the financial stability of their families through career opportunities in multinational companies, national organizations, and start-ups. Inspired by the vision of the Van der Wijk family, United Way of Baroda further expanded the initiative in 2010 with the support of corporate partners and board members. To date, more than 1,460 students have benefitted from the support of the Fusion Study Foundation and United Way of Baroda.



Built on a sustainable, interest-free loan model, FSF encourages students to achieve educational independence and build successful careers. The initiative also nurtures a spirit of giving back, enabling beneficiaries to support future students in need. By reducing financial burdens on families and promoting long-term educational empowerment, the project continues to create a lasting cycle of opportunity and support for future generations.

PROJECT INITIATION

13 July 2005 – First MOU meeting held at United Way of Baroda. The programme was launched by supporting three students.

Launched the Project Magazine and Roadshow as a major project activity.

Project completed 10 years, reaching a total of 376 students.
Online application portal launched, and database management software implementation began.

In response to the COVID-19 pandemic, the entire process shifted online. Interviews were conducted via Zoom video calls, and 166 students were selected.

Project reaches a milestone of 1,460 students supported in Gujarat. The 21st batch marks a new chapter in its journey.

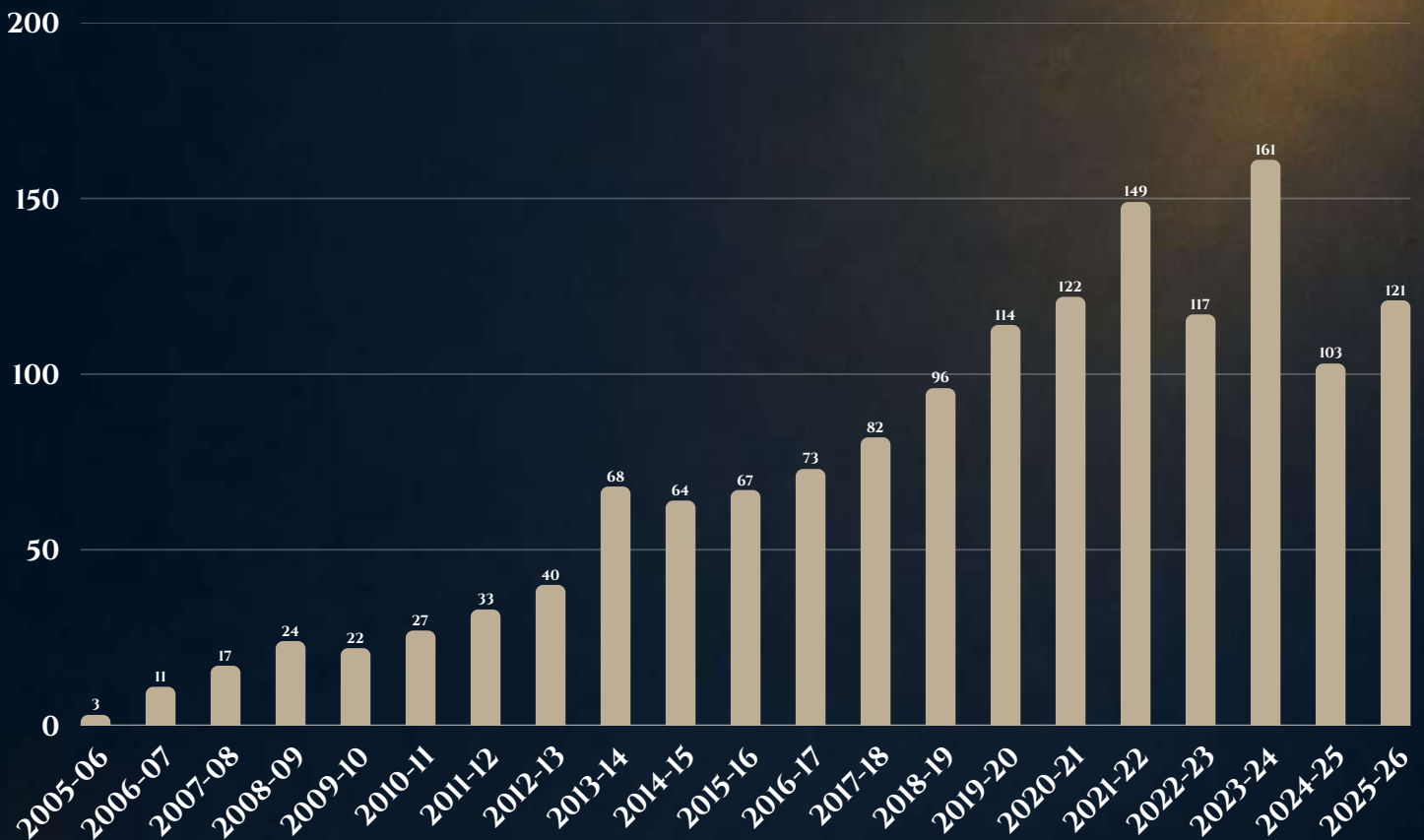

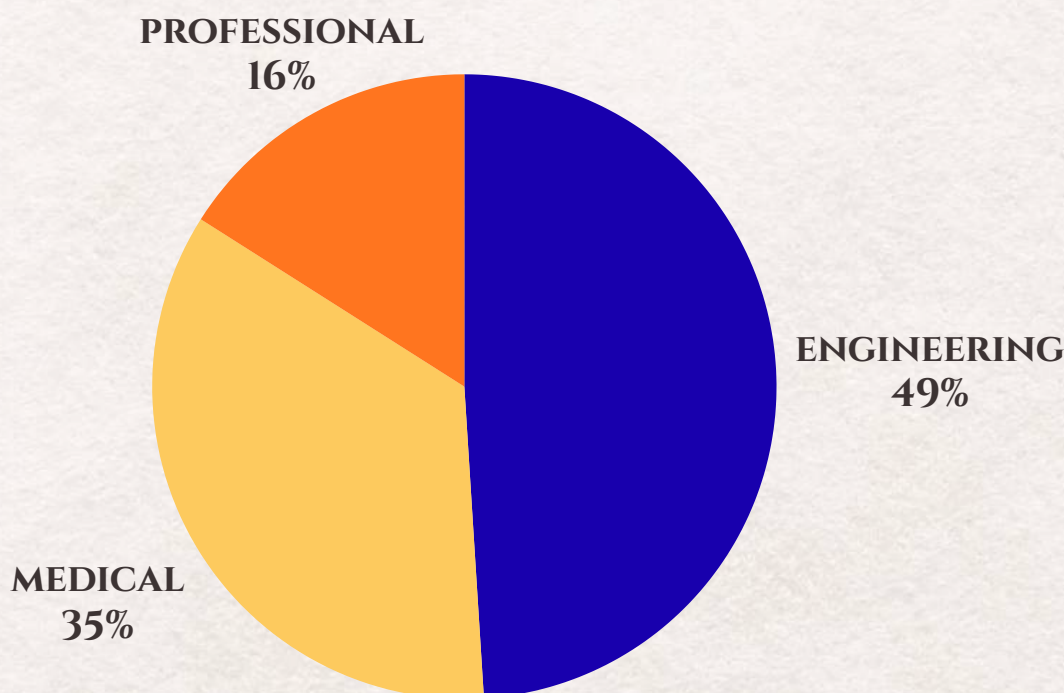


STUDENTS SUPPORTED THROUGH THE YEARS

What began in 2005 with the support of just three students has evolved into a transformative educational initiative that impacts hundreds of lives each year. In 2023-24, the program achieved a significant milestone by supporting 161 students, the highest number of beneficiaries in a single year. Since the strengthening of the FSF-UWB partnership in 2010-11, the initiative has steadily expanded its reach, empowering more young individuals to pursue their academic aspirations and build brighter futures. Over the past 20 years, the program has supported 1,460 students, creating a powerful ripple effect that extends far beyond the individual beneficiaries to their families, communities, and society at large. From its humble beginnings to a program that now empowers over 100 students annually, this journey stands as a testament to the transformative power of education in unlocking opportunities and changing lives.

STUDENTS SUPPORTED BY DISCIPLINE

Our commitment to educational empowerment extends across a diverse range of academic disciplines, ensuring that financial constraints never become a barrier to talent and ambition. Over the years, the program has supported 701 students in Engineering, enabling aspiring professionals to pursue technical education and build successful careers across various specializations. In the field of Medicine and Healthcare, 239 students have received support and have gone on to serve as doctors, healthcare professionals, and specialists, contributing meaningfully to society. Additionally, 520 students pursuing Professional and Allied Courses, including Chartered Accountancy, Company Secretaryship, Law, Commerce, Management, Computer Applications, and Pure Sciences, have been empowered to achieve their academic and professional aspirations. By supporting students across a wide spectrum of educational pathways, the initiative continues to create a lasting ripple effect, nurturing skilled professionals, responsible citizens, and future leaders who contribute positively to their families, communities, and society at large.

GET TOGETHER



The bi-annual UWB-FSF Student Get Together serves as a cherished platform that brings together students, alumni, mentors, trustees, and supporters to connect, learn, and celebrate the shared journey of the Fusion Study Foundation. More than just a gathering, these events strengthen the bonds within the FSF family, foster meaningful interactions, and inspire students through enriching learning experiences.

On 13 July 2025, the Student Get Together marked a significant milestone as the Foundation celebrated 20 years of transforming lives through education. During this critical phase, support from Fusion Study Foundation provided both financial assistance and guidance, enabling him to stay focused on his studies. Today, Bhagyesh works as an Executive Trainee at Plasser India Pvt. Ltd., having joined in April 2025 with a CTC of ₹6 lakh per annum. Reflecting on his journey, he shares, “Fusion Study Foundation provided excellent support in terms of financial help and guidance, making a significant positive impact on my studies and career direction.”

Today, he serves as an Assistant Tribal Development Officer, having joined in December 2025 with an annual income of ₹6 lakh. Reflecting on his journey, Sarth shares, “Like a family, UWB helped in every situation.” His story exemplifies how timely support and perseverance can transform aspirations into achievements.

Reflecting on his journey, he shares, "FSF played a crucial role in my MBBS journey by offering an interest-free loan, allowing me to continue my education without financial stress."

TURNING POTENTIAL INTO PROGRESS

With support from Fusion Study Foundation, Hardik was able to undertake GATE coaching and successfully clear GATE 2020 with a strong merit rank. This achievement led him to Power Grid Corporation of India Ltd., a Maharatna PSU of the Government of India, where he joined as a Deputy Manager in June 2021.

Reflecting on his journey, he shares, "FSF helped me pursue GATE coaching when my financial circumstances made it difficult. Their support enabled me to clear the examination and secure a prestigious position in a Maharatna PSU."

He scored 91.33% in Class 10 and 80% in Class 12 (92.33% in PCM) before pursuing his undergraduate studies at Dhirubhai Ambani University, where he graduated with a CGPA of 7.30.

With the support of Fusion Study Foundation, Hardik was able to pursue his education with confidence and focus on achieving his goals. Today, he is working as a Software Developer, having started his professional journey in January 2024 with a package of ₹8 LPA.

Reflecting on his journey, he shares, "The support I received from FSF was more than financial assistance. It was an investment in my future. Today, as a working professional, I'm proud to be a result of that support and trust."

Reflecting on her journey, Shruti shares, “When my dreams were bigger than my pocket, FSF didn’t just provide financial support—they gave me belief. Their trust transformed a struggling student into a Chartered Accountant and turned a dream into reality.”
