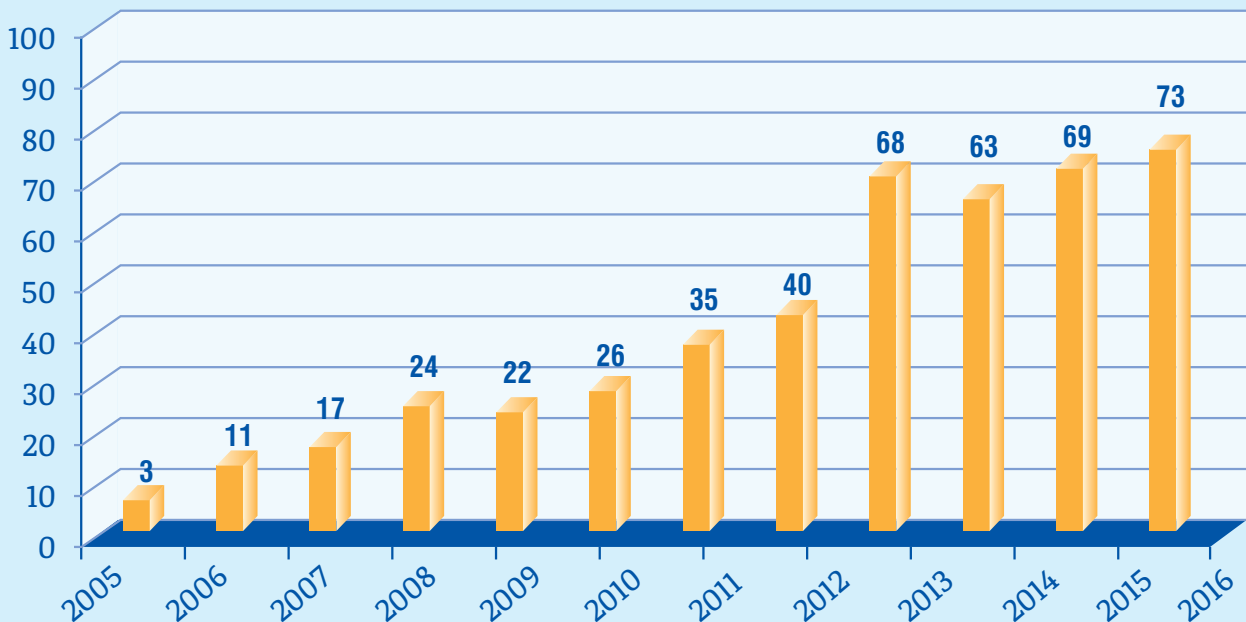
FUSION STUDY FOUNDATION PROJECT

These students are given interest free loan and constantly mentored till they graduate and get employed. This project has helped the students to emerge as accomplished individuals. It has helped students to graduate and post-graduate in the field of Engineering, Medicine, Accounts, Business Management and Administration. We are indeed grateful to the Van der Wijk family for their large donations and specially to Ms. Linda Van der Wijk for dedication towards this project and her empathy with all these children who have become her own.

Road Show

Every year in December, a road show is undertaken to promulgate the project through awareness programmes at various schools in several districts of Gujarat. The team has covered the most interior areas to spread information about the project. This year Surendranagar district was covered, United Way Baroda visited 25 schools reaching out to 3004 students and 114 teachers from Science, Commerce and Arts stream. The responses of the rural school principals and teachers' was overwhelming. They appreciated the concept and agreed to refer the under privileged and bright students for the interest free educational loan.

This year the get-together organised on 22nd January 2017 was attended by 148 students from different cities of Gujarat. 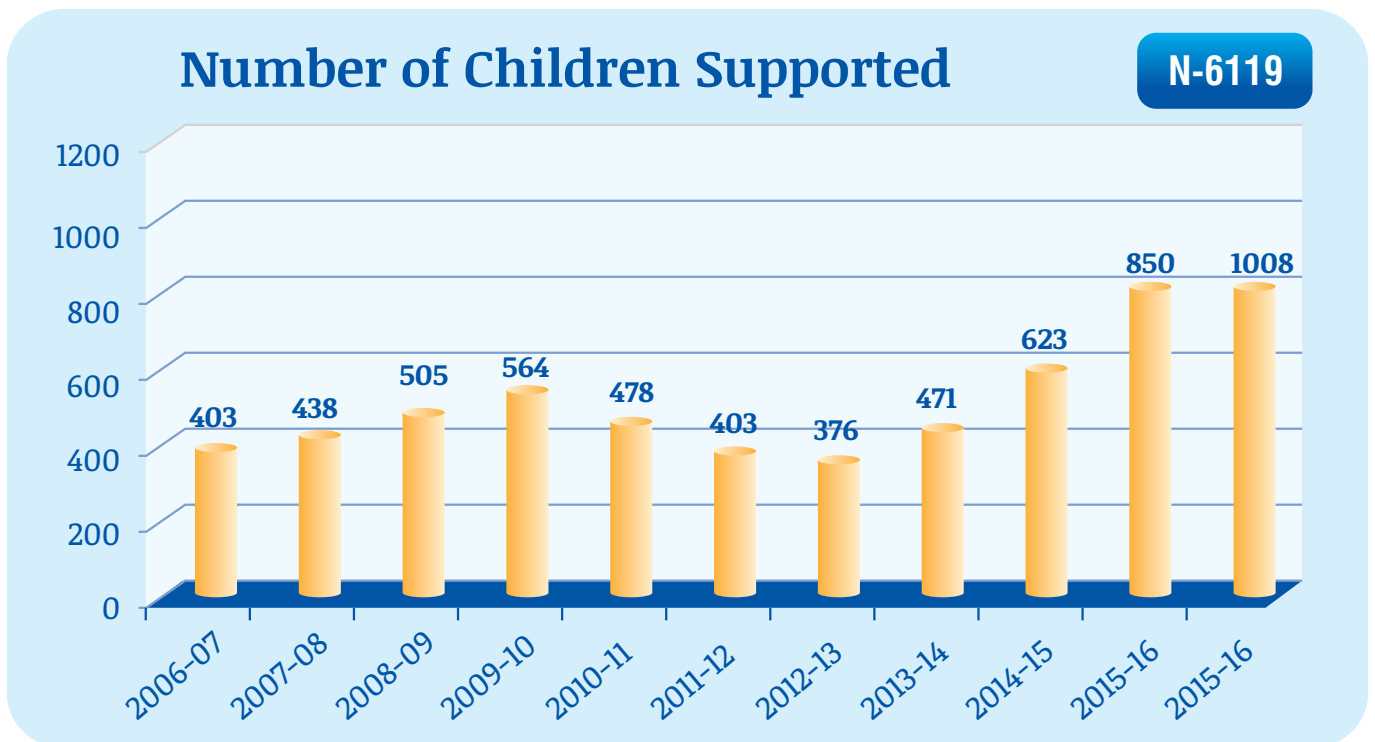

VISHNUBHAI AMIN ORPHAN AND DESTITUTE PROJECT

Education is perceived as a luxury for many underprivileged in the country for whom earning a livelihood and taking care of their family becomes a priority. The Indian Government has laid emphasis on the importance of education and made education a Fundamental Right of every child. The 'Right to Education' Act came into effect on 1 April 2010, highlighting the importance of free and compulsory education for children aged between 6-14 years in India.

United Way Baroda promotes primary education especially for the vulnerable children through Vishnubhai Amin Orphan and Destitute project. Educational and overall developmental support is provided to the orphans and destitute school children of Vadodara through various activities.



Educational Kit Distribution

The educational kit distribution was held on 5th August, 2016 at Lions Hall, Vadodara. A total of 665 Orphan and Destitute children studying in 105 different municipal corporation schools were provided educational kit comprising of necessary educational material like school bag, note

books, text books, dictionary, tiffin box, water bag, geometry box & various other stationery items required for entire academic year. Shri Keyur Rokadia, Chairman, Nagar Prathmik Sikshan Samiti was the Chief Guest for the event and Mr. Shivinder Singh Chawla, Chair UWB, was present there too.

GOLD CARD SCHEME

The sudden rise in elderly population is due to increased life expectancy owing to advanced medical facilities and developments in recent past. However, even though their longevity has increased, they still face numerous physical, psychological and social challenges in daily life which makes it difficult for them to undertake routine activities.

United Way of Baroda initiated Gold Card Scheme on “World Elderly Day” in 1997, providing several benefits and assistance to the elderly with various routine activities. We have successfully provided assistance to the elderly since last 20 years, now.

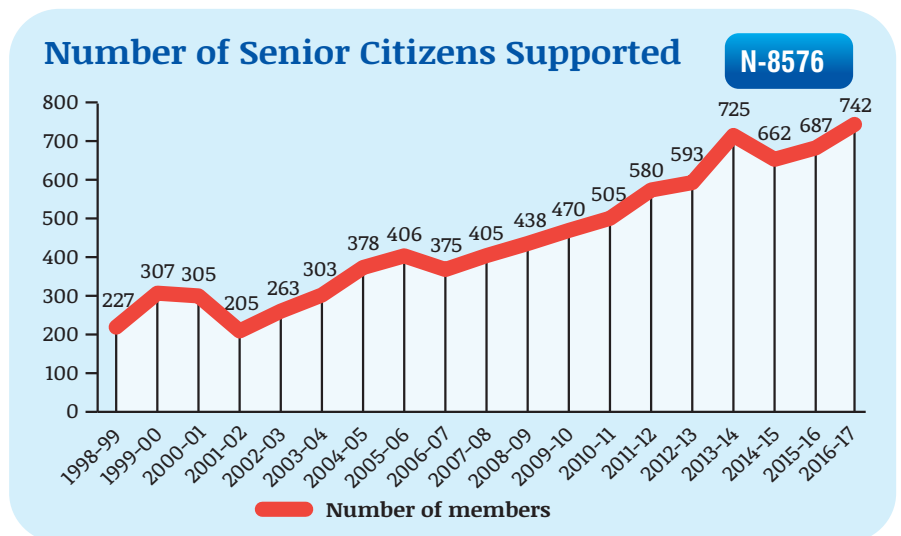
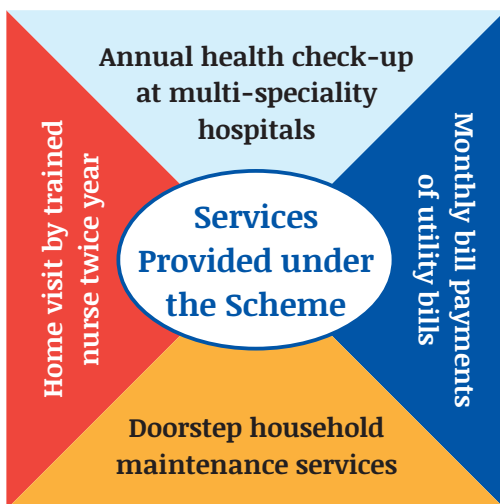

Education is the Key to Success...

Rahul, was a bright student since childhood. His father works in a textile mill as a daily wage worker and mother is a housewife. He scored 89.6% and 80.8% in 10th and 12th grade. He secured a seat in G.H. Patel college, Anand in Electrical Engineering. He managed his 1st and 2nd year fees with the help of his relatives and friends. But the journey seemed to end soon due to the financial constraints in his family. His father could not manage to pay the fees. His friends and relatives had also stepped back. He was stressed, as quitting studies was like a nightmare for him. He could see his dreams of higher education shattering in front of his eyes. During that period he came across the advertisement of the project in the newspaper. He applied for it and got selected and completed his 3rd and final year. He completed his bachelors with 81%. He now works at **Infosys**, Hyderabad and is earning well and supporting his family.



Ensuring Girl Child Education...

Harshita Chaudhary, is a 12 year old girl who lost her parents at a very small age. She was adopted by her elder brother Devo and his wife Kanta. She always dreamt of a beautiful future. She required adequate financial aid and proper guidance to channelize her hard work. Her brother is a daily wager who cannot afford her educational expenses. Vishnubhai Amin Orphan and Destitute project supports her dream of education. She was provided with educational kit along with overall development support. She says *“The educational kit provided to me is like a treasure.”*



A Support Stick for Old Age...

Mr. S P Gupta, is an 80 year old man residing with his wife, son and daughter in law at his residence. His wife Mrs. Pushpa Gupta, 79 years old is also a Gold Card Member. His son works with an MNC and has to travel out of the city in most of the occasions. Therefore, they can't depend on him for daily household chores. He came to know about the Gold Card Scheme from one of the existing member.

He approached United Way Baroda office to obtain more details. He was convinced with the scheme and became a member in 2002. Since then he has been a satisfied member and continued his partnership with us. He is happily taking the benefit of all the services. He says, the services provided for medical check-up by nurse and hospital, is of immense importance. *“A service with smile and that too at one's doorsteps is really an enriching experience”* as quoted by him.



Towards A Brighter Tomorrow...

Dhruv Sonera, is a differently abled boy since birth. He stays with his parents and younger brother at Madhodhar village. He is an intelligent boy as a result of which his father transferred him from Government school to a private school. But the cost of education at private school was not affordable for his parents. He was identified during a survey and interviewed for the Savera Educational Sponsorship project. He was selected under the project. He now gets free educational kits and his school fee has been taken care of. He also avails the government schemes such as physically challenged certificate, State Transportation Bus Pass, Railway Pass etc. He now plays cricket and is developing like a normal child. His family members are happy to see his progress.



A Healthier & Playful Childhood...

Mahi Tadvi, is a 4.5 year old girl residing in the slums of Ramdevnagar, Vadodara. She lives in a family of five-members where her father is the sole bread earner with a monthly income of Rs. 7000.

Mahi's weight during birth was 1.5 kg which put her life into risks. She remained weak in her health in later years also. According to her mother Nikitaben, due to lack of income it was difficult for them to provide nutritious food to their daughter due to which she remained weak and prone to diseases.



When Mahi first came at anganwadi she was categorized in yellow zone (moderately malnourished) wherein she weighed only 9 kgs at the age of 2. Due to the milk and fruits provided at the AWC, Mahi showed a great sign of recovery. She gained 3 Kgs of weight and entered the green zone.

She has recently started going to school. Her mother says, *Dudh Kela na lidhe mari dikri na wajan vadhyo che* (I am really happy that my daughter's weight increased due to milk and fruits provided at the AWC)

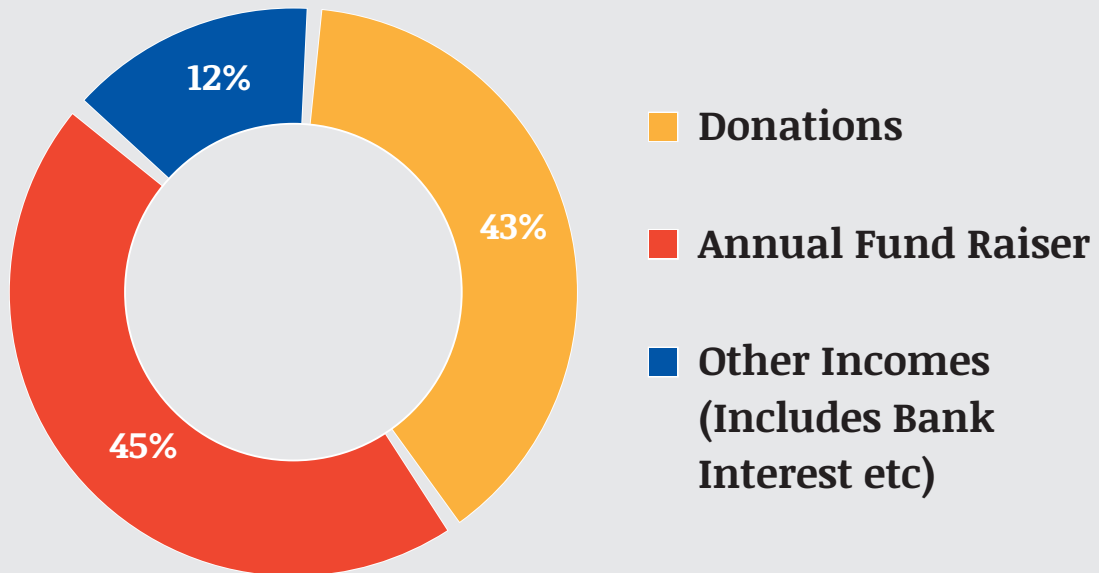
Creativity Towards Empowerment...

Naresh Agarwal, is a 23 year old man with an intellectual disability. His family faced a lot of problems due to his disability. He was placed at a NGO supported by United Way Baroda wherein he was trained for creative activities like drawing, crayoning pasting, paper bag making, broom making. These activities enhanced his skills and he became a punctual student of the training center.

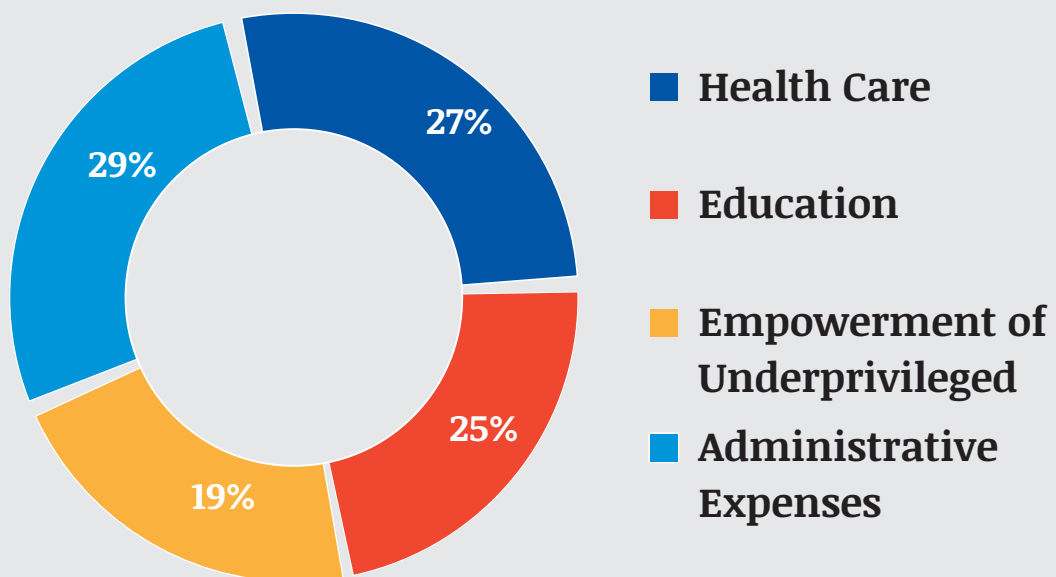

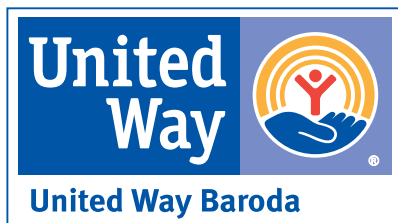
