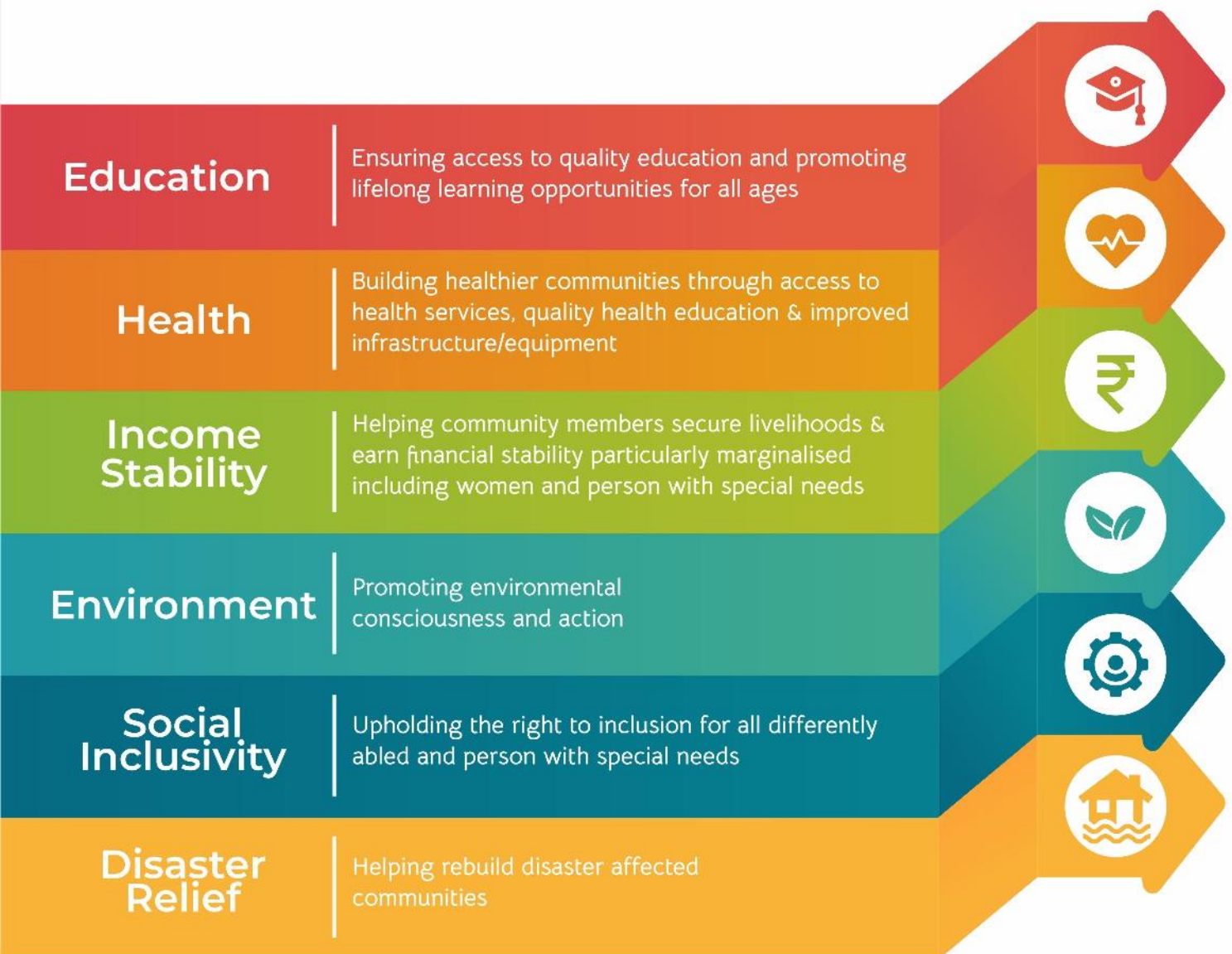

United Fusion Study Foundation project is flagship project of UWB. The project was specially designed to help underprivileged students by giving them interest free loans. It provides opportunity to the students to pursue their graduation and post-graduation studies in the fields of engineering, medical, chartered accountant, business management and administration through direct financial assistance for education, lodging and boarding expenses.

According to the market we measure our success in actual lives changed. These stories are a testament to the difference that communities can make when we come together to create lasting change.

- Currently project supports **743** students out of which **474** are engineers, **162** are medical professionals and **107** from other professional fields.
- 42% have successfully completed their graduation and out of them 66% of graduated students are employed in National and Multinational companies and rest continuing their higher studies.

The project is majorly supported by UWB funds and Stichting Fusion Study Foundation, Netherlands. Time to time many Philanthropies Board members, Sitanjali foundation, Dr A.C. Shah Trust and Corporate partners Reinhardt Roto Machines, Koch Chemical Technology Group India Pvt. It was very difficult for her father to manage a four-member family and pay her college fees. She came to know about the project through her friend and applied to lessen the education burden to her family. She got selected under United Way of Baroda in 2014 for her complete college

education. Shraddha proved herself by maintaining 8 CGPA in all her semesters. She got 2nd rank in National Level Tech fest. She cracked GATE 2019 in first attempt. She is now working with Torrent Pharmaceutical Company, Mehsana as Executive Trainee with package of INR 2.4 lakhs at initial stage.

Shraddha quoted that

"With the help of United Way of Baroda, I was able to study and now I am also paying fees of my brother. I feel proud to be independent. Organization gave wings to my dreams to make it a reality."

Avin Patel's success journey with us

Avin had always dreamt of becoming a computer engineer. He scored 79% in 10th std and 70% in 12th std. His father who was only the bread winner had epilepsy attack when he was in 12th std. It was very difficult for the family to pay both for treatment and his studies. His mother read about project advertisements in the newspaper and he applied for the same. He got selected for his complete higher studies and family got relieved from one of the expense. The project has also groomed the personality of Avin through regular mentoring workshops. Avin secured 8.29 CGPA in computer science and got placement in Clover Infotech Mumbai designated as Oracle EBS software engineer. Now earns a package of INR 7.3 lakhs.

Vishnubhai Amin Orphan & Destitute Project



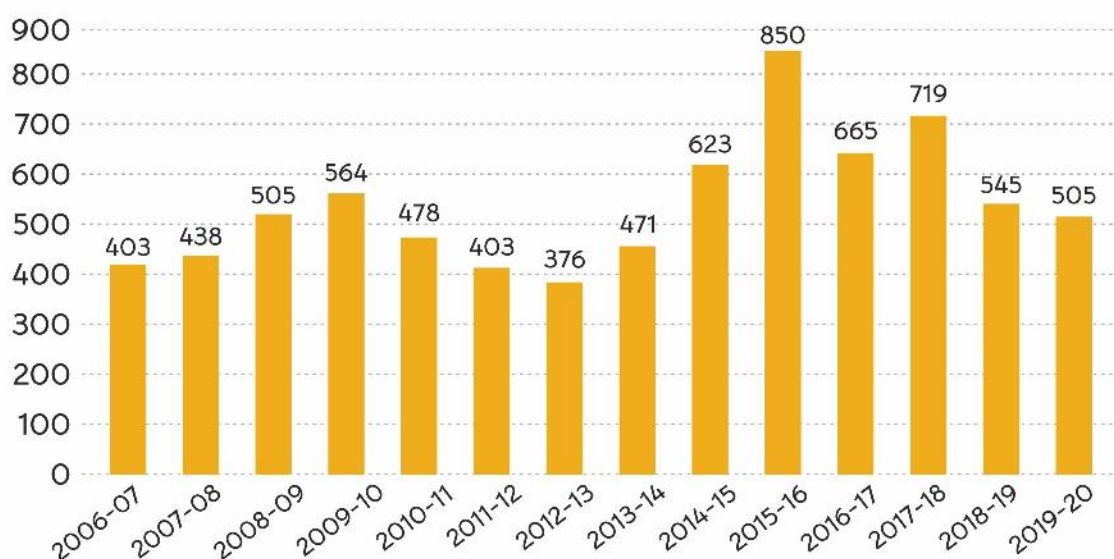
In India, orphan data is estimated to be 29.6 million. The government's annual expenditure on child protection is ₹ 1500 crores which is more than the last year, still amounts to less than ₹ 2 per child per day, that too for food, clothing, education and medical needs!

Vishnubhai Amin Orphan and Destitute project of UWB has been running since 2005 supporting educational kits to underprivileged students at the start of every academic year.

The project has strategically partnered with the 104 Municipal Schools of Vadodara City to achieve this strategic objective of rehabilitating the orphan and destitute children.

Till date, 7545 orphan and vulnerable children of 104 NPSS primary schools are benefitted.

Single Parent Education PROJECT

An estimated 13 million, (4.5%) of all Indian households are run by single mothers, says a UN report which draws attention to the significant number of lone parent families in the country. At times due to low income and weak financial background the single parent struggles to provide the child with basic things needed for school readiness

The Single Parent Project was initiated in 2018 with the vision to support the children of single parents who belong to the humble financial background. The program has supported more than 3500+ till date. This year 1408 children were enrolled in the program. The project supports such children by giving them educational kits comprising of 22 items including bag, notebooks, etc.

As a part of this project, a "Make a Wish" drive was organised wherein 201 wishes from 8 municipal Corporation Schools in Vadodara were received. Corporate Zydex supported to fulfil their wishes along with UWB. To add even more glitter to this celebration, students were invited to celebrated KSHITIJ – Kite Flying Festival.

Till now **3585** Single Parent students have been supported from 104 municipal Corporation Schools of Vadodara.



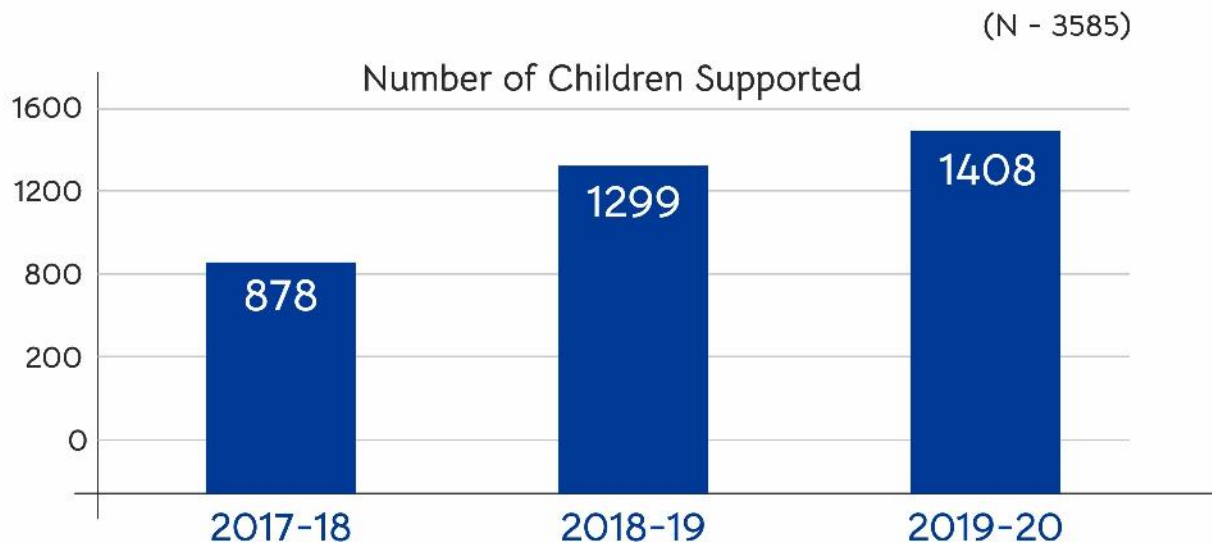

Shikhar Scholarship Project

The cost of education in India is increasing at a fast pace. From primary to secondary to higher education, parents are increasingly finding it difficult to meet the growing fee structure and other costs associated with education. When it comes to science stream it is far expensive. To support needy parents and provide an opportunity to bright students Shikhar Program was launched in 2018.

Her father served in construction line but had lost his job and could not get another job. His savings were exhausted. It was difficult for him to support his daughter. His father urged to support his daughter in this financial crisis to provide her a bright career. Priyanshi was awarded ₹ 30,000 Scholarship from Shikhar Education Program for School fees to continue her higher studies.



Hardik Prajapati

Hardik Prajapati always dreamt of becoming a successful engineer. He is very hard working and passionate to study in Information Communication and Technology engineering. He scored 91% in 10th std and 87% in 11th std. His father is a tailor and doesn't have a fixed salary. He earns hardly INR 8000 to 10,000 in a month. His mother works as a cook to support the family. She tries to earn INR 3000 in a month. He has an elder sister pursuing B.Com.

They came to know about Shikhar Scholarship Project through one of his friend. He immediately applied and was selected for 12th std scholarship under the project. He received ₹ 15,000 scholarship for 12th std fees. He was also guided under mentoring session for success in exams. He successfully cleared his 12th std with 92%. We are proud of him.

Primary & Secondary Educational Scholarship

Since 2012 UWB is also sponsoring 400 needy students yearly from the urban and rural schools of Vadodara to attain quality school education and making it possible for the children to have a bright future through our partner NGO Baroda Citizens Council under Savera Project. Till date 2800 students have been supported by us.



Shinal Valand

Shinal a hardworking girl of a small village named Madodhar of Waghodia block, has a dream of becoming a scientist in the future. She routed her dreams into reality through her performance. She scored 89% in 8th std, 95% 9th std, and 83 % in 10th std. She is currently pursuing 11th Science from Unnati Vidhyalaya. Her father is an auto-rickshaw driver and her mother is a housewife. She has been supported under Savera Educational Sponsorship Project since 5 years. This year she was also awarded Savera Star Scholarship of ₹ 15,000

Educational Support Towards Wards of Deceased Police Personnel

UWB supports all the wards of deceased police personnel of Vadodara for their educational expenses including educational kits. The children are also provided with periodic counselling, home visits and parents meeting to assess their educational development. Till date 254 students have been supported since 10 years.



Rishikesh Parmar

Rishikesh stays with his mother. His father was a constable and was martyred on duty in the year 2012. Rishikesh is very bright and is getting sponsorship under the Police Educational Sponsorship Program since 2012. The mother is grateful to the organization as her children are supported under the Program. Rishikesh has scored 82% in his 10th standard and has chosen science stream for his 11th grade. He dreams of becoming an engineer in future.

Educate on latest Legal compliance for Vadodara NGO PARTNERS

A full day workshop for Vadodara NGOs on 'Legal Compliance for NGOs' to make them aware about the latest legal compliance of NGOs was organized. More than 40 NGOs Trustee, CEO, Directors, CFO, Senior Accountant had participated.

Eminent speaker **Mr. Noshir Dadrawala**, CEO of Centre of Advancement of Philanthropy, Mumbai was the resource person of the workshop.

Various topics like Legal Fundamentals and Definition, Difference between Trust, Society and Section 8 Company, Income of Voluntary Organisations including understanding donations, grants & business income, CSR funds, Roles and Duties of the governing board, Income Tax (exemptions, deductions & compliance), FCRA key understanding of the law & related compliance and All key amendments under income tax and FCRA were explained in depth.



Involved Support In STEM INNOVATIONS

Science, technology, Engineering and Mathematics (STEM) education puts an emphasis on preparing future generations to be successful in their careers. The skills gained from STEM education extend beyond those needed to be successful in STEM fields, preparing children with varied interests. It also includes problem solving, critical thinking, creativity, curiosity, decision making, leadership, entrepreneurship, acceptance of failure and more. Regardless of the future career path considered by these children, these skill sets go a long way to preparing them to be innovative.

Sankalpana Project- A Joyful Math Program

Math phobia affects student's attitude towards the subject. Also, a prime reason for poor performance may be fear and anxiety students have toward math.

A study also suggests that teachers have to adopt collaborative and joyful approach to promote positive attitude among students toward math subject.

To help children learn math and to burst the myth about it being difficult, UWB initiated Project Sankalpana- to reduce the phobia of math in students studying in the government schools.

Sankalpana project was started to ease the math phobia among students of 3rd to 5th grade in 5 NPSS government schools of Vadodara city. An online math software was provided to five schools. UWB Mentor hold weekly classes in all the schools for three grades. Monthly tests were conducted to test the knowledge of the children.

An inter school Math Genius competition was also organised among the schools. Students were given an opportunity to show the talent of their math skills. Various rounds of curiosity were carried out and winner school and student excelled in the activities were awarded.

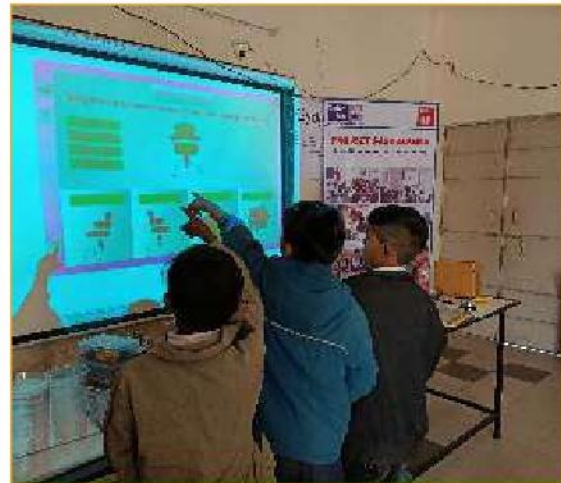
Impact Highlights

The project has catered to more than 750 students.

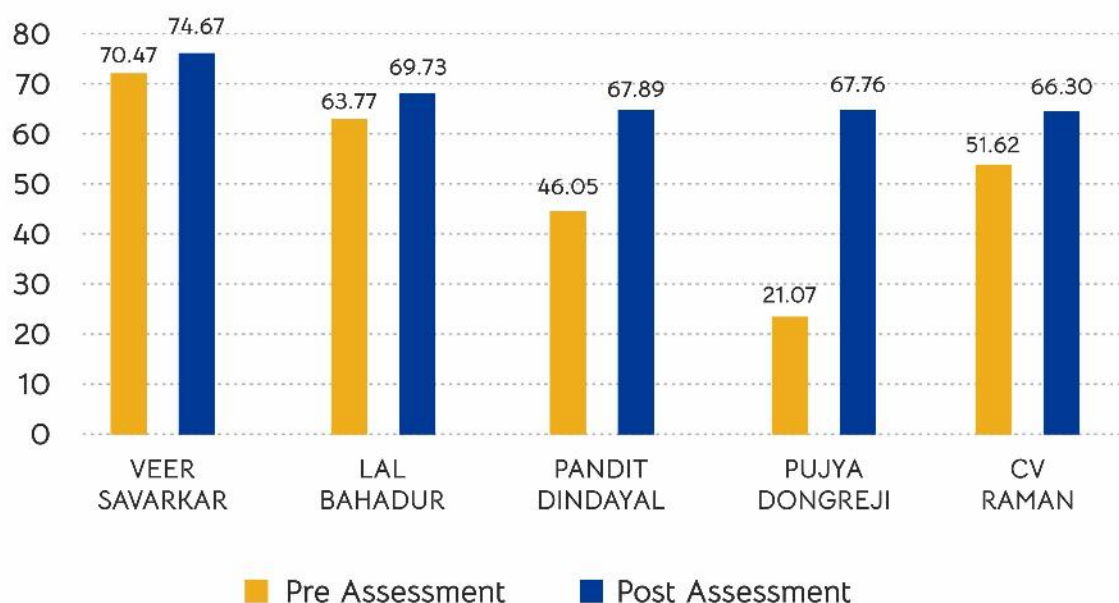
Students performance in the weekly test and post assessment also showed rise in percentage in all the five piloted schools.

Students have started showing interest, confidence in the solving the math problems.

Vigyan Express- A mobile experiential learning

Supplementing Municipal School with Experiential Science Learning is an educational intervention in 20 Municipal Schools of 6th to 8th grade of the Vadodara City. The program is being successfully implemented in partnership with our affiliated NGO partner Community Science Centre for last two years. The project has improved the overall performance of the students through hand on experience and technological incursions. It has been observed from the assessment that quotient of the girl's students fared better than boys this year also. The performance of the majority of the students in the average category during the baseline study shifted to excellent category during the endline assessment.

Teachers TOT, summer camp, inter school science competition and exposure visit to Science city was also done to enhance their curiosity and better understanding for the subject.

Overall the program has benefitted 3000 students and has imparted knowledge of scientific experiments.



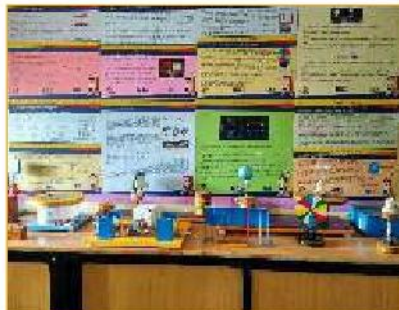
Jigyasa Project in Rural schools

Rural schools lack of proper infrastructure, teaching learning materials, lack of exposure in the schools. Concept demonstrations are rare, science laboratories are not well equipped and syllabus is not supported with hands on activities during the teaching sessions. In addition, Science teaching in Indian schools needs a radical overhaul to stop students losing interest.

Under the Jigyasa (i.e. Curiosity) Project, 7 rural government schools of Savli Taluka were provided with a mini science lab consisting of 68 table top models according to the current curricula with the humble support from **Corporate TD Williamson**. Under the project various STEM activities were conducted throughout the year.



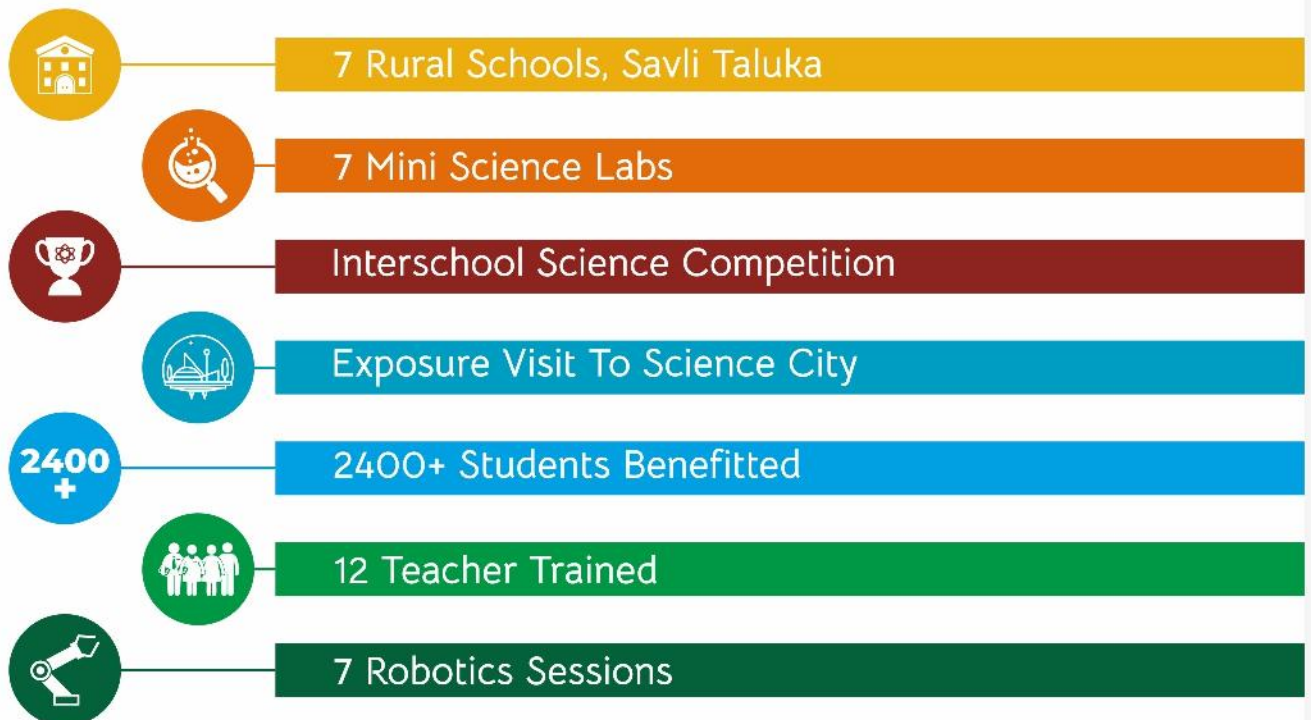

■ Robo Car Workshop

A robo-car making workshop was organized in the rural government schools to provide hands-on experience in making robot-cars including doing the wiring connections in a safe way which was supervised by an adult. The aim of this workshop was to increase the curiosity among students how things works, provide them an understanding and encourage them towards STEM learning. To make the whole experience even more fun, a robot-car race was organized at the end of every workshop where the 'drivers' were the students driving their own creations.

501 students from 44 schools participated in Essay writing and Poster making competition.

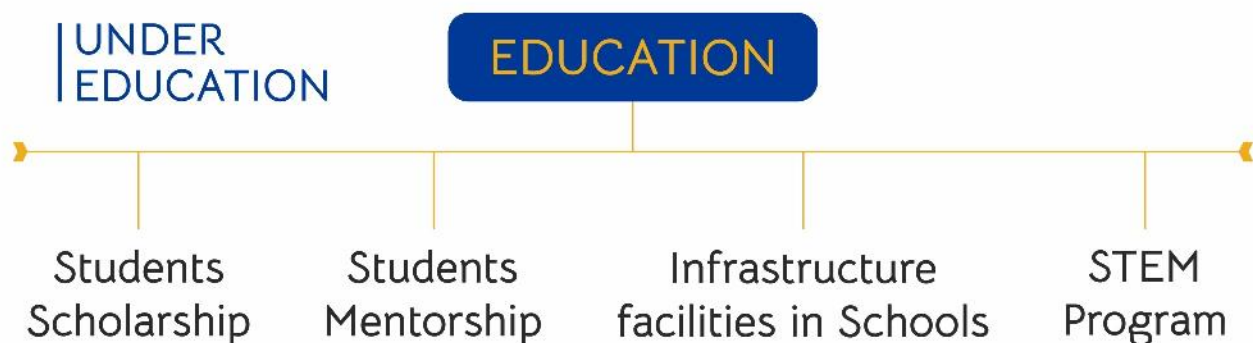
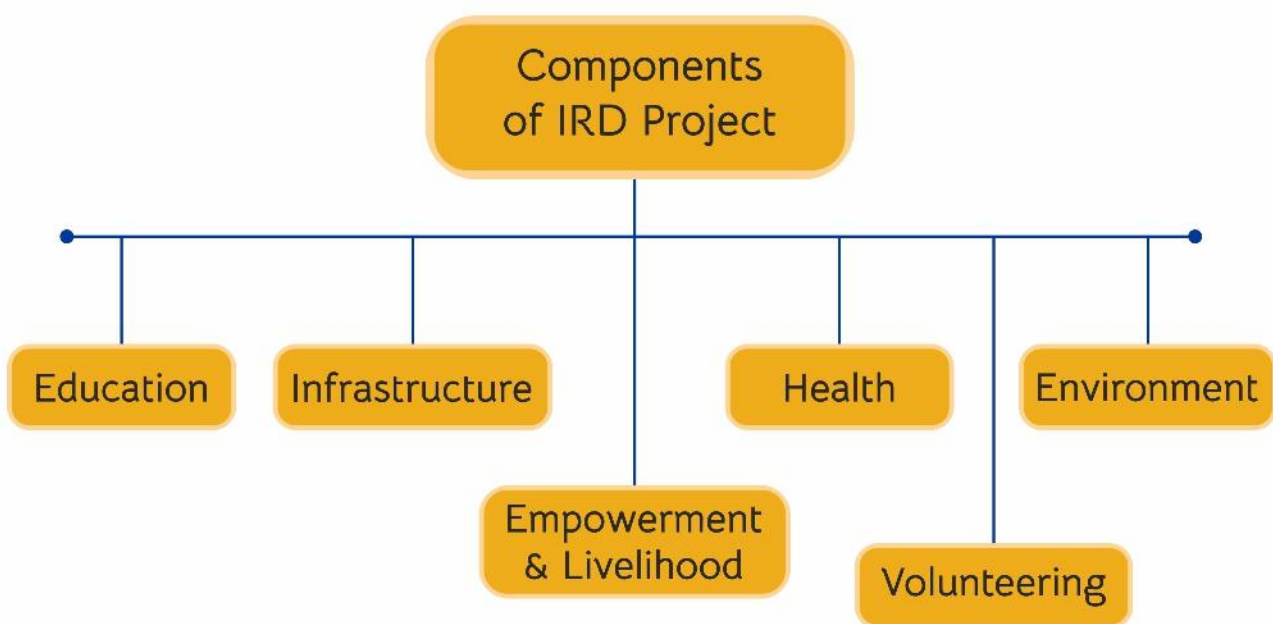

Integrated Rural Development PROGRAM

In India, education in the rural segments is not only important to eradicate poverty and illiteracy, but also for a variety of other social, economic as well as cultural and political reasons.

Integrated Rural Development project was started in the rural area of Gujarat with the support from CSR of corporate L.M. Wind Power and our network partner United Way of Bengaluru in 2018. This program is an amalgamation of various programs in the fields of health, education, sanitation, empowerment and environment. The program is benefiting the residents of 9 villages of Halol Taluka of Panchmahal district of Gujarat.



■ Student Scholarship Program

The rural scholarship program for 11th and 12th grade was initiated two years ago. 40 students were selected based on their dedication towards study and income crises. All the selected students were provided with scholarship, complete school kit, sanitary pad for girls, and support for computer and English session with mentorship program.

In first year of UWB's intervention overall school result for 12th board was only 57% and out of 35 sponsored students of 12th grade only 16 students were able to clear the board. While in next year in 2019-20, all the 12th grade sponsored students passed and overall school result noted 93.55% which is the school best and highest result as of now.

Over and above top rankers of the schools were girls and scored more than 75% in board. The holistic intervention of this project in this school has led to success of school and student's performance.



■ Student Mentorship Program



Mentorship program is carried out by a child psychologist to impart the knowledge of soft skills to the students. The selected students were enrolled in the Mentorship Program. Soft skills including effective communication, social, professional ethics, problem solving, decision-making, Grooming, Sex education sessions were conducted to enhance the learning of children. Total 17 sessions were imparted to the students to build the confidence and overall development.

English and Computer Teaching Support

A major need of learning English emerged out in the survey conducted in school as maximum student failed in Board exams in English subject. Another need was to have facilities of learning computer and enhance their computer skills. Hence a yearlong spoken English class and support for English subject was initiated to improve their English language skills and reduce the fear of English among the rural students. English session by retired professor was roped in the program to impart the education.

To enhance the computer skills of the students, a certified computer course (CCC) of three months was also introduced and sponsored students were provided the course for free in the school. Teacher was hired for the same to impart the computer education.

STEM Program



To enhance STEM learning in rural students, 5 rural schools were selected and Sankalpana project was initiated to provide complete teaching and learning solution through an eccentric instructional model, where children learn through manipulative and software activities while teachers play a role of facilitators in the learning process for students of grade 3rd – 5th. 400 students are benefitted. Each school has been provided required sets of hands on instruments and the software for practice sessions and teachers are trained to use the software in teaching the students. The project has improved the academic performance of the students. The average score of all the schools has enhanced from 33.3 % to 75.2 %.

■ Infrastructure Facilities

Computer Room:

A well-developed computer room with complete furniture, 10 computers, Projector with screen, white board, flooring, colouring, repairing was established in the school to enhance the access of the computer to students to learn and upgrade their skills.

Toilet Block:

A New toilet block was constructed with proper ventilation and water facilities for boys in the school. The block has 6 urinals & 3 WC Flush systems. A New toilet block was constructed with proper ventilation and water facilities for Muldhari Anganwadi children with washing area

Sport Equipment:

Provided in the school for overall development of students. Indoor and outdoor sport facilities were made. Tennis and Season Cricket Kit, Volleyball Kit, Football and Basket Ball kit were donated to schools.

Anganwadi Renovation:

Anganwadi's renovation done with complete, flooring, colouring, educational mural painting, water proofing, in the Duniya, Fatepuri and Wagwani Anganwadi.

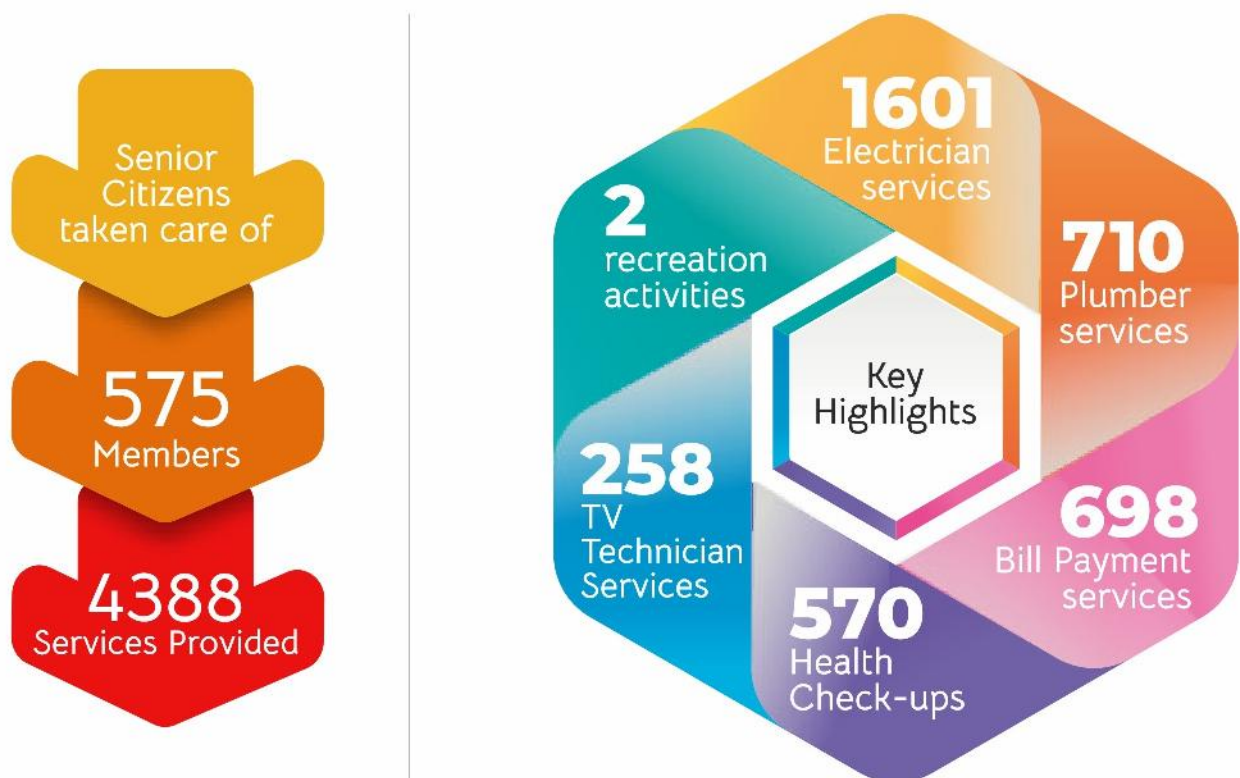

Every Infant Deserves A Holistic CARE

Shishu kit Project

Improving Maternal Health is one of the Sustainable Development Goal and a vital component towards achieving Continuum of Care. Despite the exponential increase in the institutional deliveries, the maternal mortality ration (MMR) of Gujarat is still has not declined at the proportionate level and remains as 91 per 1,00,000 live births. It is fared worse than the national average in achieving decline in Total Fertility Rate and Maternal Mortality Rate.

United Way of Baroda is running Project Shishu Kit since 2018—aiming at safe child and motherhood in collaboration with **Lalitbhai Patel Foundation**. It addresses mothers needs and sensitize women on motherhood and childcare related issues. Shishu Kit provides free 15 items to each new mother a pack of sanitary napkins, baby clothes, baby wrap towel, plastic mattress, iron and calcium tablets and mother gown, health awareness leaflets etc in a useful bag to take care during their post-delivery.

UWB has catered to more than 12040+ women and their babies who have gone for institutional delivery at government hospitals. The project is being implemented in two districts Vadodara and Anand District covering total 5 hospitals.

Behaviour Change Communication sessions are regularly conducted for mothers every week to sensitized them towards the proper care of their babies and themselves and aware them about Nutrition, immunization, family planning, breast feeding, stress release and related parameters. In this year total of 56 sessions were held and more than 1400 mothers were benefited.



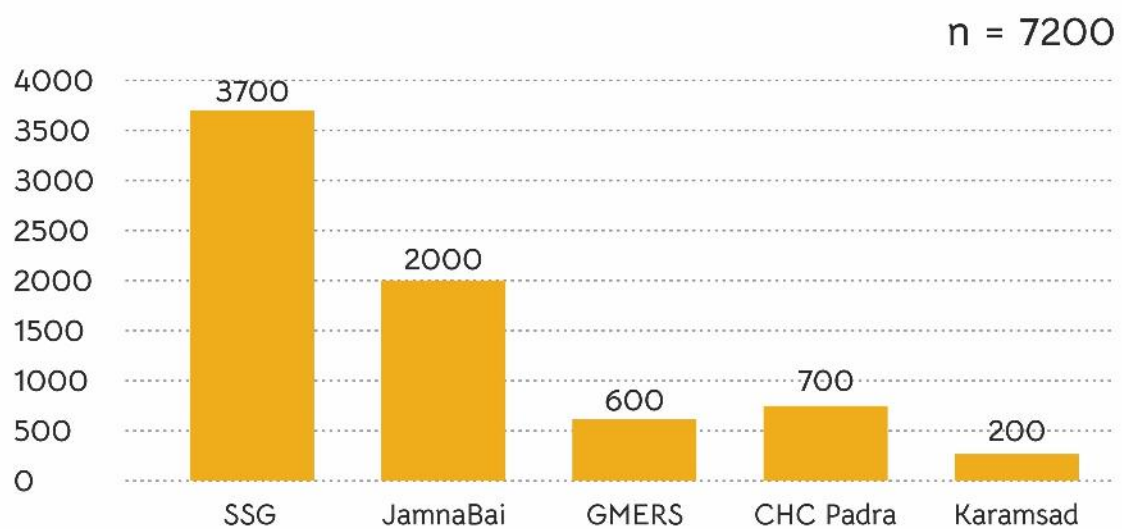
It has been observed that these mothers coming for delivery to the Vadodara and Anand hospitals comes from 24 districts of India covering 7 states of India. 65.4% are from BPL, only 3.4% beneficiaries are graduate and the rest are either illiterate or had primary education. It was also observed that 43.2% who comes to institutional delivery are in the age range from 19-23 years out of which 12.4 % had come for second or third delivery

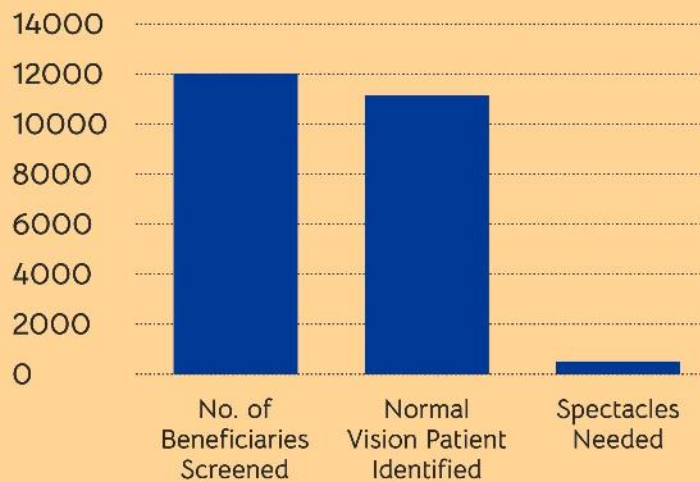

Education through Eye Care- Eye Screening Camp

- Vision problem affects 13.5 million children and almost quarter of adolescents overall 12-17% children are reported to have eye vision problems.
- Myopic children have trouble reading the black board notes or digital character of the class room presentation material displayed on screening.
- 7 million suffer from low vision and a further 10 million children have a correctable refractive error causing visual impairment.
- UWB in collaboration with Sabic India Pvt Ltd under their CSR, conducted eye screening camp for 12,500 primary government school students of Vadodara districts covering 52 urban and 7 rural schools. The screening was done for refraction, pinhole vision, colour vision, ocular movement, and checking for blepharitis.

Overall Finding of Eye Screening



Waghela Parveen is a 6th standard student studying at J.K. Gorwa School. Parveen had been experiencing eye pain and Recurring headaches. She was provided wrong spectacles by doctor due to that she experienced watery eyes and blurry vision. Upon checking it was diagnosed that she had cylindrical numbers and needed custom made spectacles which were provided to her. She was very happy and thankful for the gift she received.



Chunara Kalpesh is a 6th standard student studying in Shah Ramanlal Primary School. Kalpesh's father is a fruit vendor and his mother a home maker. Due to some genetic issues, kalpesh suffers from partial blindness. He has difficulty studying and making friends due to his condition. Parents generally ignore his condition as they have invested too much in his medical requirements. Kalpesh is a polite child with unavoidable financial crises situation. His eyes were re- checked and he was given high power glasses by UWB Sabic eye care project and was referred to the hospital.

United Way Of Baroda and all the other companies who has aided the children of my school is really admirable. They provided a cost-free treatment for eyes of every child who needed it with a pair of specs; which is praise worthy. Our school teaches students who aren't from a financially stable family, which makes it difficult for them to deal with medical costs. WaSH Program

KOCH-Engineered Solutions India and United Way of Baroda have been partnering in the noble cause of providing the rural school children with clean and safe drinking water since last 6 years. This tremendous example of great partnership has benefitted more than 50,000 children of 70+ schools by providing them with the Reverse Osmosis (RO) system and Water Cooler.

This year new schools were selected after detailed need assessment for provision of RO and Chiller. 10 rural schools of Savli and Padra block were provided with RO and Chiller. 5 years AMC were provided to ensure sustainability of the ROs system for longer time. Status of all the 70 ROs was conducted and required ROs systems were repaired and placed under AMC for further long life.

Water and health sensitization program were conducted in six schools separately wherein professional artists performed and made the session interesting for the children. The children and staff were sensitized on the importance of safe drinking water and how it helps to build better health and well-being. The importance of the intake of healthy food and proper ways of handwashing was also demonstrated to the children. An expert talk was also conducted in the schools to sensitize the children on various health issues.

Other Corporates – TD Williamson and LM Wind Power also joined hands for safe drinking water in school and communities for rural areas of Vadodara and Panchmahal District by donating complete RO water purifier systems with a chiller of 150 LPH.



Need Assessment Study

Clean water and good hygiene practices are essential for the survival and development of all. United Way of Baroda has been undertaking water-related projects and has been promoting saving water for a decade. It has provided water purifiers and coolers in 70+ Government schools in and around Vadodara. It has also implemented Government projects such as Sujalam Sufalam Jal Abhiyan wherein 10 lakes were excavated and renovated 6 check dams in the Panchmahal district. The work was recognized and certificate of appreciation was handed by the Cabinet Minister. Apart from this it has also implemented projects on water harvesting and so far, 10 water harvesting systems have been constructed.

A need assessment study was undertaken by United Way of Baroda under CSR of Baxter India Private Limited of 10 villages of Ahmedabad, Gandhinagar & Kheda District under their Corporate Social Responsibility initiatives. The comprehensive study was conducted to assess the water need and social development activities for the selected villages. The study was conducted in 10 villages of Gujarat state. The specific research tasks were carried out to accomplish the objective of the study



- Desk Research, Secondary data collection, and analysis
- Qualitative surveys – including Participatory Rural Appraisals (PRA)
- Quantitative surveys – Household

The study reflected that out of 10 villages, 8 villages had acute potable water problems and other two villages needed some renovation and repair for their community tanks. 8 villages had high TDS, apart from water for cleaning, washing, potable water had also to be fetched from community tanks and no water tap facility was available in home or at their door steps. It was observed that Women/girls of the family had to carry the potable water daily from community tanks to their home. Some villages had high content of fluoride in ground water. ROs system were lacking in communities as well as schools.

In Health Sector, United Way of Baroda Supported NGOs and Institutes to Support Vadodara Needy Communities

Shroff Foundation

United Way of Baroda donated ₹30,00,000 to support setting up of Lithotripsy Unit at Ramakrishna Paramhans Hospital- Shroff Foundation Trust. The unit consists of a lithotripter, a machine that produces shock waves that hit kidney stones and break them into small pieces.

With the lithotripter machine UWB has also donated the C-Arm HF49 RSR machine, Anaesthesia Station, Crash cart and Multipara Monitor for setting up the unit. This unit will be very helpful for the underprivileged community as these procedures are very expensive when done in private hospitals.



District Hospital –Vadodara Bio-chemistry Auto Analyser

UWB donated full automated Bio-Chemistry Analyser machine with 5 years AMC to SSG Hospital costing ₹25,00,000. The machine will be used in testing various bio-chemical parameters in patient's blood.

The equipment will help in providing quality result in minimum time thereby helping people. The machine has help conduct 2,50,632 tests so far



Charotar Arogya Mandal, Karamsad-Cancer Treatment of Needy Patients

UWB donated ₹6,00,000 to Charotar Arogya Mandal, Karamsad for providing concession in the treatment of underprivileged cancer patients. It has benefitted 24 patients providing support of ₹25,000 each for their treatment.



Special Disease- Hearing Implant Surgery

United Way of Baroda helped 3 years old Tilak Patel with his hearing implant surgery under Disability Inclusive Program by helping his parents complete the surgery by giving ₹3.19 lakh on World Kindness Day.



Vikas Jyot Trust

United Way Of Baroda supported Vikas Jyot Trust has been working for the upliftment of street children of Vadodara. Daily food is been provided along with basic first aid knowledge, with counseling on substance abuse. They are also provided with the necessary items for school readiness. The trust has also helped in rehabilitation of children who have lost their parents or have separated from the parents for whatever reason. They have helped in getting the children admitted in school and have tracked their progress.



Hari Om Seva Trust

Hari Om Seva Trust works for the betterment of the sick and downtrodden of the society. UWB of supported them by giving funds to extend help to every needy patient for carrying out medical tests. 6000 patients have been benefited from the program..

Akshay Patra Foundation

To feed a hungry stomach is the noblest thing to do. Keeping that in mind, UWB supported Akshay Patra Foundation by donating two feeding vehicles. The vehicles will be carrying food to various NPSS schools of Vadodara benefitting more than 25,000 students daily.

Renovated Girls Toilet block

United Way of Baroda supported infrastructural development of Kavi Dayaram School by renovating the school toilet for girls and boys in two government schools.

Income STABILITY

Chronic unemployment. Financial illiteracy. Homelessness. In communities around the world, individuals and families are facing financial obstacles that prevent a good quality of life.

Building Leadership in Technical Upskill

Skill Development is an important indicator of a country's economic productivity, as it is an enabler of productivity and employability. In comparison to developed countries, India records a low 5% of workforce (20-24 years) with formal vocational skills, where the percentage of skilled workforce is between 60% - 90% of the total workforce. The Indian Government has accordingly identified and prioritized skill development as a critical contributing factor in its growth story with an identified goal to skill 500 million individuals by 2022

United Way of Baroda is implementing "Building Leadership in Technical Upskill" project with Xavier Technical Institute to enhance the skill and increase standard of living of underprivileged youths of Vadodara since three years.

Every year 100 youths are sponsored for complete residential technical industrial course at the institute to underprivileged youth of 1 or 2 years along with institute. Six trades are supported namely Solar, Electrical wiring and jointing, Mechanist cum computer operator, Turner, Fitter, Press tools and Die-making. This program facilitates campus interviews by leading manufacturing companies and ensures employment opportunities to the youth in industries all over Gujarat.

From 2017 to 2019 total of 163 students were supported, in which 61 students were employed, while 39 students were promoted to the 2nd-year course and 40 students went for further studies in schools/institutes.

Empowerment & Livelihood:

Rural women play a key role in supporting their households and communities in achieving food and nutrition security, generating income, and improving rural livelihoods and overall well-being. They contribute to agriculture and rural enterprises and fuel local and global economies.

To promote women empowerment and to help them generate livelihood, United Way of Baroda and L.M. Wind Power joined hands to empower rural women and provide a livelihood opportunity. A Woman Empowerment Centre was initiated wherein 10 needy women were selected and a three month stitching and sewing course was taught by an expert on regular basis.

On successful completion of course all the beneficiaries were provided with latest sewing machine for their livelihood. First order of stitching 500 cloth bags and 162 uniforms of Anganwadi students was provided.



Udaan Livelihood Project

According to the statistics, 70% of physically and mentally differently abled individuals of India is unemployed. Udaan Livelihood project is to empower persons with developmental disabilities to exercise greater control of their lives, change community systems to ensure greater integration into the community. Six differently abled students of special school are enlisted to make the Shishu kits and educational kits.

Green School Project

Green schools are shaping up to be an important part of the education system with its roots from the age-old Gurukul system where education was provided in lush green areas. In modern times, green school is important because it improves the indoor air quality, improves the health of students, teachers, and the staff by potentially decreasing sick days. Having a green school includes plantation as well as using eco-friendly products, and the use of renewable sources of energy.

For this purpose, the United Way of Baroda with support from Corporate Partner T D Williamson installed Rainwater Harvesting Systems, Solar Panels, Composting Tumblers, and Rocket Composters, along with plantation activities in the rural government schools of the Savli Block.

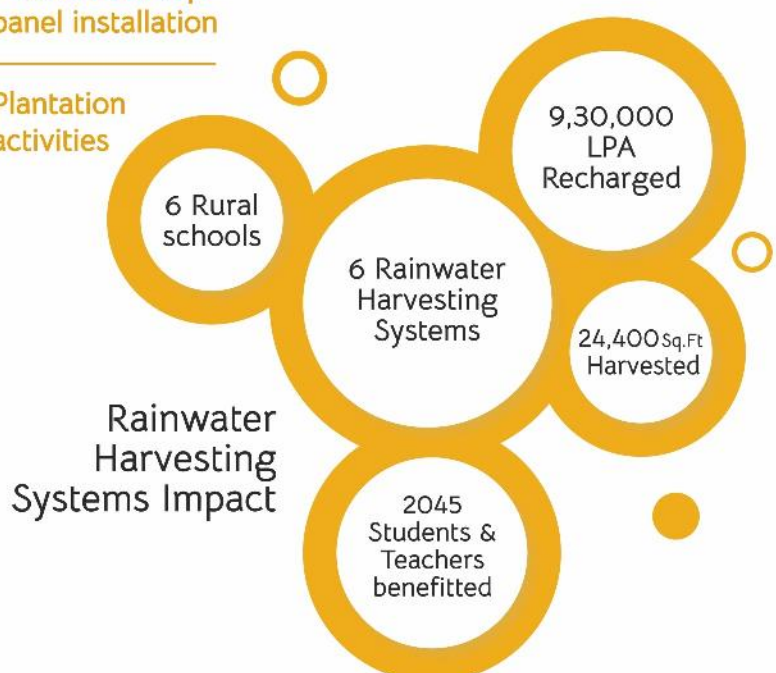

UWB sponsored World Day of Disable Celebration on 3rd December 2019 to celebrate the zeal and spirit of our disable brethren. The rally was inaugurated by Chairman of UWB Mr. Rakesh Agrawal. The concluding event was graced by Mayor of Vadodara, Shri Jigishaben Sheth.



Asha Charitable Trust, Disha Special School & Arpan Charitable Trust

Disaster RELIEF

United Way of Baroda has always been in frontlines during supported relief work to combat natural calamities, disasters across India. Due to heavy rain in July–August 2019, the city of Vadodara and its administrative district were affected by severe flooding. On 31 July 2019, nearly 50 cm of rain fell on Vadodara within 12 hours, with 424mm recorded in one 6 hours' period. As a result, the nearby Vishwamitri River rose to 1 metre below the danger line and the Ajwa dam overflowed, flooding the city. During Vadodara floods UWB stood strong for the city people and supported them with every possible way by distributing clothes, food packets, water and ration kits (15 kg each) which consisted of oil, rice, flour, tea, chilli powder, salt, turmeric etc.

All the 15 flood affected areas of Vadodara city were supported for 7 days. Total 15,000 families were supported. 100 schools bags were provided to 100 underprivileged students of flood affected area.



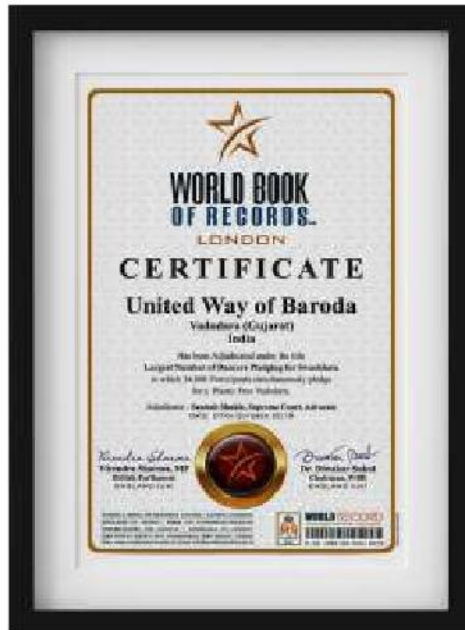
Creating philanthropic AVENUES

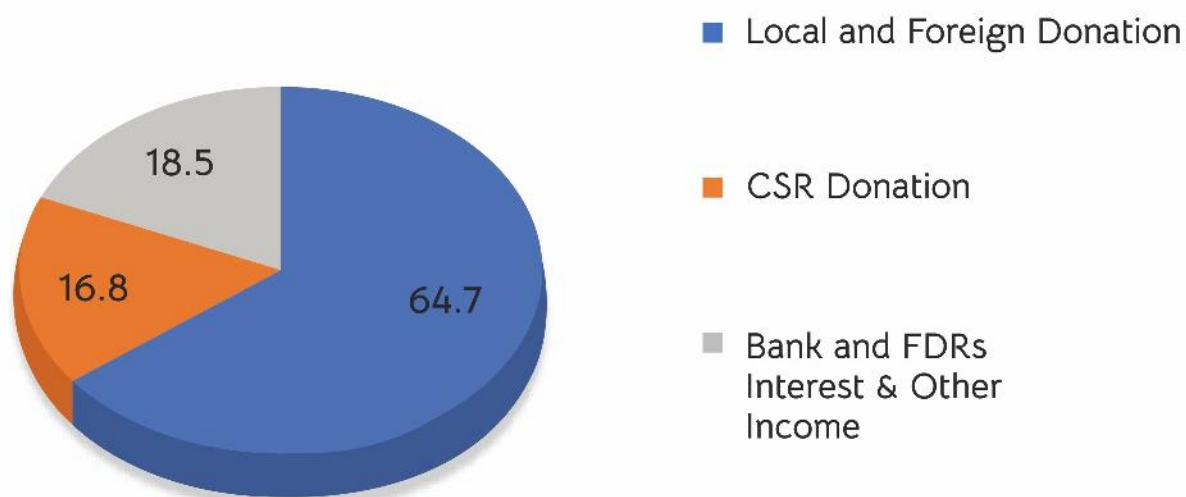

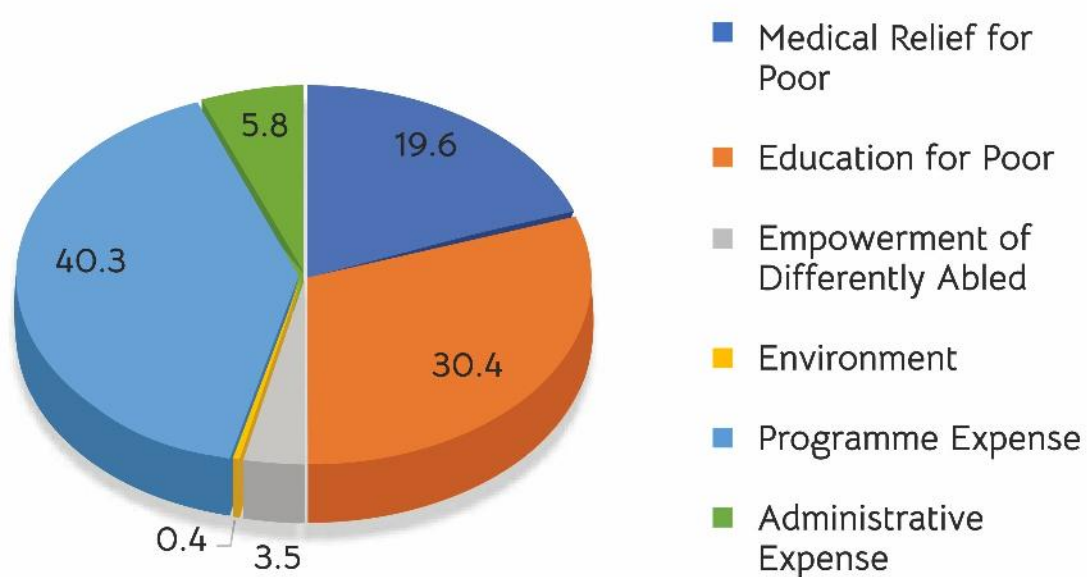
