Finally thanking each and every team member of UWB for their continued efforts to achieve organisational goals during such unprecedented times.

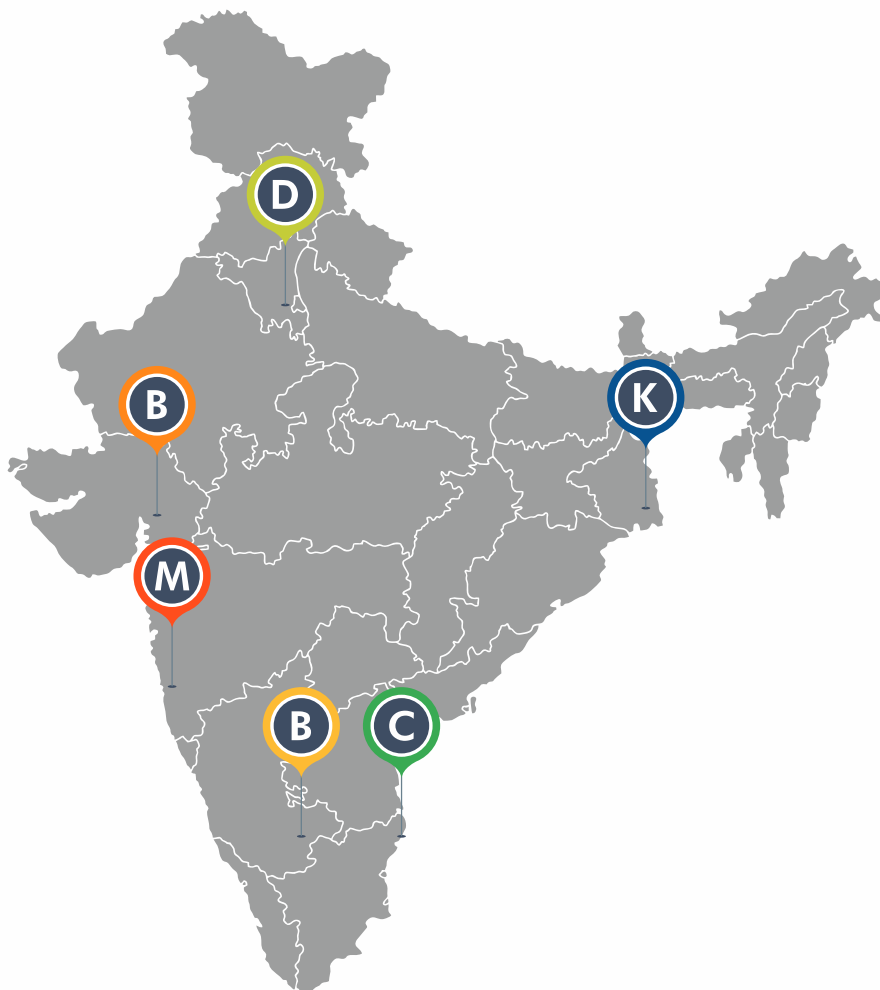
ACTIONS THAT LEAVE BEHIND LONG LASTING CHANGE....

UNITED AGAINST COVID-19 INTERVENTIONS

COVID-19 was dangerous during its second wave and was fuelled by new strains of the coronavirus, which is manifesting in different demographics. Many states reported of running shortage of hospital beds, oxygen supply, medicines and even space in morgues and crematoriums.

Gujarat was one of the red zone states, which was facing high-rise in death due to COVID-19 menace. Looking towards the issues of the pandemic, we geared

our efforts towards various Trusts and Government Hospitals that were fighting against this menace to safeguard the lives of COVID-19 affected patients.

Looking to the efforts carried out by United Way of Baroda, Many Corporate Partners under their CSR initiatives joined their hands with for contributing in safeguarding the frontline warriors and meeting to the needs of various Trusts and Government Hospitals of 2 States of India.



52 Medical Equipment including Defibrillators, Oxygen Concentrators, ICU Beds, and MPM Patient Monitors were donated to the Trust and Government Hospitals who were making efforts to save precious lives of many.

Taking heed to this major issue, United Way of Baroda and Corporate Partner Rishabh Software put forth their helping hands by donating 4 oxygen concentrators to SSG hospital from both of their own corpus funds, respectively.

PROVISION OF RATION KIT TO THE DEPRIVED

United Way of Baroda braced up its support with GE Foundation and United Way India donated 4400+ Family Ration kits and Hygiene kits to the deprived communities in Vadodara and its neighbouring areas. These communities were the Society of Differently abled, needy members of Baroda, Auto Rickshaw Association, visually impaired individuals, Widow women and grade 4 staff members including sweepers, security guards, etc. Each Ration kit consisted of 5 kg wheat, 1 kg chana, 1 kg mag dal, 2 kg sugar, 200 gms. spices and condiment powder, 1 hand sanitizer bottle, 10 3-layer masks, and 1 litre vegetable oil.



DAY OF ACTION

United Way across the world celebrate June 21st every year as the "DAY OF ACTION". Under the aegis of United Way- Day of Action 2021 planned to carry 5 medical check-ups including COVID check-ups, medical webinars which will be taken by eminent doctors focusing on major prevailing health issues, week long yoga and meditation sessions also.

327+ senior citizens were provided with regular check-ups along with full-body check-ups for diagnosing COVID-19 and chronic diseases. Food essentials have also been provided to the elderlies.

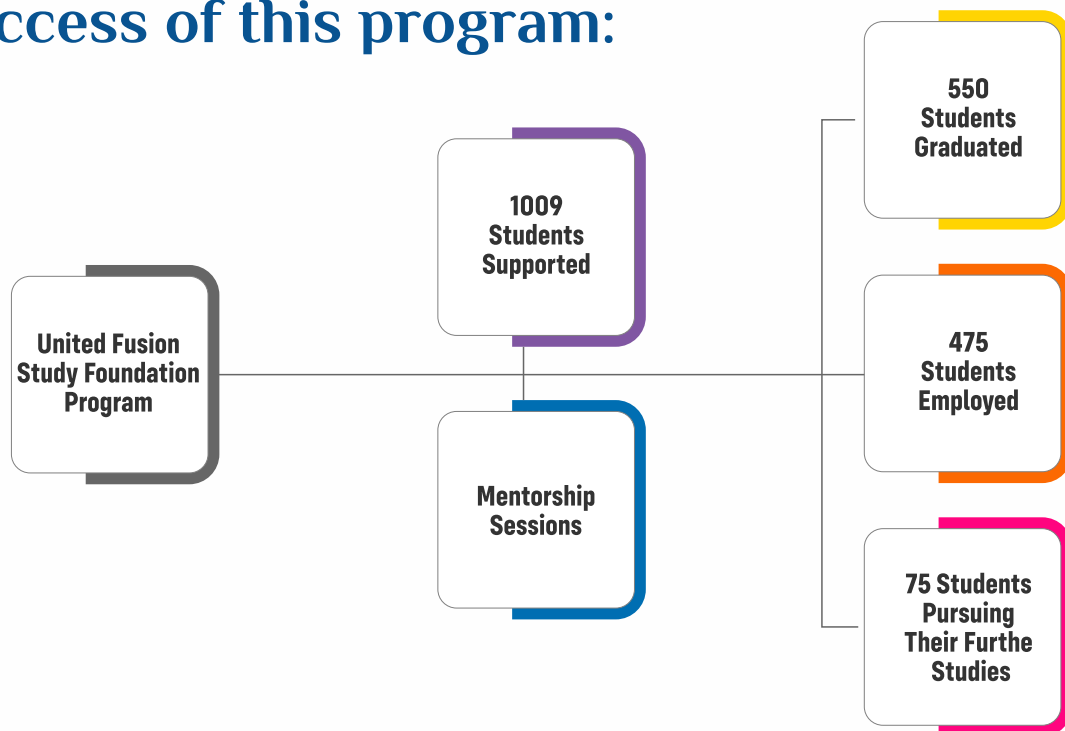
UNITED FUSION STUDY FOUNDATION PROGRAM

In 2010, United Way of Baroda also enrolled students with the support from trustees. Gradually many corporates also joined hands to support these needy bright students under their corporate social responsibility funds.

This program aims to interest free loan or scholarships to the students to continue their education at an ease. Quality Education is ensured under this program.

This program focusses on creating a gateway i.e. of finance for the students to pursue their dreams and become a successful individual inspiring others. Under this program, mentorship sessions are also provided to the students to create a fixed vision of their career.

Through campus placement, Maitri got placed for Oracle as an Application Engineers with a CTC of 11 Lakhs. She has been a diligent student since her early childhood. Maitri's father is working as a sales representative which is

unsecured job. Her mother used to work as an Accountant in a Trust few years ago. Shah family has a limited source of income and become of this Maitri got insisted to compromise with her dream career path. UWB and Stichting Fusion Study Foundation decided to support her.

This program is a blessing for us to fulfil our dreams and become successful individual. Students live free from the fear of debt and stay motivated to perform their best and become an inspiration for others too.



Malkesh Vadariya is one of the United Fusion Study Foundation Program student. Malkesh completed his Mechanical Engineering from Birla Vishvakarma Mahavidhyalay, Anand, Gujarat. He was selected for Two Super 3 level Jobs which is State Tax Inspector and Deputy Section Officer (with 28th rank in general category all over Gujarat). Malkesh belongs to middle class family. His father is a farmer who earns through seasonal farming which is not adequate for covering household expenses. His mother is a housewife.



Malkesh is still continuing his preparation for Government Exam of Class 1 and 2. He is aiming to achieve Deputy Superintendent of Police post. Malkesh is a diligent student who aims to pursue things which are difficult to achieve.



Malkesh quoted that,

The achievements which I have today, was once a dream of mine which I may not be able to fulfil it. But United Way of Baroda believed in me and supported me and now I am successful and thrived to achieve my passion. SHIKHAR SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM



It is a decisive step for the students to take ahead from Secondary Education to Higher Secondary Education. This step will determine their career path. Hence, it is necessary to find the dreaming path of their career before taking this crucial step. Deprived students who are pursuing their career path in the field of science has to face one of the biggest problem, which is the cost of their studies.

Shikhar Scholarship Project in support with C.S. Chawla Foundation has supported 126 marginalised students of 11th and 12th Standard-Science Stream since 2018. This Project has provided financial and mentoring aid to the students of 11th and 12th standards to pursue their career path in the field of science. This year 53 students were selected based on criteria and awarded with Scholarship amount of INR 15k to 25k as per their results amounting to more than 11 lakhs.

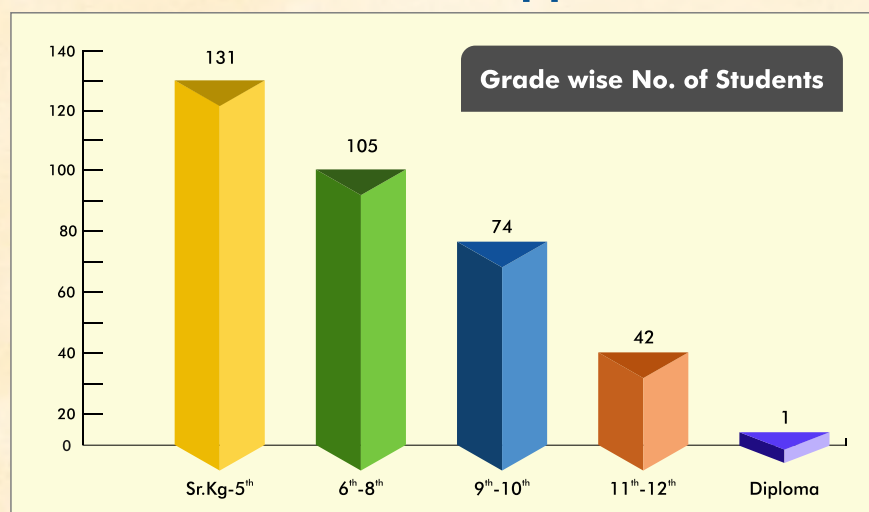
MISSION SHIKSHA

A Ray of hope for the bereaved children

Covid has wrecked thousands of families across India. During second wave, cases of Children losing their parents to COVID-19 mounted high. The cases who lost their both parents and have no one to look after them, others are in a situation where a single surviving parent is unable to take care of them financially and psychologically. This was mainly from low-income and middle-income families to survive in this situation wherein the priority was to be focused more on survival compared to continue the school education of their children.

In support with UWB Trustees, United Way of Baroda launched the "Mission Shiksha" program in the month of May 2021 to support the School Education of those children who have lost one or both of their parents during this COVID-19 pandemic (post March 2020) hailing from 6 Districts of Gujarat (Vadodara, Anand, Panchmahal, Bharuch, Narmada, and Chhota Udepur). This Program has been supporting those families who are financially weaker. Later, United Way Worldwide under their COVID interventions and 8 Corporate Partners under their CSR Initiatives, joined hands with UWB in order to support such vulnerable children to continue their school/tuition fees.

Number of Students supported



Under this project, 356 students from 146 schools received school/tuition fees along with complete Educational Kits as per their current grade level to continue their education.

Siddhi and Vansh Prashant Katwala, are siblings studying in 4th and 2nd standard respectively in Narayan Vidhyalay, Vadodara. They lost their father due to COVID-19 pandemic who used to be strong stem for their entire family. They lost their Mother through severe road accident. Their Uncle as their guardian took up their responsibility. But it is difficult for their Uncle to manage four children's as their Uncle has been managing expenses of his two daughters with household expenses. Also, his Uncle has a small wooden shop which does not generate adequate income to cover every expenses of this family. Their application for the support under Mission Shiksha was duly accepted taking into consideration of their family condition. Their school fees were duly were offset under UWB's Mission Shiksha Project.

SAVERA EDUCATIONAL SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM

United Way of Baroda in support with Baroda Citizens Council initiated Savera Educational Scholarship Program for the students hailing from rural and urban areas of Vadodara to have better quality education. This project has successfully completed its 11 years of implementation catering to more than 3400 students till date.

Siddharth is a 9th Standard student of Shivam Vidhyalay, staying with his parents and brother at Ajwa road area of Vadodara. His father works as an Auto-Rickshaw driver and her mother takes tuition at their home. They stay in a kachha house with a metal roof. During lockdown situation, this family was facing severe financial conditions. Siddharth is a diligent student and always score good grades in his academics. After lockdown, as his father resumed back with his work but it was not enough to earn better to cover family expenses. This student has been supported under this project for his educational expenses taking into consideration about his family condition.

EDUCATIONAL AID TO THE WARDS OF DECEASED POLICE PERSONNEL

While making the nation protective and safe from within, Police Personnel has been losing their lives and leave behind their loves ones in sob. United Way of Baroda has their back and has been supporting financially by covering educational fees for their children. More than 234 students have been supported till date.

Akshay Kishan Rathva, is 10th standard student, studying at Shree Narayan Vidhyalaya. He resides near Danteshwar area of the Vadodara City. His father used to work as Police Constable. The family has been facing major financial issues as his father was the only earning member for the family. Also, he lost his elder brother in an accident. Post his father's death, his mother works from home and earns by doing the stitching work and supports the family by earning INR 5000 to 6000 which is not adequate to cover all family expenses. Taking into consideration of the family background, UWB decided to support Akshay for his further studies.

21ST KALA JUNCTION Interschool Competition

UWB's 21st Kala Junction was a huge success. 575 students from 75 schools participated in online Essay Writing and Poster Making Competition based on the category decided. Topics were given on spot to Participants. Winners were awarded with Certificate and Trophy. Schools having highest number of Participants were honoured with Rotating Shield. In addition, each Participant were appreciated with E-Certificate.



JIGYASA AND GREEN SCHOOL PROJECT

The name of the project "Jigyasa" itself works on creating curiosity among the students to pursue their career path in the field of science. *Jigyasa and Green School Project is focussing on 8 rural schools of Savli Taluka, Vadodara in support with T.D. Williamson.*

Model Rocketry Workshop were organised in 8 rural schools of Savli Taluka, Vadodara. 400 students were provided with first-hand experience on designing and constructing a rocket model. Subject Expert explained the students the basic laws and principles of robotics and the effects of aerodynamics and other forcing acting up on. Through group team, students designed and constructed Rocket models. Teachers, students and other staff members gathered to cheer-up the teams to launch their models successfully.



Under this project, 8 Rural Government Schools of Vadodara are facilitated with Rain Water Harvesting Systems, Mini Science Laboratories, Solar Panel Systems, Composting/Rocket tumblers and RO Water Systems to make these schools more greener. Apart from these facilities, STEM activities are also being conducted throughout the year.

ADVANCED COMPUTER LABORATORY FOR THE DILIGENT

Digital Education plays a vital role in moulding the students to work with technology. It is a crucial access to quality education. Students hailing from rural or urban should cope up with using the technology.

When taken a survey, it was observed that the schools required differentiated modalities of teaching and learning as to implement deep impact of growth and conceptual development of the students of underprivileged communities.

In order to strengthen the quality education, United Way of Baroda collaborated with Jan Priya Trust established an Advanced Computer Laboratory at Maa Bharti Primary School, Akota-Vadodara. On more Advanced Computer Laboratory was established at Kavi Dula Kag Primary School in collaboration with Corporate Partner Palvi Industries Limited.

At Maa Bharti Primary School, advanced 10 HP Computers with latest processor, Windows 10, MS Office, and installation of other Computer peripherals. A server was installed in the school with complete educational software kit along with audio-visual lectures and 24x7 remote support. Complete furniture with platforms, chairs, Air Conditioning system, and electrical work with 4 ELCBs for complete safety of children was done in the lab room. Additionally, a whiteboard, computer covers, HP headphones were also provided.

At Kavi Dula Kag Primary School, 10 advanced HP Computers with latest processor, Windows 10, MS Office, and other computer peripherals were installed in the school. Complete furniture with platforms, chairs, Air conditioning system, Aluminum Door and Windows along with electrical work and Educational Mural Painting with educational Foam Sheet was done in the lab room.

These Advanced Computer Laboratory were settled with latest Computer Peripherals along with Top-Class Software and better infrastructural facilities. *Through this project, more than 1424 students are having access to Digital learning Education.*

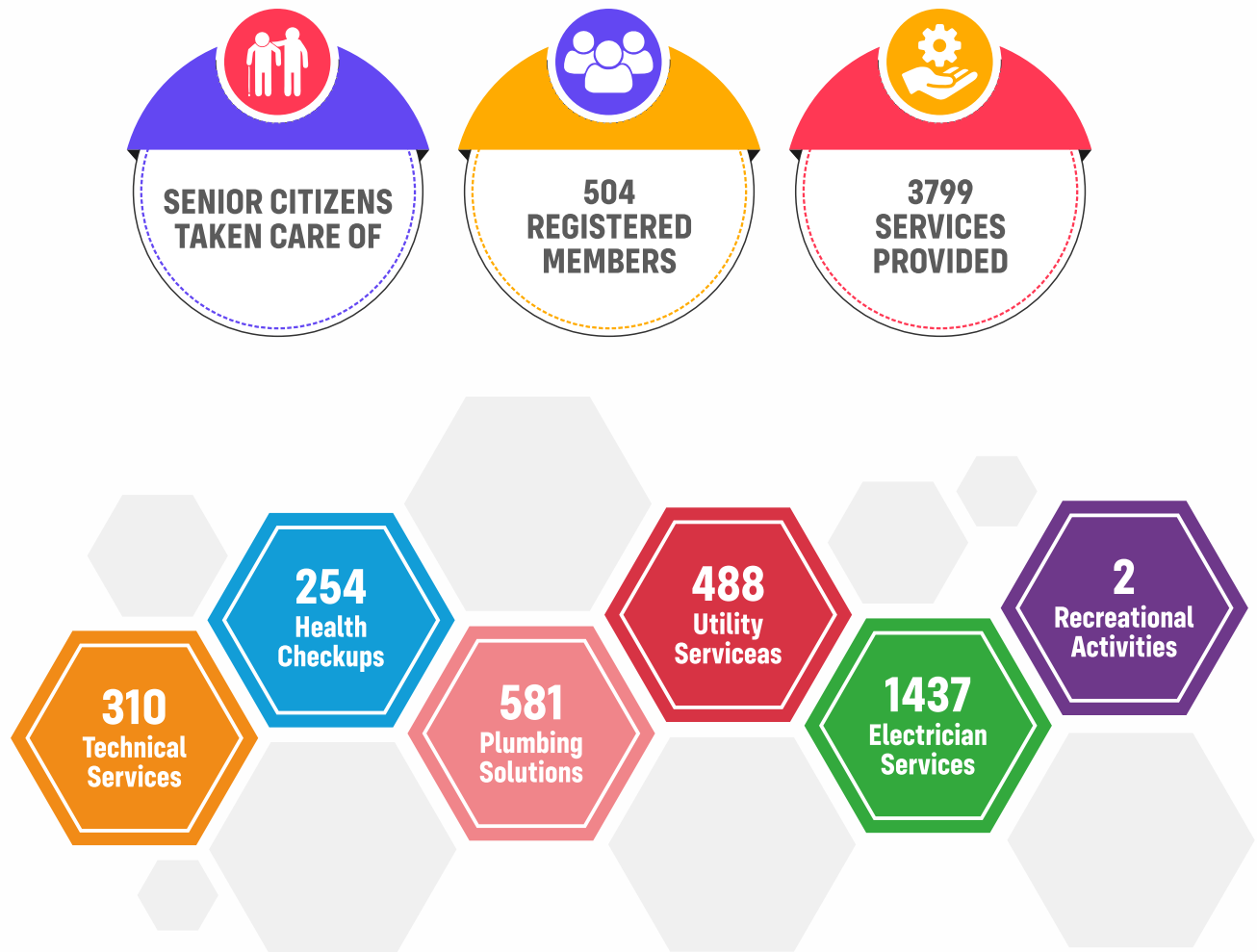

GOLD CARD SCHEME PROJECT

Gold Card Project has been successfully counting its implementation years serving the senior citizens since 23 years. Under this project, the elderlies have been facilitating with the services of their daily tasks, repairing solutions for plumbing and electronic appliances, routine health check-ups on regular basis, and full body check-ups from renowned hospitals and arrangement of recreational activities to make their life blissful. Till date, 11664 registered members have been catered with 42687 services.

Vimlaben Kadiya is 79-year-old Gold Card member at United Way of Baroda since last 25 years. She was sharing the list of problems she used to face before getting in touch for membership under Gold Card Project. She said that going outside work turns out to be the difficult task as any individual knows that as the age increases, physical strength decreases. She was conveying her gratitude towards United Way of Baroda saying, "Gold card member thavathi amari ghani chinta ochhi thai che. Ummar thavane lidhe ame bahar nathi jai shakta tethi aa service amari mate bau upyogi che."



SHISHU KIT PROJECT

Swasth Shishu ek pehel



Maternal healthcare has received important emphasis in the last two decades globally, and system-wide changes have contributed to improvements in pregnancy outcomes and reduction in maternal mortality.

A major contribution to decrease mortality decline can be attributed to more women receiving care from skilled attendants. However, these achievements have not been consistent across countries and regions, with slow pace of change in some localities. United Way of Baroda in support with Lalitbhai Patel Foundation has been working for improving the maternal and Child Health Care.

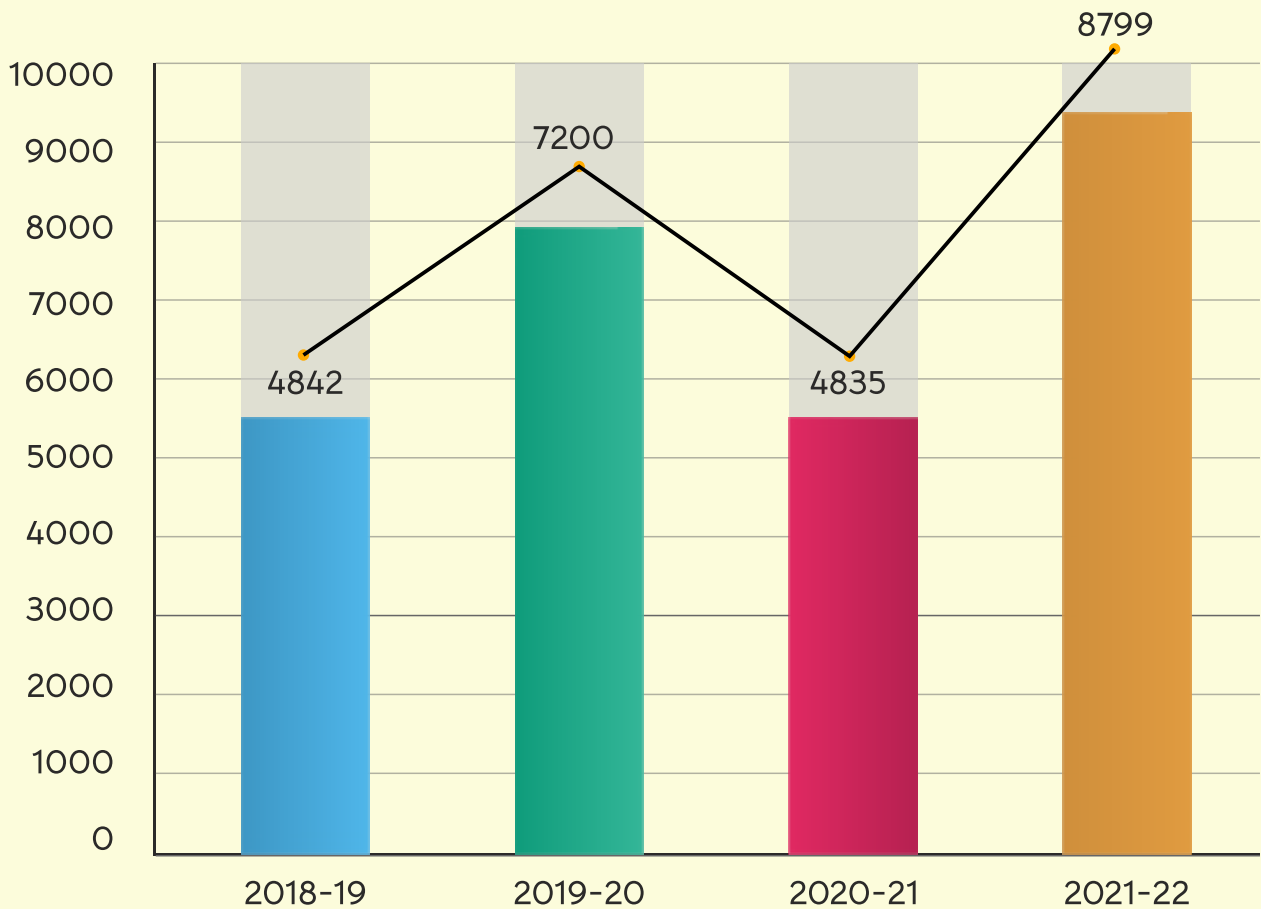
The main objective of this project is to sensitise women on motherhood and childcare security. This project offers Medical Equipment for the neonates from Government Hospitals and also medical assistance have been reaching to the mothers by providing comprehensive kits including pack of Sanitary napkins, baby clothes, baby wrap towel, plastic mattress, iron and calcium tablets and mother gown, health leaflets and many more.

This project has facilitated to 25676 women who went for institutional delivery at Government Hospital. This project has been successfully implemented in two districts: Vadodara and Anand covering 6 Hospitals.



For the year 2021-22, 32 Behavioural Change Sessions were conducted on various topics such as Family Planning, Care for Newborn, Vaccination for Newborn, and Post-Partum Depression and Nutrition for Mother and Child.

UPHC UPGRADATION

Urban Primary Health Centre has been providing regular OPD and Lab facilities, medical camps during monsoon season along with Maternal and Child Health Care. These Primary Health Centres also play a crucial role in implementing various national programs- Vector Borne Disease control (VBDC). Usual Interstitial Pneumonia (UIP), Revised National Tuberculosis Control Programme and many more to count. Information Education Communication activities are carried out on various communicable diseases by these healthcare centres.

A need assessment was carried out at 7 Urban Primary Health Centre at Vadodara. As per the assessment, all these Urban Primary Health Centre were in dire need of laboratory upgradation.

United Way of Baroda braced up its support with SABIC Innovative Plastics India Pvt. Ltd. upgraded these 7 Urban Primary Health Centres of Vadodara including platform inside the laboratory and creating storage cabinets.

Equipment including Haematology Counter with support for 2 years of laboratory reagents, a refrigerator to store the samples and an air conditioner to maintain the temperature to store the samples were also provided to all these UPHC. These laboratories were upgraded with better electrification including Uninterruptible Power Supply (UPS) Unit and Residual Current Circuit Breaker (RCCB) Unit to ensure the safety of the machinery as well as the tests being conducted in the laboratory.



DONATION OF AUTO REFRACTOR MACHINE



Sir Sayajirao General Hospital (S.S.G. Hospital) Vadodara is the largest referral hospital in Central Gujarat.

It caters to the primary, secondary and tertiary health care needs of the people of central Gujarat and adjoining states of India such as Madhya Pradesh, Rajasthan, etc. It has 1250 teaching beds across several clinical specialties and subspecialties, with an annual average outdoor attendance of about 9 Lakh patients, an average annual indoor admission of 67,000 patients. S.S.G Hospital offers a 24-hour emergency service and receives around 290 emergencies each day.

The degree of the refractive error in the eye are measured by Auto refractors and are suited well toward applications such as differentiating corneal from lenticular aberrations and assessing pre and post refractive surgery patients. The auto refractor and Keratometer duo is a staple for any eye care practitioner.

Ophthalmology Department of SSG Hospital was in need of Auto Refractor Machine, as at least 100 patients who could not afford this type of eye testing has to be facilitated for the same.

United Way of Baroda donated Auto refractor Keratometer to Ophthalmology Department of SSG Hospital, Vadodara costing INR 8.68 Lakhs.

This machine has supported 1476-test screening for the treatment of the patients.

BUILDING LEADERSHIP IN TECHNICAL UPSKILLS

Launched in the year 2018, Building Leadership in Technical Upskill Project has been successfully being implemented since last 5 years working for skill development and income stability for the youths. This project has been supporting 100 youths every year to improve their skills for enrolling them for completion of one-two year technical industrial course at the Xavier's Technical Institute.

For the year 2021-22, 100 youths were sponsored who wish to pursue specified technical Industrial courses. In addition, more than 50 youths were provided with Certificate of Appreciation to acknowledge their successful completion of their Industrial courses under this project. Also, 500 t-shirts were distributed covering each student of Xavier's Technical Institute. Till date, 346 youths have been trained under this project out of which 127 youth are employed in well-known industries all over Gujarat.



MISSION SKILL DEVELOPMENT PROJECT

An extended support towards Mission Shiksha Mothers

Mission Skill Development was launched in the month of September 2021 for Mission Shiksha Mothers whose children were being supported under Mission Shiksha Program. This Project was initiated with an aim to enhance the skills of the mothers through three certified Vocational Courses such as Tally & GST, Sewing and Stitching Techniques and Beautician course from well-known Institutes.

23 Mission Shiksha Mothers who were single parent enrolled them in these vocational courses. Examination was scheduled by the particular institutes where courses are being implemented where Mothers performed wonders and secured excellent category grades. Certificates were issued to mark their performance throughout the tenure.

These Mothers enrolled in their particular course were provided with Advanced Computer System, Sewing Machines and Customised Beauty Kit to support their self-start-up to become financial supporter for their families.



MEDICAL SKILL DEVELOPMENT PROGRAM

Medical Skill Development Program in support with SABIC INNOVATIVE PLASTICS INDIA PVT LTD under their CSR initiatives was launched in the year 2021-22. The project aimed to trained underprivileged youth for various paramedical courses in order to advance their healthcare skills and become self-reliant at well-known Bankers Technical Institute.

Under this project, 33 youth students have successfully completed paramedical courses selected by them. A Verified Certificate has been issued to them for successful completion of the course.

A. Quality Education

According to the Annual State of Education Report (ASER), the survey was conducted and cover almost all rural districts; it was found that more than 50% of the children of age 3 to 16 years are not able to read and perform arithmetic abilities in the age of 5 to 16 years.

Focussing on Halol Block:

1. **Scholarship and Educational kit Support-** Needy and Diligent students are provided with educational support along with complete educational kit.

For the year 2021-22, 174 students were supported for Scholarship along with Complete Educational Kit as per their current grade level.

Under this project, 13 needy rural youths of Halol Block were identified and were provided support with college fees, tuition fees, Hostel fees, mess, transportation and other study expenses. Mentoring programs are organised twice a year to groom the personalities of the students. Students are provided with guiding and career counselling in order to pursue their better career path

2. **Mentorship-** Mentorship sessions are conducted on two major aspects which is theoretical and practical. Taking into consideration of Theoretical Approach, Mentorship sessions were conducted on various topics including Gender Sensitization, Creative thinking & Writing, Hygiene Awareness for girls and development of memory pattern. About practical approach, A Series of Self Defence Workshop, Robotics Workshop, Advanced Robotics Workshop and Cardiopulmonary Resuscitation workshop were organised to provide hands-on experience to the rural students.

3. Spoken English and Mathematics Classes- English tutorials conducted throughout the year to support the students to improve English Language. Classes on Mathematical subject for the rural students are conducted to encourage them to learn this practical life subject.

4. Course on Computer Concepts- Three months course on Computer Concepts provided to the students to enhance their computer skills along with provision for Government Approved Certificate after completion of the course.

B. Better Healthcare Facilities

Rural areas are lagging behind access to safe drinking water, which further results in major health. For providing access to safe and purified drinking water, Community Water ATM and RO Water Cooler Systems has been installed in villages of Halol block of Panchmahal and Padra Block of Vadodara.

1. Community Water ATM establishment in Halol Block

This Community Water ATM is safe drinking water access to more than 5000+ individuals of Gayatrinagar village of Halol, Panchmahal. Also, PET Jars of 20 litres were provided visiting door-to-door houses of the village in order to encourage safe practices of water storage.

6 Water RO Cooler Systems has been installed to create purified drinking water to more than 3000+ rural students of Halol Block and Padra Block of Gujarat.

3. Mega Health Camp at Padra Block

A specialised medical camp was organised by United Way of Baroda and Ami Life Sciences at rural area of Padra Block, Vadodara. This Medical camp was organised with a motive to provide free health screening and awareness about preventive health and hygiene in the community. 6 specialised doctors of Gujarat Super Speciality Hospital took up the camp. Awareness session was also organised to inform the community about the camps and encourage them to conduct their regular check-ups. More than 157 patients were catered through this camp.



4. Eye Screening for rural students of Padra block

Eye Screening Camp for the rural students of middle and secondary schools with a rationale to understand the purpose and need for vision screening. More than 290 students were facilitated with eye screening camp from which 235 students are identified normal while 35 students were identified with spectacles and other 22 are referred to hospital for further treatment purpose.



C. School Infrastructure

It is widely known that availability of Infrastructure facilities in school has considerable impact on school environment and it one of the important indicators for assessing whether the schools are providing a conducive learning environment for children. Rural schools of basic infrastructure, which further hinders to holistic development of rural students.

More than 2500+ rural students are having access to quality education through infrastructural provision.

D. Empowerment and livelihood

Women if empowered, have the opportunity to redefine the gender roles or other such roles in order to acquire more freedom to pursue their desired goals. Launched in the year 2019, Women Empowerment Program has been impacting lives of rural women. The major objective to initiate this program is to empower women in terms of enhancing their skills.

This component focused on empowering rural women on Halol block, Panchmahal.

1. Women Empowerment

1.1 Sewing and Embroidery Training sessions

Under the supervision of the Expert, more than 25 rural women of Halol were trained for enhancing their skills in Sewing and Embroidery techniques. Women were also facilitated with customised training kits to make it easier for them. These training sessions were receiving work orders to become a self-reliant individual. For instance, these rural women received 60 work orders of computer covers. In addition, women were provided with Sewing Machine for successful completion of the course and also to encourage them to continue using this machine to finish the work orders on time.



1.2 Active Participation for recreational activity: Women of Kanjari, Halol participated in Jute bag painting Workshops.

Variety of Jute bags along with crayon colours were painted creatively by them portraying Gujarati Culture and traditions. This session turned out to be a memorable one.



1. SHG Empowerment

2.1 SHG Training Session: Training sessions were organised for Self-Help Group women of Halol. This session helped the women to enrich themselves with communication skills and rebuild their leadership qualities. Subject Experts made this session interactive and informative facilitating to more than 28 SHG women of Halol.



2.2 Computer Courses for enriching computer skills: In order to enhance computer skills of the rural women of Halol, a course on Computer Concepts were organised. Subject Expert imparted knowledge on various computer concepts such as Microsoft Excel, Microsoft Word and many more. Government Approved Certificate has been issued to mark their performance throughout the completion of the course.

2.3 Diwali Celebration: For the celebration of Diwali, a Diya and Candle making workshop were organised for women of Halol. Women enthusiastically participated in these workshops. As a result, more than 100 Diyas and Candles were created. Further, an exhibition was organised through which SHG women earned INR 3000 and deposited in SHG Bank Account.



2.4 Celebration of International Women's Day:

International Women's Day was celebrated with rural women of Halol while painting jute bags representing a message towards wishing International Women's Day.

E. Sustainable Environment

1. Solid Waste Management

Solid Waste Management has been a practical necessity in the rural areas. Waste have been disposed in open areas and hence it creates pollution leaving behind the question of protecting the environment.

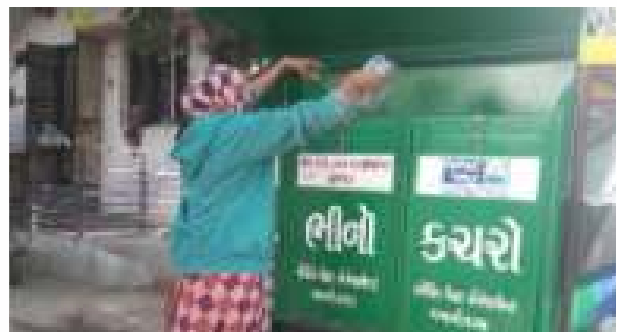
It is an evitable service to the society. It much be incorporated into environmental planning.

Our Solid Waste Management project in support with L.M. Wind Power has been initiated in Gayatrinagar village, Halol. This project focusses on to promoting proper waste disposal to make the rural area a better and healthier place to live for the rurality.

Under implementation of the project, two Green Sahayak with the help of E-Auto collects door-to-door waste covering each household of the village. Dry waste has been collected twice in a week while wet waste has been collected on regular basis. For the year 2021-22, from the wet waste collected, 500+ litre liquid fertilizer was extracted and 150+ kg fertilizer powder was prepared. 800kgs dry waste collected have transformed into 12 benches, which are placed in the village itself.

E-Auto is fuel free and can be charged through natural resources, which is Solar Energy.

A 15 x 30 Sq. Ft. shade is established where Solar System of 1 KW has been installed for charging E-Auto



2. Solar Roof Top Systems in Padra Block, Vadodara



4 Solar Roof Top Systems installed in 3 Schools and 1 at Local Government Body Office of Padra block, Vadodara. These systems are a saving bliss for reducing the expenses carried out for the electricity and these savings are utilised for the upliftment of the quality of life of the rural community of Padra block, Vadodara.

3. SOLAR STREET LIGHT PROJECT



Solar energy is a clean, pollution-free and renewable energy source. This means less competition for resources and more affordable irrigation for nearby agriculture concerns. Additionally, solar streetlights do not pollute the areas. Solar street lights are energy-conscious lighting solution for the rural areas. They can also prevent the carbon footprints of the nations that adopt this small wonder in their efforts.

In support with L.M. Wind Power, Ami Life Sciences, Sun Pharmaceuticals Ltd, Unimed Technologies Ltd, and Aditya Medisales Ltd., 203+ Solar Street Lights were installed in 15 villages of Gujarat and Silvassa Block of Dadar Nagar Haveli.

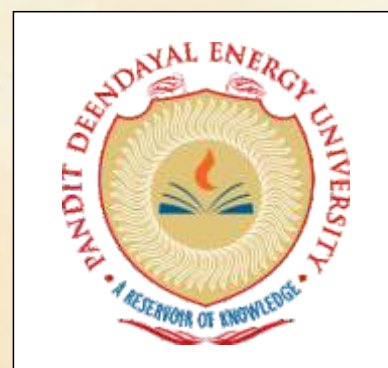
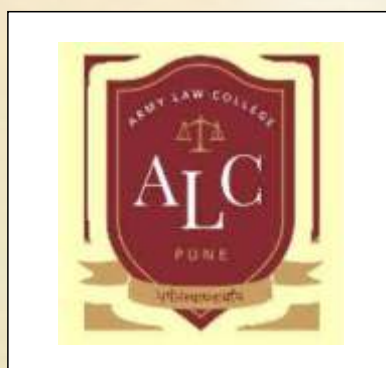
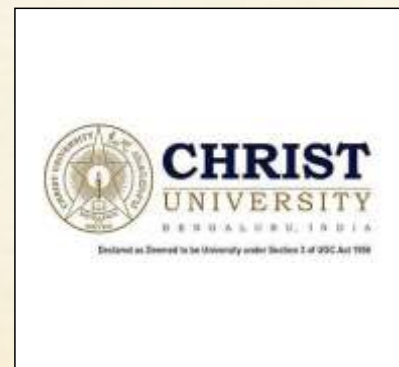
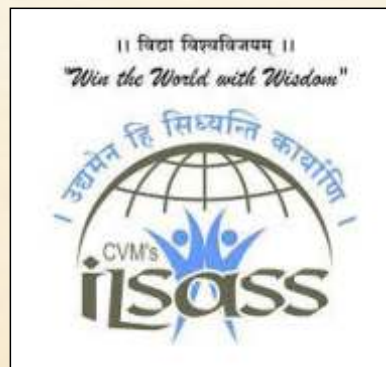
World Water Day Celebration

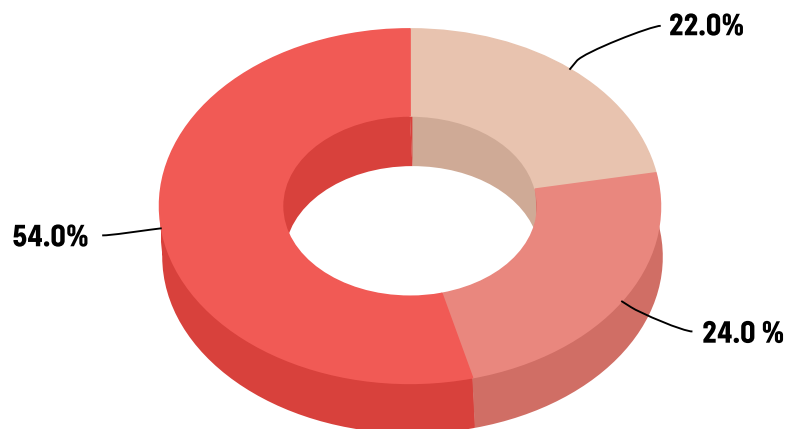

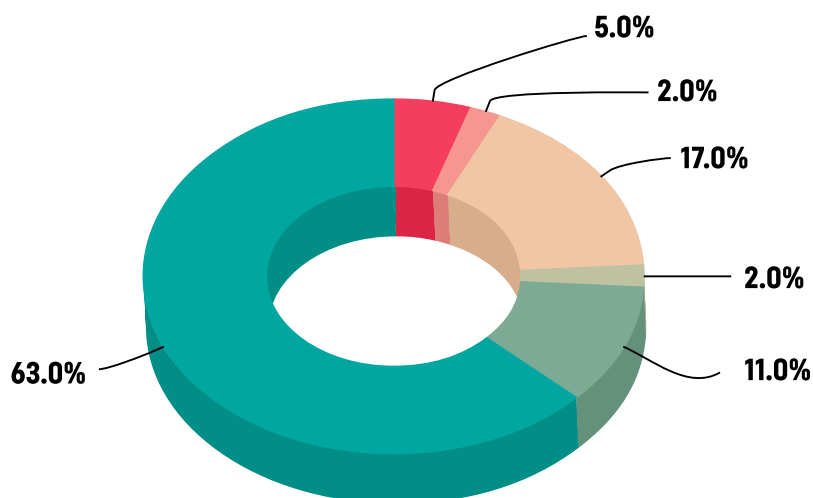

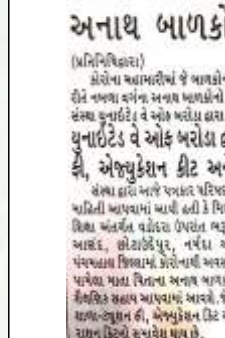
