# **EXTEMPORE COMPETITION**

# Event Date & Time: 22<sup>ND</sup> December, i.e. Sunday, 2024 at 12 pm.

**Event Type:** Individual Participation **Eligibility:** Open to all college students **Registration:** Must be completed by the designated deadline. Late entries will not be entertained.

#### General Guidelines:

#### 1. **Rounds:**

• The competition will be of one single round, which will be conducted at the **Sidcup Towers, Race course, Vadodara.** 

#### 2. Topic Selection:

• Topics will be assigned on the spot.

#### 3. Preparation and Speaking Time:

- **Total Time:** 3 minutes.
  - **Preparation:** 30 seconds.
  - **Speech Delivery:** 2 minutes 30 seconds.
- No external aids like books, mobile phones, or the internet are allowed during preparation.

#### 4. Language:

- Participants can deliver their speeches in English, Hindi, or Gujarati.
- Switching languages to mid-speech is generally discouraged.

# 5. **Provisions for Final Round:**

• A **notepad and pen** will be allowed to jot down key points during preparation time.

#### 6. Timekeeping:

- Exceeding the allotted time may result in penalties.
- A **bell/indicator** will notify participants of the time remaining.
- Participants must arrive on time; late arrivals may not be allowed to compete.

#### Judging Criteria:

#### 1. Content Quality:

- $\circ$  Relevance to the theme.
- Structure and coherence of ideas.

#### 2. Voice Modulation:

• Clarity, tone, and variation in speech delivery.

# 3. Confidence and Body Language:

• Poise, gestures, and eye contact.

#### 4. Presentation and Creativity:

• Unique approach and originality.

#### 5. Message and Conclusion:

• Effective communication of the topic's message and a strong conclusion.

# **SHORT FILM-MAKING COMPETITION**

#### Date and Deadline for Submission: will be informed later.

**Event Type:** Individual/Team Participation **Eligibility:** Open to all college students **Submission Mode:** Online Submission

# **General Guidelines**

#### 1. Eligibility:

- The competition is **exclusively for college students**. Participants must be currently enrolled in an undergraduate or postgraduate program.
- Entries can be made by individuals or teams. Each team can have a **maximum** of 4 participants.
- The competition is open to all college students, regardless of the academic discipline.

#### 2. **Theme:**

- The **theme** of the short film will be provided at a later date. All entries must adhere to this theme once disclosed. The theme will be communicated via email or event notifications.
- Films not related to the theme will be disqualified.

#### 3. Film Length:

- The **short film must be a maximum of 5 minutes** in length. Films that exceed the 5-minute duration will be automatically disqualified.
- The **credits** of the film (including title, director's name, and other important credits) should be included in the 5-minute time frame.

#### 4. Language:

- Participants can submit their films in any of the 3 languages (English, Hindi or Gujarati).
- However, **subtitles** in **English** are mandatory for all the films. Subtitles must be clear and easy to read.

#### 5. Film Quality & Submission Format:

- The film must be submitted in **MP4** or **MOV** format.
- The minimum resolution should be **720p HD**.
- The file size must not exceed 2 GB.
- Participants are advised to ensure that the final submission is **fully edited and polished** before submission.

#### 6. Online Submission:

- Films must be submitted **online** via a shareable link (Google Drive, Dropbox...), which would be informed at the time of registration.
- The video link must be **public or shareable** with the provided email address. Password-protected links or private uploads will not be accepted.
- Along with the film, participants must submit a **registration form** (including team member details, college name, film title, and a short synopsis of the film).

• The **film title** and **film description** (maximum 150 words) must be included in the submission form.

# 7. Deadline for Submission:

- $\circ$   $\;$  The submission deadline will be announced when the theme is provided.
- Late submissions will not be accepted under any circumstances.

# Judging Criteria

The films will be evaluated based on the following criteria:

# 1. Creativity & Originality:

- The uniqueness of the concept and the creativity in how the theme is interpreted.
- Original storytelling and innovative use of film techniques.

# 2. Relevance to the Theme:

- $\circ$   $\;$  How well the film addresses the theme and conveys the intended message.
- $\circ$   $\;$  The cohesiveness of the narrative with respect to the theme.

# 3. Technical Quality:

- Cinematography (composition, lighting, framing).
- Editing (smooth transitions, pacing, and visual flow).
- Sound quality (clear audio, background music, sound effects).

# 4. Direction & Performances:

- $\circ$  The overall direction of the film and the execution of the vision.
- Acting performances and character development.

# 5. Impact & Message:

- The emotional or intellectual impact of the film.
- The clarity of the message or takeaway for the audience.

# 6. Presentation:

• Overall professionalism and quality of the final product (visuals, sound, colour grading, etc.).

# **Rules for Participation**

- 1. **Originality**: Your film must be completely original. Avoid using copyrighted materials unless you have explicit permission.
- 2. Plagiarism: Any form of plagiarism will result in immediate disqualification.
- 3. **Final Version**: Submit only your fully edited and finished film. Rough cuts or unfinished versions will not be accepted.
- 4. **Visual and Auditory Quality**: Ensure your film is visually and audibly polished for submission.
- 5. Content Guidelines:
  - **Offensive Content**: Avoid abusive language, discriminatory, controversial topics (religion, politics), or explicit material.
  - **Respectful Behaviour**: Maintain a respectful tone throughout the film to avoid disqualification.
- 6. **Credits**: Include full credits for key contributors (director, producer, writer, actors, etc.) at the end of the film, within the 5-minute time limit.

Submission Guidelines: Incomplete or missing credits will result in lower marks.

# **DRAMA/SKIT COMPETITION**

#### Event Date & Time: will be informed later.

**Event Type:** Team Participation (On-Stage) **Eligibility:** Open to all college students **Submission Mode:** On-Stage Performance

# **General Guidelines**

#### 1. Eligibility:

- The competition is **open to college students** from all disciplines, and the participants must be currently enrolled in undergraduate or postgraduate programs.
- Each **team** should consist of a **minimum of 2 members and a maximum of 8 members**.
- Teams are allowed to perform a **drama or skit** based on any genre (comedy, drama, social issue, etc.) as long as it fits within the competition guidelines.
- There will not be a preliminary round for this competition. Participants will perform directly in the finals, with the date and time to be communicated later.

#### 2. Duration:

- The performance must not exceed **7 minutes**. Teams that exceed the time limit will be penalized.
- Time will be strictly monitored, and a bell or signal will indicate the last 30 seconds of the performance. The performance must end as soon as the time is up.

#### 3. Theme/Content:

- The theme will be informed at the time of registration.
- The skit should be **original** and created by the participating team.
- **Profanity**, offensive or inappropriate content (such as controversial religious, political, or sexual references), or discriminatory statements are **strictly prohibited**.

#### 4. Stage Setup:

- Teams will be performing **on stage**, and they must ensure that the performance is appropriate for the stage setting.
- **Props**: You may use props for your skit. Teams should manage their props on their own. However, **large props** or **set changes** during the performance should be minimal to avoid disruption and time loss.
- No technical aids (such as microphones, sound systems, or lighting changes)

#### 5. Costumes:

- **Costumes are optional** but are encouraged to enhance the performance and add to the aesthetic.
- If participants choose not to wear costumes, they must ensure that their attire is **neat and appropriate** for the performance.

- Teams should ensure that costumes are **comfortable** and **safe** for stage movements.
- 6. Language:
  - Performances can be in these 3 languages (English, Hindi, or Gujarati).

# Judging Criteria

The performances will be evaluated based on the following factors:

#### 1. Creativity & Originality:

- The originality of the skit or drama, including the concept, story, and execution.
- The creativity involved in presenting the theme, particularly how well the subject matter is interpreted.

#### 2. Performance & Acting Skills:

- The acting skills of the participants, including emotive expressions, dialogue delivery, and character portrayal.
- How well the actors engage with each other and with the audience.

#### 3. Relevance to Theme:

- The clarity with which the theme is conveyed through the performance.
- How well the skit or drama stays aligned with its intended message.

#### 4. Presentation & Stage Presence:

- Use of the stage, coordination among team members, and overall presentation of the skit.
- The ability to capture and maintain the audience's attention.

#### 5. Costume & Makeup (Optional):

- While costumes are optional if used, they should add value to the performance.
- Appropriateness, creativity, and execution of costumes.

#### 6. Pacing & Time Management:

- How well the performance is paced within the 7-minute time frame.
- Ensuring that the performance concludes within the allotted time.

# **Rules for Participation**

- Each team must submit a **registration form** that includes the names of all participants, college details, the skit title, and a brief description (maximum 150 words) of the skit or drama.
- The skit or drama should be **original** and created by the participants. Plagiarism or copying content from other sources will lead to disqualification.
- The team is responsible for the entire content of the skit, including writing the script, preparing the performance, and managing props.
- **Offensive language**, derogatory remarks, or controversial content (religious, political, or sexual) will lead to immediate **disqualification**.
- Participants must adhere to ethical standards, avoiding statements or actions that could be deemed disrespectful, harmful, or discriminatory to any individual or group.

- Teams are responsible for managing their **props**, costumes, and any other equipment needed during their performance.
- The team must bring their **own props** and **set pieces**. Large props should be kept minimal for the sake of time and ease of setup.

Participants should maintain **respectful behaviour** toward other teams, judges, and event organizers.

- **Unprofessional conduct**, including disruptive behaviour, cheating, or disrespect toward others, will result in disqualification.
- Each performance must adhere to the **7-minute limit**. A bell will signal the last 30 seconds of the performance, and teams must conclude by the designated time.
- Exceeding the time limit may result in a penalty.

# **QUIZ COMPETITION**

**Event Type:** Team Participation **Eligibility:** Open to all college students **Submission Mode:** Written for Preliminary Round, Live for Final Round

# **General Guidelines**

# 1. Eligibility:

- The competition is **open to all college students** (undergraduate and postgraduate).
- **Teams of a maximum 3 and a minimum 2** members are required to participate.
- $\circ$  Each team must register individually by the specified deadline.

# 2. Competition Format:

- The competition will consist of **two rounds**:
  - Preliminary Round: Conducted at Sidcup Towers (Written Round).
  - **Final Round**: A live quiz competition held at the main venue, which will be informed later.

# 3. Round Details:

- Preliminary Round:
  - This will be a **written test** consisting of multiple-choice questions (MCQs) and short-answer questions.
  - Participants will be given a fixed time (**30 minutes**) to complete the written test.
  - The top teams will be selected based on their performance in this round to proceed to the final round.

# • **Final Round**:

- The finalists will compete in a **live quiz** format consisting of **5 rounds**.
- The **live quiz** will be conducted at the main event venue and will involve direct questioning by the quizmaster.
- The five rounds will cover different categories such as General Knowledge, Science, History, Current Affairs, and Sports.
- Each team will take turns to answer the questions in the live quiz.

# 4. Team Structure:

# **General Guidelines**

# 1. Eligibility:

- The competition is **open to all college students** currently enrolled in undergraduate or postgraduate programs.
- Each participant must register individually.

# 2. Competition Format:

- The competition will consist of **one single round**, which will be conducted at the **Sidcup Towers**.
- The participants will be provided with **on-the-spot prompt** based on which they must create a **story** within the given time limit.
- Participants will be given a prompt (a sentence, a scenario, or a theme) and will have **30 minutes** to write their story.

#### 3. Writing Guidelines:

- Story Length: The story must be between 300 to 500 words in both rounds.
- Language: Participants may write their stories in English, Hindi, or Gujarati.
- **Prompt Interpretation**: The prompt provided must be incorporated into the story, and the story should remain **relevant** to the given prompt.
- **Originality**: The story must be **original** and created during the competition. No previously written stories are allowed.
- Handwritten: Participants will have to handwrite their stories.

#### A bell or other time indicator will notify participants of the **remaining time**.

# Judging Criteria

# 1. Creativity & Originality:

- The uniqueness of the story and the **innovative approach** to interpreting the prompt.
- Originality of ideas and plot development.

# 2. Relevance to Prompt:

- How well the story stays **relevant** to the given prompt.
- Ensuring that the story logically connects with the prompt.

# 3. Story Structure & Coherence:

- Clear introduction, development, and conclusion.
- Logical flow of ideas and effective transitions.

#### 4. Language and Writing Style:

- Use of appropriate language, grammar, and vocabulary.
- Writing style, clarity, and readability.

# 5. Creativity and Imagination:

- Effective use of **imagination** to build a compelling story.
- The ability to craft engaging characters, setting, and plot.

# **Rules for Participation**

# □ Originality:

- The story must be created **during the competition** based on the given prompt.
- **Plagiarism** will result in disqualification. You are responsible for ensuring the originality of your work.

# □ Prohibited Materials:

- **Electronic devices** (mobiles, laptops, tablets, etc.) are **not allowed** during the writing process.
- Copying content from books, the internet, or other sources is strictly prohibited and will lead to disqualification.

#### □ Content Guidelines:

• Avoid any **offensive or inappropriate content**, including religious, political, or discriminatory remarks. Such content will result in disqualification.

#### □ Language Options:

- You can write your story in English, Hindi, or Gujarati.
- Switching languages mid-story is discouraged. Stick to one language for the entire story.

#### □ Handwritten Stories:

• Participants must ensure that the written story is legible and clear.
