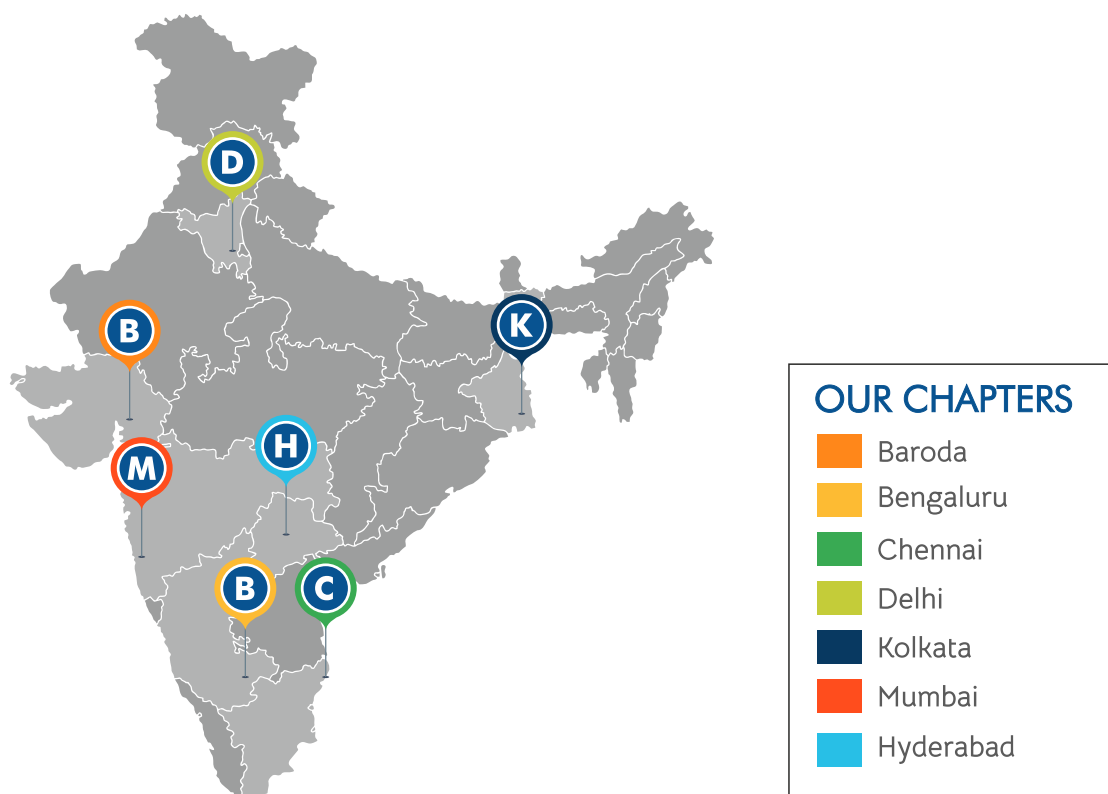
UNITED WAY OF BARODA

United Way of Baroda, **established in 1986**, is a prominent non-profit organization committed to driving positive change and serving underprivileged communities in India. It is registered with the Charity Commissioner under the Societies Registration Act, 1860 and the Bombay Public Trust Act, 1950. Donations to the organization are eligible for tax exemption under Section 80G of the Income Tax Act. Additionally, it is authorized to receive foreign contributions under the Foreign Contributions Regulations Act (FCRA) and is registered with the Government of India's NITI Aayog (GJ/2017/0164560). United Way of Baroda is also recognized as a credible NGO by the Credibility Alliance.

The organization upholds the highest ethical standards, ensuring that all its volunteers, employees, and representatives adhere to a strict code of ethics. This code, approved by the Board of Directors, reflects United Way's commitment to fulfilling its obligations as a trusted public representative. All staff members are required to certify their compliance with this ethical framework.

As the first United Way Chapter in India, United Way of Baroda has been a catalyst for change for nearly **four decades**. Its core focus areas include enabling education, better healthcare, livelihood development, rural development, sustainable environment, and social inclusivity. These initiatives aim to achieve the holistic development of underprivileged communities, fostering sustainability and driving long-term growth and progress. Funds raised through major campaigns are strategically utilized to implement various projects and programs designed to impact the maximum number of individuals.

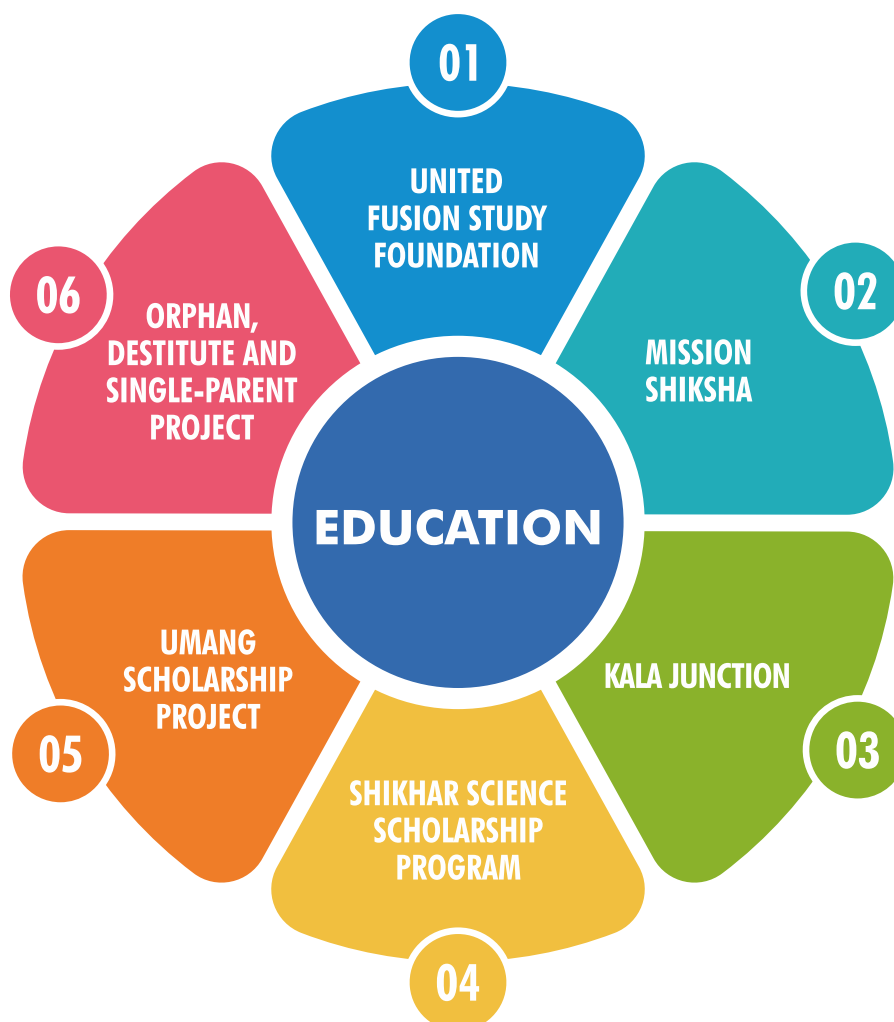
FOCUS AREAS AND SDGs

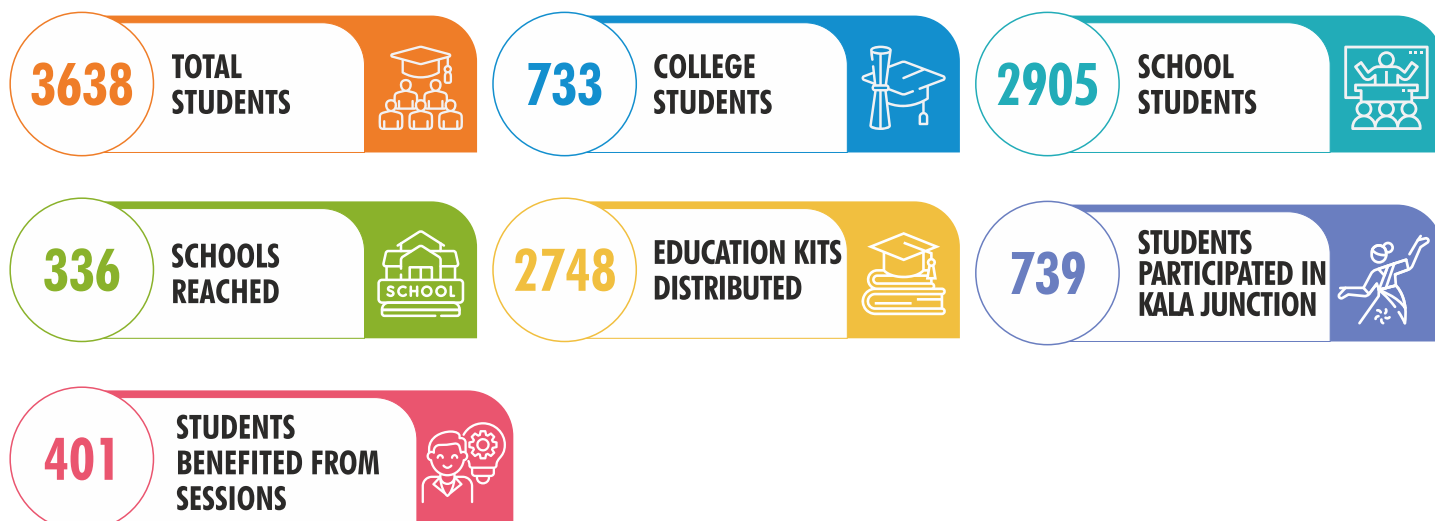

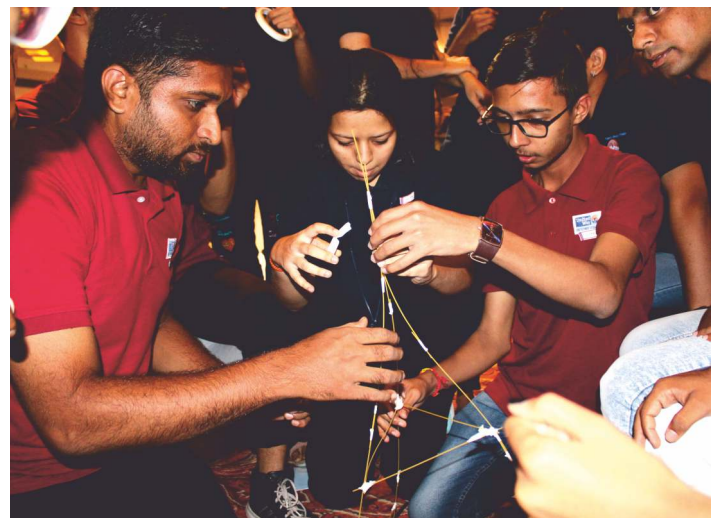


1. UNITED FUSION STUDY FOUNDATION

United Fusion Study Foundation (UFSF) program, a flagship initiative launched by United Way of Baroda (UWB) in collaboration with the Stichting Fusion Study Foundation (FSF) from the Netherlands, has been a transformative force since 2005. This visionary program was established to provide interest-free educational loans to talented, underprivileged students across Gujarat who aspire to pursue higher education in fields like engineering, medicine, commerce, and other professional disciplines.

Despite the growth of universities in Gujarat, many promising students face financial challenges that hinder their educational aspirations. Recognizing this barrier, UFSF was designed to support these students by covering essential expenses such as college fees, coaching, accommodation, and other study-related costs, helping them overcome financial obstacles. With initial funding from FSF, backed by the Van der Wijk family, and further supported by UWB's resources and partnerships, UFSF has expanded from aiding three students in its inception to **over 1,290 students** today.

Operating on a sustainable, interest-free loan model, UFSF empowers students to achieve educational independence, enabling them to build successful careers while eventually giving back to the fund. This model not only relieves families of financial strain but also fosters a cycle of support for future generations.



GET TOGETHER

Since its inception in 2008, the biannual Get Together event has become a cornerstone of the project, uniting students, alumni, funders, and UWB trustees in Vadodara. This full-day event fosters a strong sense of community and collaboration, providing an invaluable platform for juniors to learn from their seniors.

The July 2023 event featured **Mr. Mehernosh Daruwalla**, who spoke on Goal Setting, and **Ms. Deval Joshi**, who emphasized the importance of Soft Skills. Looking ahead, the January 2024 session will showcase **Ms. Hiral Matalia's** session on "Panthan: Prepare for the Future," focusing on personality grooming, image building, and industry readiness. Each event consistently attracts over 400 students, making it a pivotal moment for learning and growth.

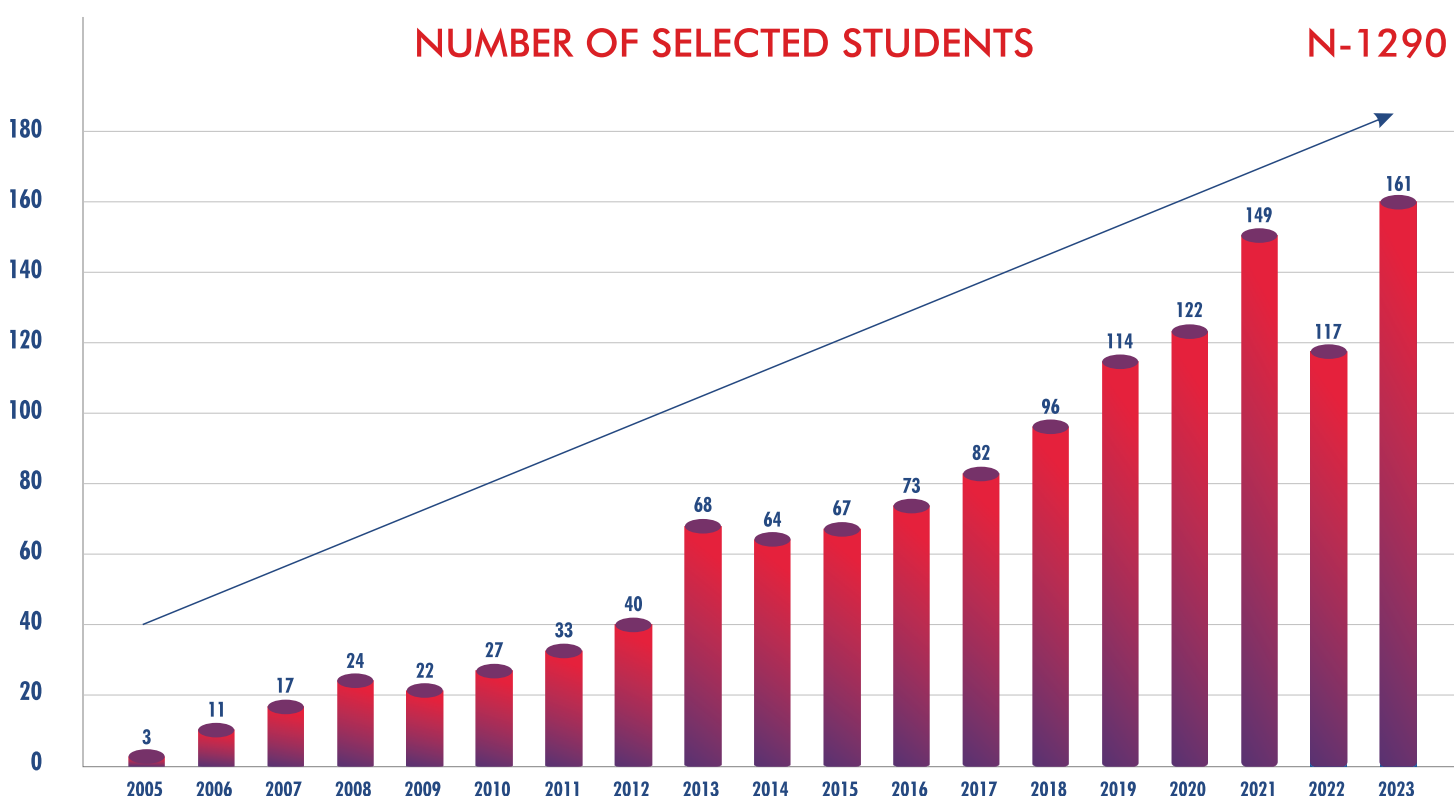
ONLINE LEARNING SESSIONS

In 2024, the Endeavour Online Learning series was introduced to enhance students' soft skills. Designed by Ms. Deval Joshi, the series includes six monthly lectures on:

Held on the fourth Sunday of each month, these sessions aim to complement students' academic growth with essential soft skills.

PROJECT IMPACT



The growth of student selection under the FSF project from 2005 to 2023 demonstrates a steady rise, beginning with just 3 students and reaching 161 in 2023. This increase reflects the project's expanding impact in supporting students' higher education despite financial challenges. Over the years, the program has positively impacted a total of **1,290 beneficiaries**, showcasing its growing influence and commitment to providing educational opportunities to those in need.

FROM STRUGGLE TO SUCCESS

MOHIT PARMAR



Mohit, an intelligent and determined student, aspired to become a Chartered Accountant. Despite his family's modest annual income of ₹1,80,000, he pursued his dreams with persistence. Today, as an Audit Associate at Mehta and Associates, Mohit credits his success to United Way of Baroda, stating, "I am where I am today solely because of UWB. All credit goes to them."

SANDHYA GONSAI



Sandhya, a top-performing student with 98% in 10th and 96% in 12th grade, overcame financial challenges with support from United Way of Baroda's FSF loan program. This assistance enabled her to clear the GPSC Class 2 exam and secure a government position. Now repaying her loan, Sandhya shares, "FSF was the best thing that ever happened to me."

KAUSHAL NAGANI



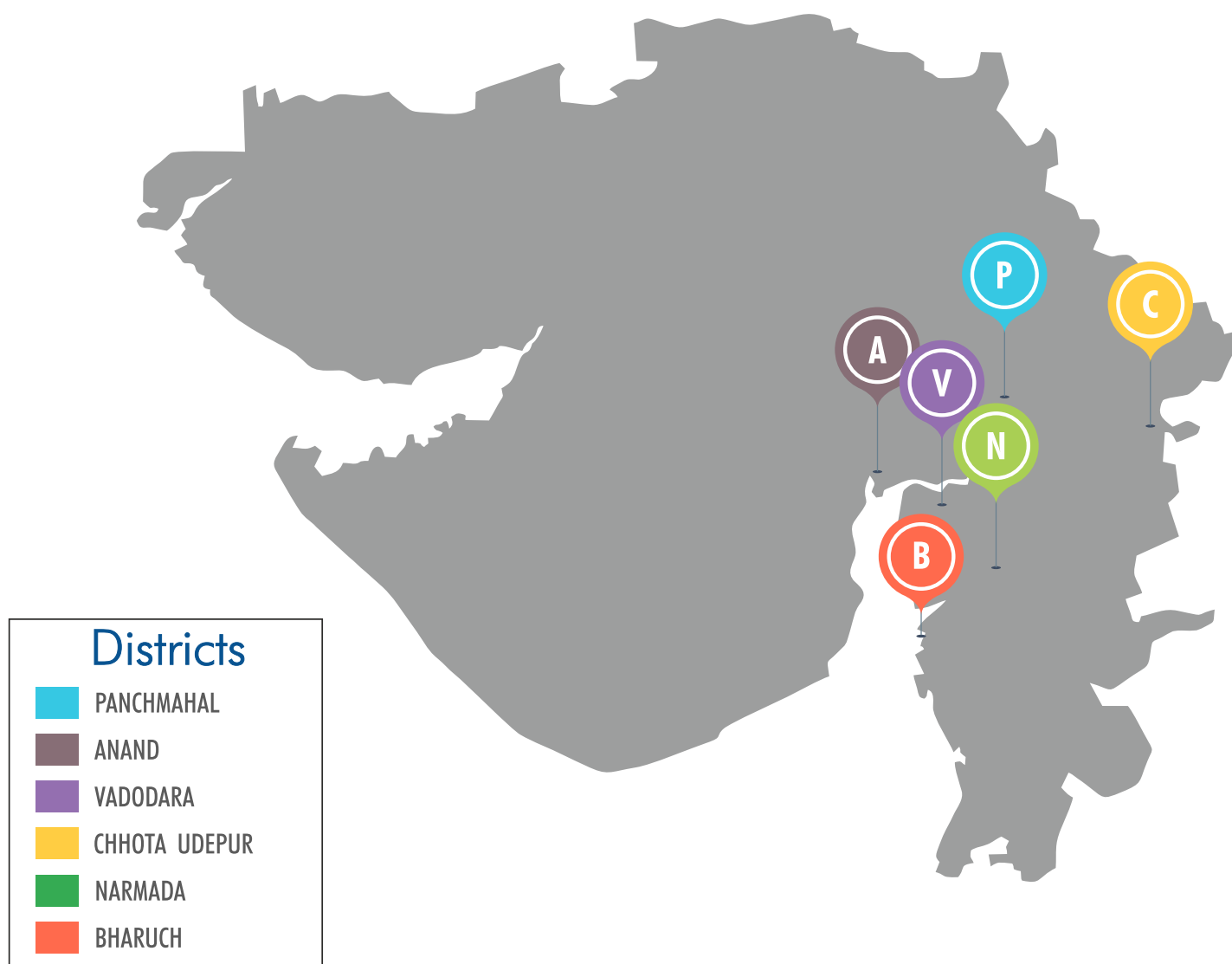
Kaushal, a bright student scoring 92% in 10th and 89% in 12th grade, faced financial challenges in pursuing higher education due to his family's limited income. With support from United Way of Baroda's FSF project, he graduated in 2020 with a B.Tech. from DA-IICT, Gandhinagar. Now an Associate Software Engineer at Tekion Corp., Kaushal supports his family and shares, "The support from UWB and FSF helped me achieve my goals. I am committed to helping students in need."

2. MISSION SHIKSHA

On May 4, 2021, United Way of Baroda launched Mission Shiksha in response to the profound impact of COVID-19 on children, especially those who lost one or both parents to the virus. This project serves as a lifeline for vulnerable children who now face not only the emotional trauma of loss but also significant financial and social challenges. Mission Shiksha ensures these children can continue their education and rebuild their lives by providing essential support.

Through community outreach, awareness campaigns, and focused interventions, Mission Shiksha informs families about the available support and encourages them to seek assistance. The children benefit from financial aid that covers school fees, educational supplies, and other necessary expenses, creating an environment where they can focus on their studies and regain stability. Currently, Mission Shiksha is supporting children across **six districts** of Gujarat. The success and impact of this project were made possible by the generous support from United Way Worldwide and the dedicated efforts of the United Way of Baroda trustees.

MISSION SHIKSHA IN 6 DISTRICTS



ACTIVITIES AT A GLANCE:

1. Academic Performance Review Meeting:

After providing continuous support for academic expenses for two years, the students' results were reviewed in May 2023 through personal interaction meetings. During these meetings, it was found that many students were facing challenges that were affecting their studies, such as lack of confidence, fear, household environment, and past trauma. To cope with these challenges, therapeutic counselling sessions were started in June 2023.



2. Therapeutic Counseling for Emotional Support

Recognizing the need for holistic support, Mission Shiksha introduced therapeutic counseling to help children whose academic progress was impacted by their loss. **Sixty children** were selected to participate in therapy sessions that provide a safe space for them to express their emotions, cope with grief, and develop resilience.



Six - Quality Therapeutic Counseling Sessions were conducted throughout the year, focusing on enhancing students' academic development.

3. 'Positive Parenting for Mothers' Workshop

To strengthen family bonds and effective parenting, Mission Shiksha organized a workshop attended by **53 mothers** of enrolled children. Led by subject expert Archita Patel Surti and UWB Executive Director Nilam Acharya, the session emphasized the importance of quality time, open communication, and empathy in parenting. The workshop covered topics such as:

- 1** Importance of open communication with children
- 2** Quality time spent with children
- 3** Monitoring children's online activities

The session addressed modern challenges, promoting responsible technology use and nurturing a supportive family environment for mutual growth.



4. Educational Kit Distribution:

With the aim of motivating and providing quality education, it was crucial to support the students with an educational kit. A customized comprehensive educational kit was prepared in four categories: "A" for UKG to 4th Standard, "B" for 5th to 7th Standard, "C" for 8th to 10th Standard, and "D" for 11th, 12th, and Diploma students. A total of **345 kits** were distributed.

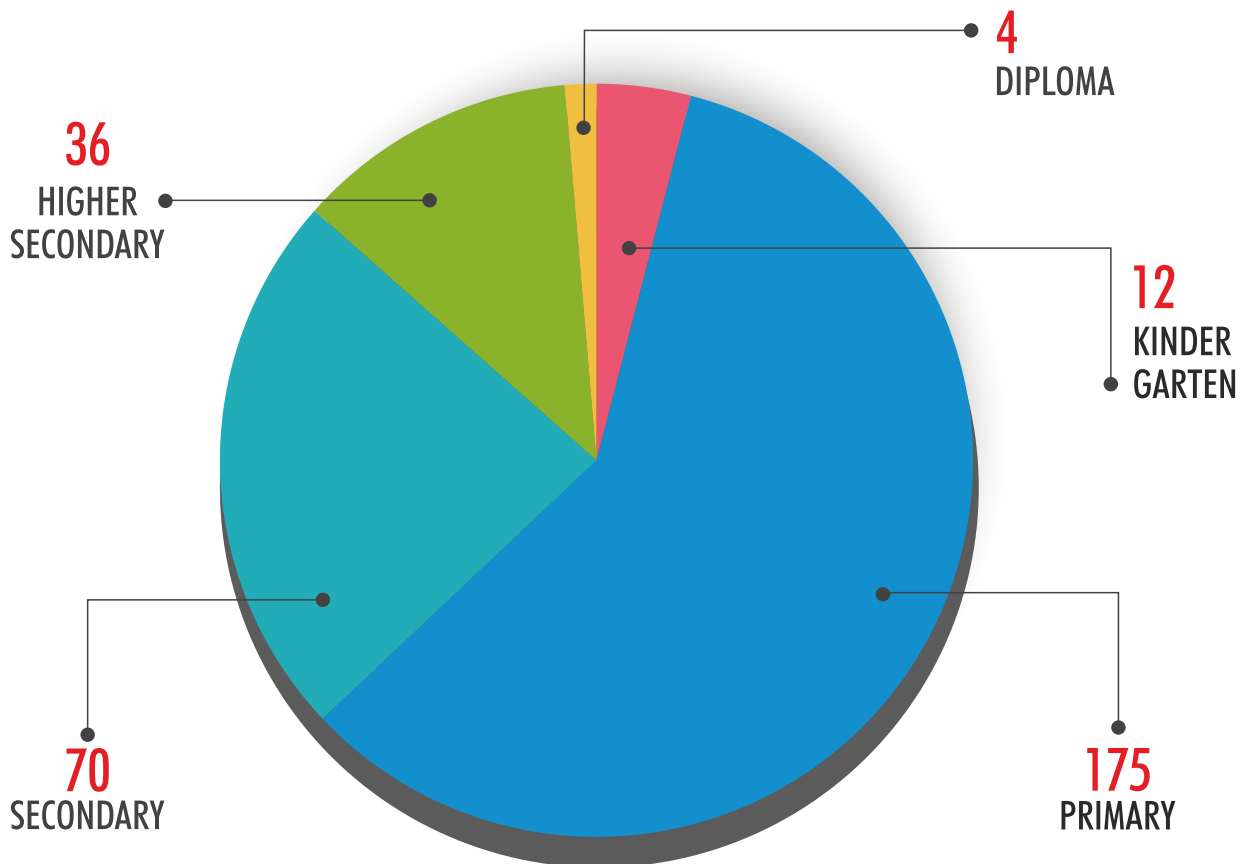


5. Mentoring Session - Exam Writing Tips:

A mentoring session was conducted to give individual tips for scoring higher marks to students who scored less than 50% in their first-term exams, facilitated by Ms. Nilam Acharya. Parents were also addressed on how to maintain a conducive atmosphere and proper behaviour with their children.

LIGHTING THE PATH

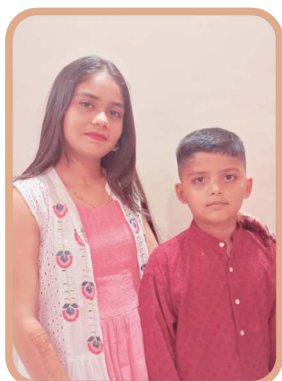
JANVI CHANDRAKANT JAGTAP



Janvi, a bright student scoring above 90% in 8th grade at Zenith School, faced hardship after losing her father during the pandemic. Living with her mother, sister, and grandmother, the family struggled to meet expenses on a modest income of INR 10,000–12,000.

Through the Mission Shiksha Project, Janvi's academic fees were covered, easing their financial strain. Her mother also completed a tailoring course via the Mission Skill Project by United Way of Baroda, receiving a sewing machine that boosted their income. This support was vital in helping the family navigate their challenges.

TIRTHA RAJPADHIYAR & DHAIRYARAJ RAJPADHIYAR



Siblings Dhairyaraj and Tirtha, both bright students, received academic support from the Mission Shiksha Project for three years. Tirtha scored 95% in her SSC exam, ranking 1st in Padra District, while Dhairyaraj achieved 92% in the 4th standard.

After losing their father during the pandemic, the family struggled financially, relying on a government pension and their maternal grandparents' support. Their mother expressed heartfelt gratitude for the Mission Shiksha Project's crucial assistance.

Over the past three years, the project has provided steadfast support to **356 students**, guiding them through their education up to the 12th standard. By ensuring continuous academic assistance, it has helped students overcome challenges and stay focused on their studies. The initiative has not only nurtured their educational growth but also instilled confidence and hope for a brighter future. Through dedicated efforts, it continues to empower young minds with opportunities for success.

3. SHIKHAR SCIENCE SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM:

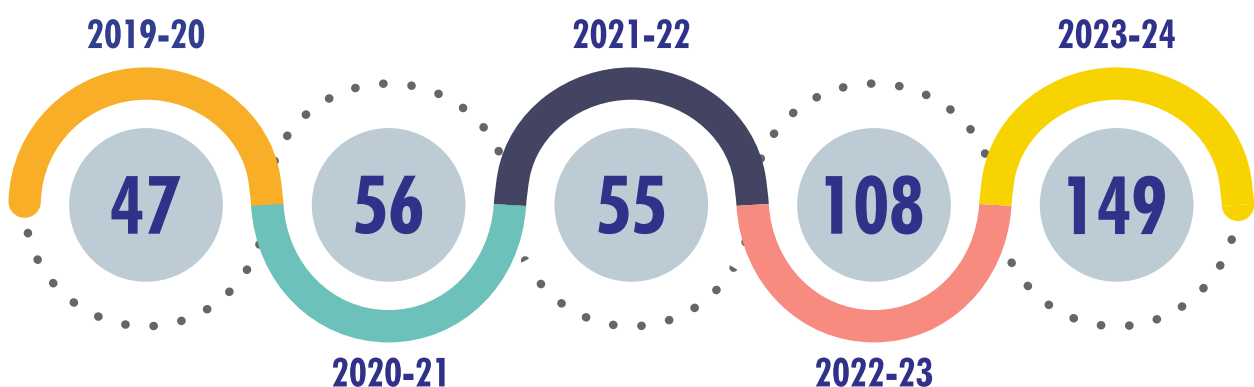
In 2018, United Way of Baroda and the C.S. Chawla Foundation launched the Shikhar Science Scholarship Program in Vadodara, Gujarat, to address the critical issue of high dropout rates in secondary education, particularly in the science field. The program was designed to empower dedicated students in grades 11 and 12 by providing the essential financial support needed to pursue successful careers in science.

The success of the program reflects its growing recognition and impact in promoting academic excellence. Starting with 23 deserving students, the program has since expanded to support **over 400 students** in Vadodara who are pursuing higher secondary education. This remarkable growth highlights the program's effectiveness in overcoming systemic challenges faced by students aspiring to study science.

Throughout the year, the program maintained its core values of academic excellence and holistic development. Scholarships were awarded based on merit and financial need, with a rigorous selection process identifying exceptional students who demonstrated both academic promise and financial necessity. The Shikhar Science Scholarship Program stands as a testament to the power of strategic partnerships and concerted efforts to empower youth, foster academic excellence, and create greater opportunities.

Students in the 12th grade who were preparing for board exams received exam wishing kits to encourage and support them during their examinations.

An exam preparation session was held by Mr. Sumit Ghosal, offering students valuable tips on time management, MCQ-solving techniques, concentration methods, and creating effective revision schedules.



DREAMS UNLOCKED

CHARMI RAMESBHAI SANCHALA



Charmi, a bright student, scored 93% in SSC, 92% in HSC, and 100/120 in GUJCET. Aspiring to study Computer Science at Nadiad University, she received a scholarship of INR 25,000 in both 11th and 12th grades. Her father, a tailor earning INR 10,000–12,000 monthly, and her uncle supported her and her sister's education. The family lived in their own 2BHK home.

SAIYED TAHOORABANU



Tahoorbanu, an aspiring doctor, scored 88% in SSC, 89% in HSC (Biology), and 511 in NEET. Living with her family in a modest home in Panigate, her father worked as an accountant earning INR 12,000–15,000, while her mother taught Arabic. She received a scholarship of INR 20,000 during her 12th grade at IIT Ashram to support her dream of pursuing an MBBS degree.

DARSH NILESHKUMAR VALAND



Darsh, an enthusiastic student, excelled academically, scoring 89% in SSC, 95% in 12th, and 118/120 in GUJCET. Aspiring to study Computer Science or IT Engineering at DAIICT, he received a scholarship of INR 15,000 during his 12th standard. Living with his parents in their own 2BHK home, his father worked as a designer, earning INR 18,000 per month, while his mother was a homemaker with degrees in arts and education.

4. ORPHAN, DESTITUTE AND SINGLE-PARENT PROJECT:

India grapples with millions of orphaned and vulnerable children affected by poverty, disease, disasters, and conflict. In response, Vishnubhai Amin's Orphan & Destitute and Single Parent Project was launched in 2006 by the United Way of Baroda (UWB) to provide educational assistance in Vadodara. The project's mission is to promote primary education and offer comprehensive support to children from orphaned, destitute, and single-parent backgrounds in **120 NPSS government schools**. Since its inception, the project has **aided over 13,000 children**, enhancing their well-being and future prospects through year-round activities such as festivals and educational tours that address socio-economic, emotional, and psychological needs. Key objectives include supplying educational materials, ensuring the completion of primary education, creating a supportive living environment, and facilitating access to higher education. In the 2022-23 academic year alone, the project supported more than 1,720 children, **with plans to assist over 2,200 this year**. Educational kits provided contain essential school supplies, and various recreational and celebratory activities are organized to foster holistic development.

ACTIVITIES AT A GLANCE:

Educational Kits - Customised educational kits were provided to children with supplies tailored to their respective grades, igniting a sense of excitement and empowerment, while nurturing a love for learning. A total of **2,226** orphaned, destitute, and single-parent students from 120 NPSS schools received these customised education kits, which included items specifically required for their current grade levels.



Khushiyon Ka Utsav: United Way of Baroda celebrates "Khushiyon Ka Utsav", a special event dedicated to fulfilling the wishes of **over 500 NPSS students**. Gifts such as carrom boards, cricket equipment, badminton sets, dollhouses, and other items, along with food, dance, music, and games, were provided to bring joy and a sense of celebration to the children. This year, **200 students from 21 NPSS schools** received gifts based on their choices. On the distribution day, they enthusiastically participated in various recreational activities, including game zones, a tattoo booth, a bouncy castle, lively dancing, and stepping to the music.



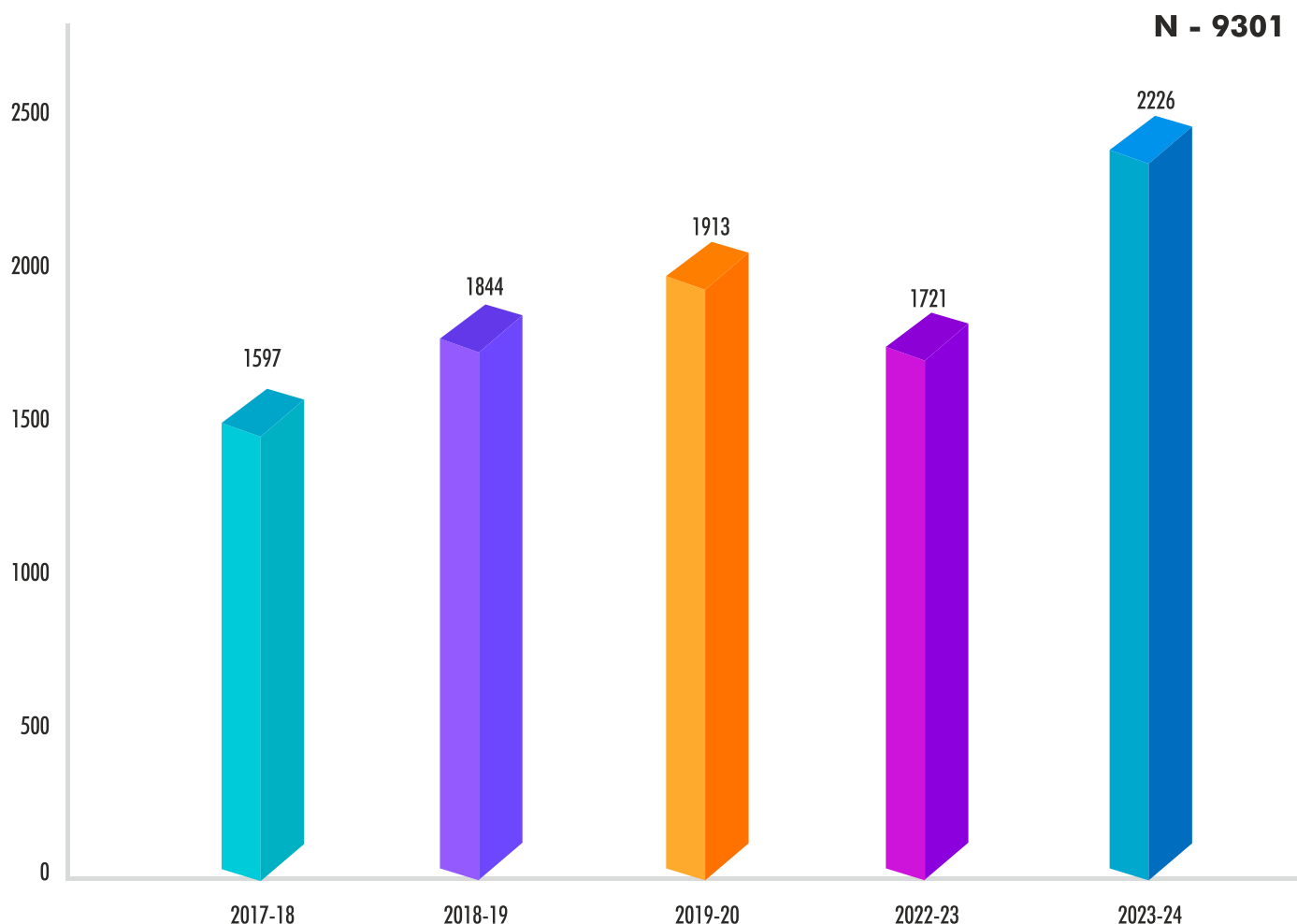

DHARA MAHENDRASINH CHAUHAN



Chauhan Dhara Mahendrasinh, a 12-year-old student, was enrolled in the 8th grade at Kavi Dula Kag Primary School, located on Harni Warashiya Ring Road. Dhara lived in the slums near Warashiya with her mother, as she had lost her father in 2015 due to an accident. Her father had worked as a laborer, and her mother, who worked as a maid, earned INR 6,000 per month. Since 2016, Dhara has been a beneficiary of United Way of Baroda's Orphan, Destitute, and Single Parent Project. This support has ensured that her mother did not have to worry about the cost of educational materials. Dhara expressed her gratitude to the donors, acknowledging the significant impact of receiving the educational kit each year.

HARSHAD SHAILESHBHAI VAGHELA



Vaghela Harshad Shaileshbhai, an 11-year-old student, was studying in the 7th grade at Dr. Sarvapali Radha Krishna Boys Primary School in Gotri. He lived in the slums of Gotri with his uncle and aunt after losing both parents to COVID-19.

Harshad was very grateful for the educational kit he received, as he could not afford such quality materials on his own. His uncle worked as a vegetable vendor, and his aunt was employed as a maid. Harshad had two siblings also studying at the same school. He expressed his heartfelt thanks to the donors for providing the educational kit, which greatly supported his academic needs.

KHUSHI SADUJI VANZARA



Vanzara Khushi Saduji, a 12-year-old student, was studying in the 8th grade at Dr. C.V. Raman Primary School in Manjalpur. Khushi lived in the LIG flats provided by the government. After the death of her father in 2017, her mother left Khushi and remarried. As a result, Khushi was raised by her grandmother, who sold vegetables at a local market in the evenings. Khushi assisted her grandmother with this work.

Despite these challenges, Khushi excelled academically and aspired to become a teacher. However, her grandmother's limited income could not cover the cost of her school education. Consequently, Khushi was enrolled in a government school and received an educational kit from United Way of Baroda, supported by Shree Dinesh Mills. The kit played a crucial role in supporting her educational needs.

5. UMANG EDUCATIONAL SCHOLARSHIP

United Way of Baroda is committed to making education accessible to all through the Umang Educational Scholarship project, which assists bright but underprivileged students in Vadodara District by bridging the financial gap for those unable to afford educational expenses. Introduced in the academic year 2023-24, this initiative primarily focuses on rural areas, including regions such as Waghodia and Savli, where access to educational resources is limited. Since its inception, the project has supported **233 deserving students**, helping them pursue their academic goals. The scholarship program provides essential educational support to disadvantaged individuals, fosters academic growth and excellence, and creates opportunities for a brighter future. By investing in education, United Way of Baroda is building a stronger and more equitable community, and invites everyone to join in making a difference in the lives of those who need it most.

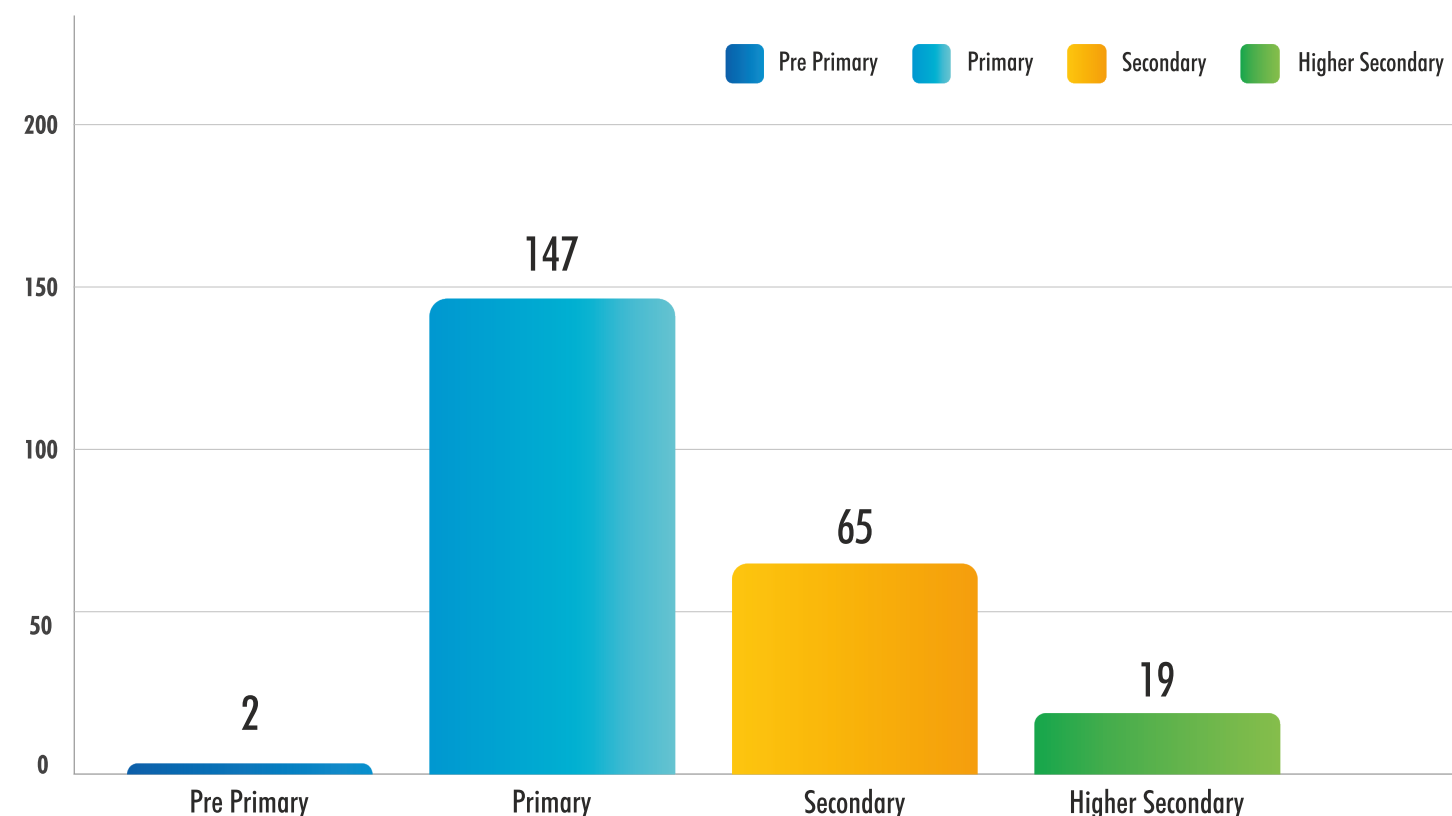

NANCY JIGNESH PATEL



Nancy Jignesh Patel, a 3rd grade student at Shree C.D. Patel Vidhayalaya, Thuvavi, lives with her family in Dabhoi, Vadodara. Her father, a farmer, was engaged in agriculture, while her mother runs a small beauty parlour, earning INR 2,000–3,000 monthly. PRACHI KRISHNAPRATAP SINH

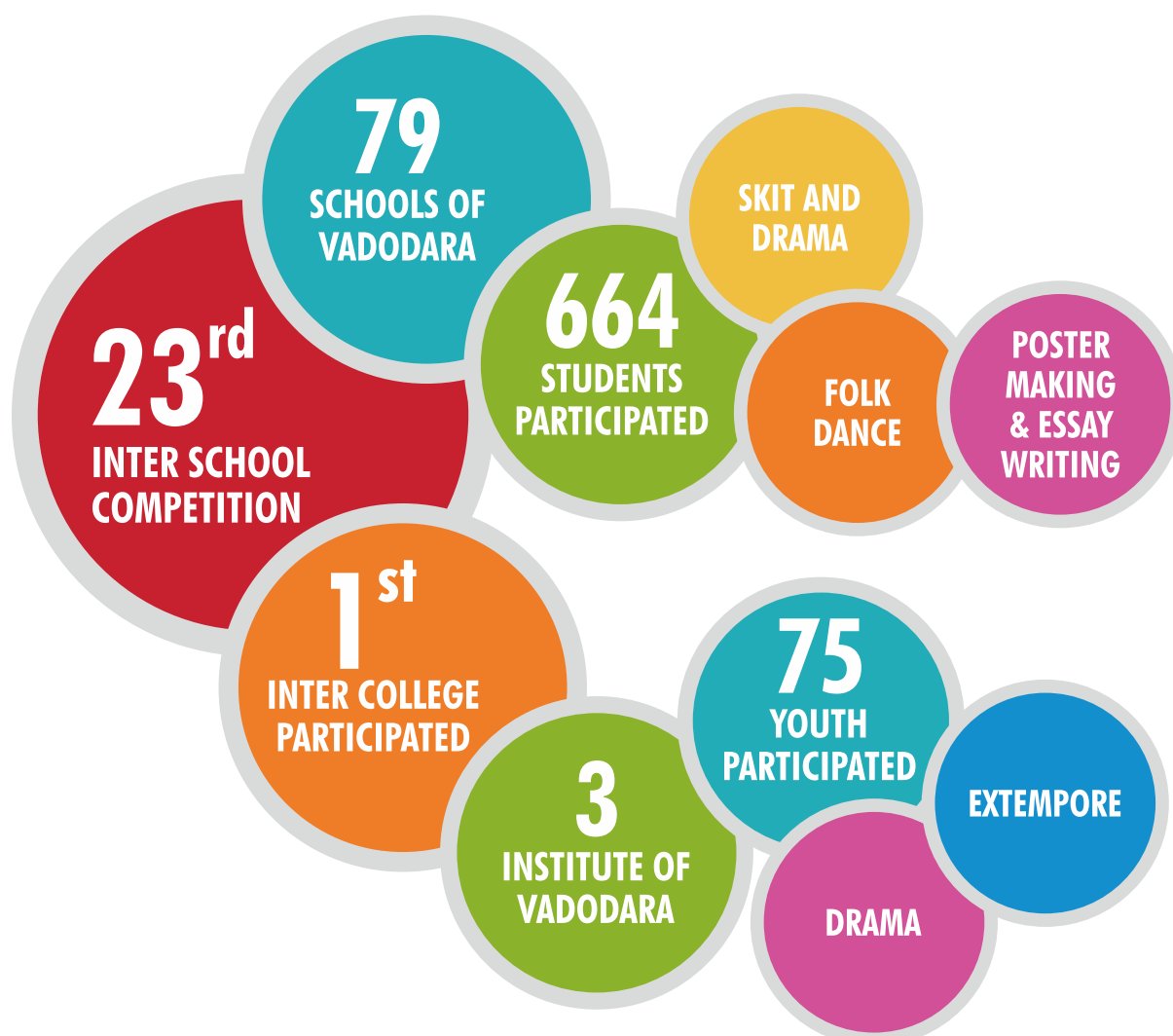

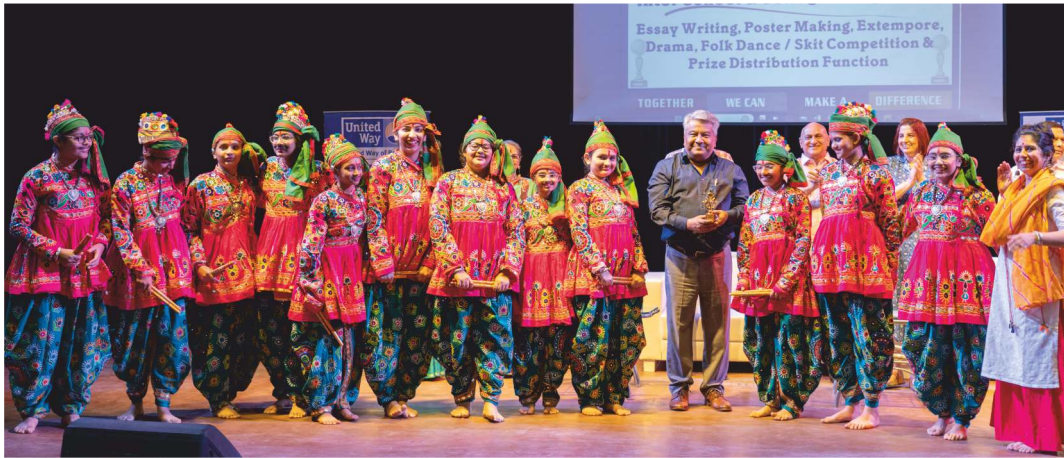
6. KALA JUNCTION:

A key feature of the Gold Card Scheme is its comprehensive doorstep household services, which include plumbing, electrical repairs, visiting nurses, health check-ups, TV technician services, bill payments, and AC servicing. These services are delivered directly to the homes of enrolled seniors, reducing the strain of managing household tasks and ensuring they receive the support they need without leaving the comfort of their homes.

Each year, numerous seniors enroll in the scheme to access these vital benefits, and the project is supported by a dedicated team of six technicians who diligently provide regular services to members. As the Gold Card Scheme celebrates its 25th anniversary, it remains a testament to the lasting impact it has had on improving the quality of life for senior citizens in Vadodara. The scheme's sustained success reflects its ability to adapt to the changing needs of seniors, offering a vital lifeline that promotes aging with dignity, safety, and comfort.

2. SHISHU KIT PROJECT

Safe Motherhood and Child Survival Project

The Shishu Kit Project, **launched in 2018** by the Lalitbhai Patel Foundation in partnership with United Way of Baroda, focuses on improving maternal and infant health for underprivileged mothers. To date, **over 45,000 New Born Kits** have been distributed, providing essential support to parents and helping alleviate the stress of unpreparedness. The project aligns with SDG 3, aiming to enhance the quality of care for mothers and children both during and after childbirth.



Each Shishu Kit contains 15 items, including a bag, sanitary napkins, a mother gown, baby clothes (2 sets of shirts, nappies, caps, and mittens), a baby wrap towel, a plastic mattress, and a baby care awareness leaflet. These items provide essential support for new mothers and their babies in the critical early days.

Shishu Kits are distributed in district hospitals across Vadodara, and the project also promotes behavioral change to ensure safer deliveries. At Jamnabai Hospital and SSG Hospital, sessions address family planning, mental health, and child care, with new programs focused on postpartum recovery through physical exercises.

Interactive sessions using live models, IEC materials, and posters engage beneficiaries, encouraging them to share their concerns and experiences. Led by two subject experts and a physiotherapist, these sessions continue to support the health and well-being of mothers and their babies, making a significant impact on the community.



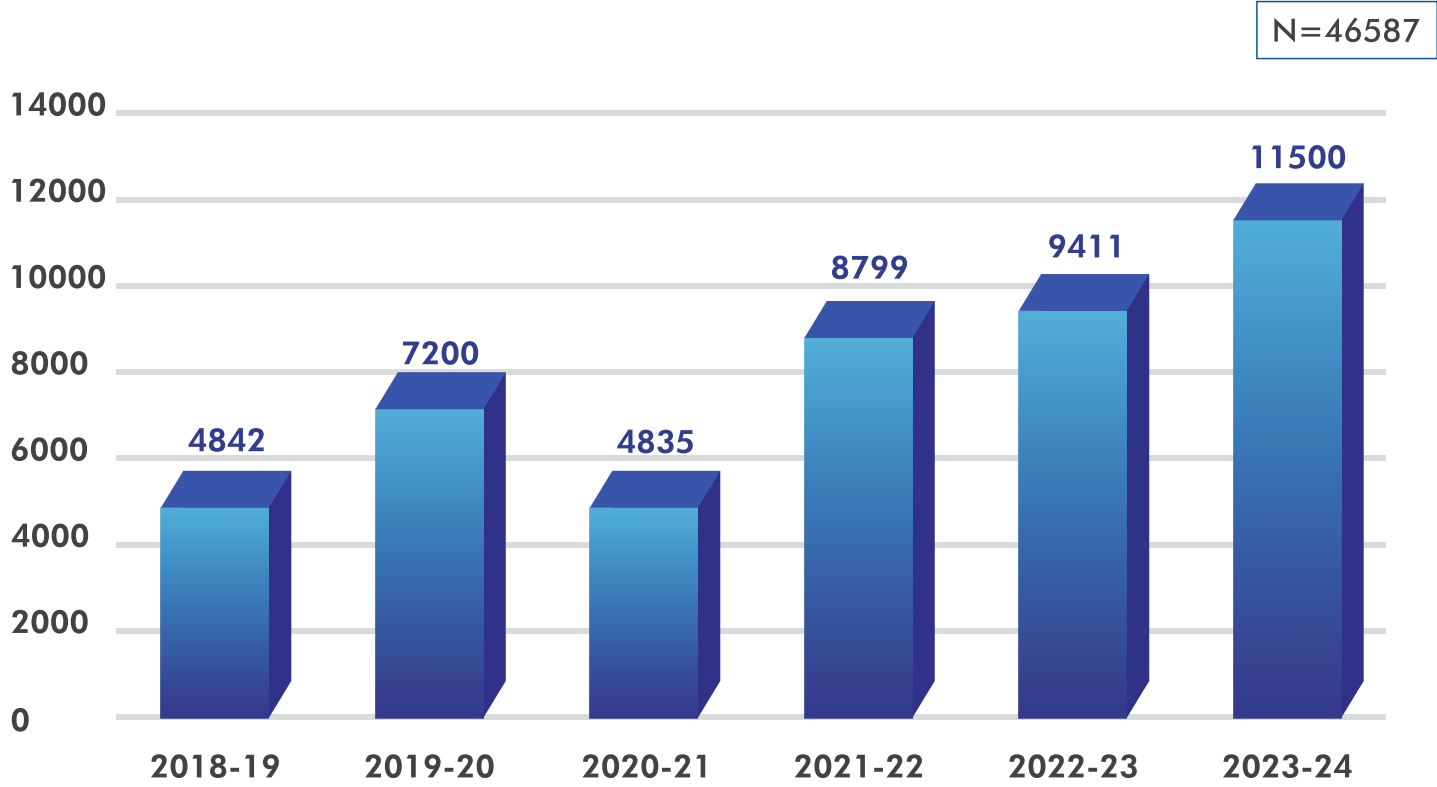

The kit contains **15 items**, including a bag, sanitary napkins, a mother gown, baby clothes (2 sets of shirts, nappies, caps, and mittens), a baby wrap towel, a plastic mattress, and a baby care awareness leaflet.

BEHAVIOURAL CHANGE COMMUNICATION (BCC) SESSIONS

Behaviour Change Communication is an interactive process with individuals, group or community to promote positive health behaviours which help the society to improve and solve their health problems. By adopting key health care practices such as the prompt seeking of care for pregnancy complications, early initiation of and exclusive breastfeeding, hand-washing, home management of diarrhoea etc proportion of Maternal, Neonatal and Child mortality can be reduced.

The challenge with behaviour change efforts has largely been implemented in SSG and Jamnabai hospital segmented approaches such as family planning, mental and maternal health, child care health sessions were given to the beneficiaries.

With addition to this, physical exercise sessions newly introduced for post-partum mothers to heal certain complications. Exercise during pre and post-partum period is beneficial for mother and child both. Exercises were demonstrating to the mothers and practiced.

Our approach in Livelihood Generation is to empower individuals by providing means of sustainable income sources, granting entrepreneurial support and promoting a sense of self-reliance for the overall well-being of the community.

1. Udaan Livelihood Program

The Udaan Livelihood Program, an extension of United Way of Baroda's Shishu Kit Initiative, is committed to empowering individuals with disabilities by offering meaningful employment opportunities. In 2023-24, **six students** from the Sai Residential School of Special Education in Vadodara actively participated in assembling **11,500 Shishu Kits**. This initiative not only led to tangible outcomes but also promoted personal growth, helping the students develop valuable skills, confidence, and a strong sense of responsibility.

The program's impact goes beyond financial benefits; it represents a transformation in the lives of these students. Despite facing challenges, the students earned a collective income of ₹57,500, showcasing their capability to work independently. The Udaan Livelihood Program fosters economic empowerment, social integration, and personal fulfillment, making a profound difference in the lives of those it serves.

The Shishu Kits assembled by these students contain 15 essential items: a bag, sanitary napkins, a mother gown, baby clothes (two sets of shirts, nappies, caps, and mittens), a baby wrap towel, a plastic mattress, and a baby care awareness leaflet. These items provide crucial support for new mothers and their babies during the early, critical days of life.

Aligned with SDG 8 (Decent Work and Economic Growth), the Udaan Livelihood Program helps integrate individuals with intellectual disabilities into the community, equipping them with the tools to live more independently and contribute productively. This initiative exemplifies how simple tasks, when approached with patience and support, can lead to significant personal and social achievements for those involved.

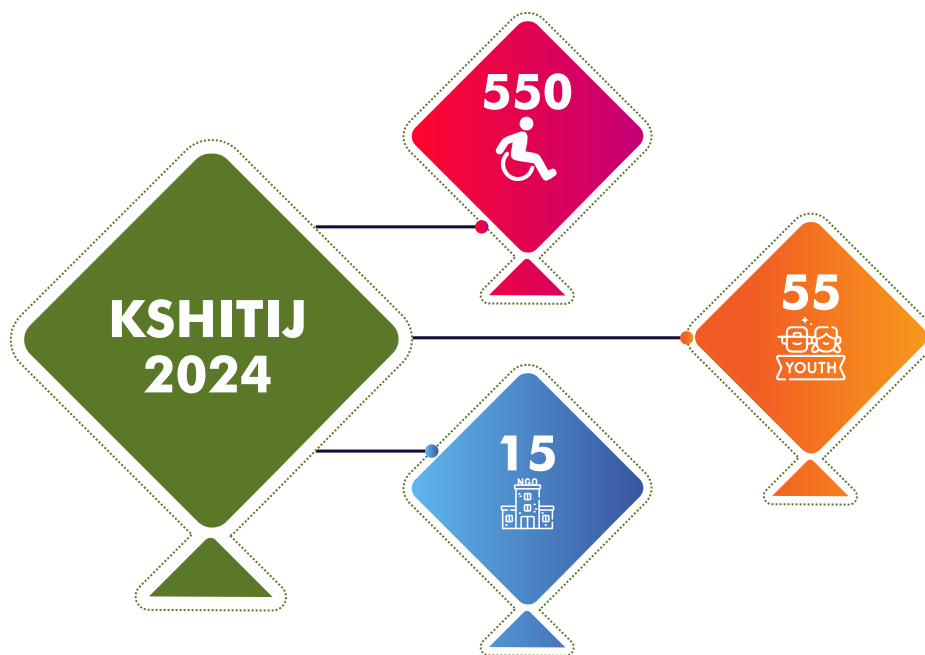

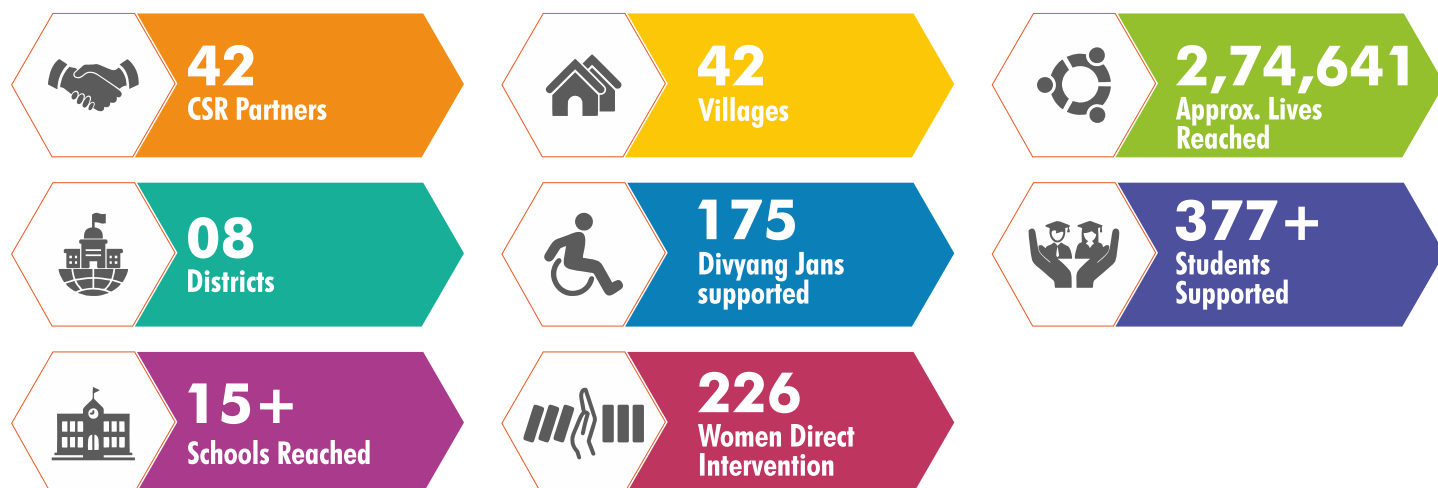

QUALITY EDUCATION

• Customized Education Kits •



To enhance the educational experiences of **1,005 students**, Customized Education Kits were donated to Umaraya Primary School and Luna Primary School in Padra Taluka. This initiative aimed to improve educational opportunities in the villages of Umraya and Luna. The personalized kits, tailored for primary to secondary school students, included essential items such as bags, water bottles, notebooks, cover rolls, pouches, and stationery.

• Medical Skill Development Program •



Thirty nursing students from Bankers Heart & Allied Institute received sponsorship for their education as part of the Medical Skill Development Program. This initiative aimed to support their medical training and help them generate income through their skills. The students were provided with educational materials, and upon completion of their course, they were awarded certificates of achievement.

• Education Through Eye Care Program •



Under the Education Through Eye Care program, a spectacle distribution event was organized at Kavi Dula Kag Primary School in Vadodara. **A total of 1,072 students** from government schools in the district received free spectacles to correct their vision. This initiative was focused on ensuring that students could fully engage in their education without the hindrance of vision problems.

EDUCATIONAL INSTITUTION ENHANCEMENT

• Digital Smart Classroom Project •



The Digital Smart Classroom Project at Trikampura Primary School in Halol Taluka was a transformative step towards educational empowerment. This initiative aimed to enhance digital literacy, close educational gaps, and improve the overall learning experience for rural children. By integrating modern teaching techniques and interactive digital resources, the project sought to foster creativity and holistic development in students. Additionally, a Digital Classroom was inaugurated at the Faculty of Management Studies, MS University, where innovative learning techniques, including visual and audio aids, were introduced to enhance students' academic engagement.



• School Enhancement Program •



The School Enhancement Program focused on upgrading the facilities at Government Secondary & Higher Secondary School in Anjesar Village, Taluka Savli, Anand. The enhancements included the implementation of a Digital Smart Classroom, the construction of a new toilet block for girls, roof waterproofing on the school building, the provision of **80 wooden benches and 5 green chalkboards**, and the erection of an entrance compound wall. These developments aimed to improve the educational environment for 183 rural students, ensuring that they have access to quality learning resources.

• Smart Classrooms •



In collaboration with network partner United Way Bengaluru, **two Smart Classrooms equipped with smart interactive panels and a Mini Science Lab** featuring working models were introduced at a government model school in Dhaneshwar, Ghoghamba. These resources are designed to promote STEM learning and provide students with hands-on experience in science and technology.

• Rural Rising Program •



United Way of Baroda, in partnership with United Way Bengaluru, launched the Rural Rising Program in Hathipura and Anjesar villages. As part of this program, three Anganwadis were refurbished, kitchen gardens were established, and learning materials were distributed following Early Childhood Care and Education (ECCE) training. Over 105 children in Anjesar Village benefitted from this initiative, which aimed to improve early childhood education in these rural communities.

• Transforming the Anganwadi Centre (AWC) •



In Bamangaon Village, Vadodara, an Anganwadi Centre was refurbished as part of an initiative focused on early childhood education and maternal healthcare. The upgraded facility now supports the educational and healthcare needs of children and mothers in the community.

• Smart Balwadi and Modern Anganwadi Centers •



At Narmadaben Khushalchand Government School (Panigate), the Smart Balwadi was refurbished with a **75-inch Smart TV and vibrant mural paintings**, both inside and outside, creating an engaging learning environment. Similarly, in Ekalbara village, Padra, the construction of a new Modern Anganwadi Center has supported early childhood education and community welfare, benefiting the village's young learners and their families.

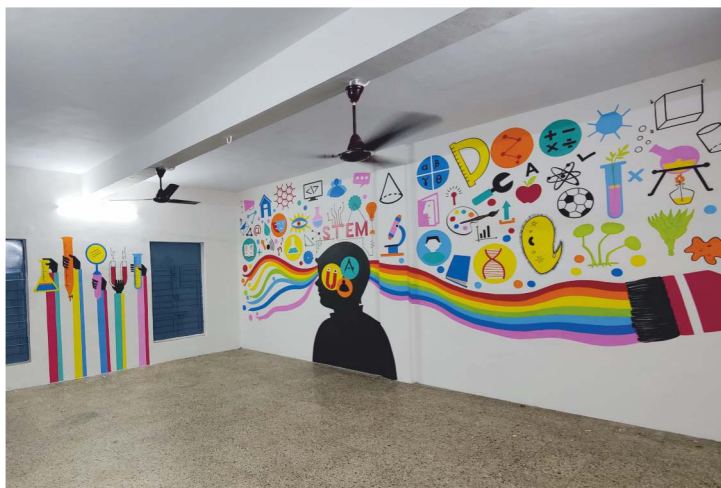
• Interactive Learning Initiatives •



A state-of-the-art **Sensory Room** was introduced at the Asha Special Education Centre to support the sensory and motor development of children with special needs. Additionally, ITI Tarsali received infrastructure support with **20 computers and chairs**, helping students access modern resources and further enhancing their educational pursuits.

• Smart Classrooms •

Three urban government schools - Bajwa, Gokalpuri (Bhayli), and Asoj (Savli) - were outfitted with state-of-the-art Smart Classrooms. These classrooms, featuring **75-inch interactive panels and educational software** tailored for grades 1 to 8, aim to improve digital literacy and interactive learning experiences among students.



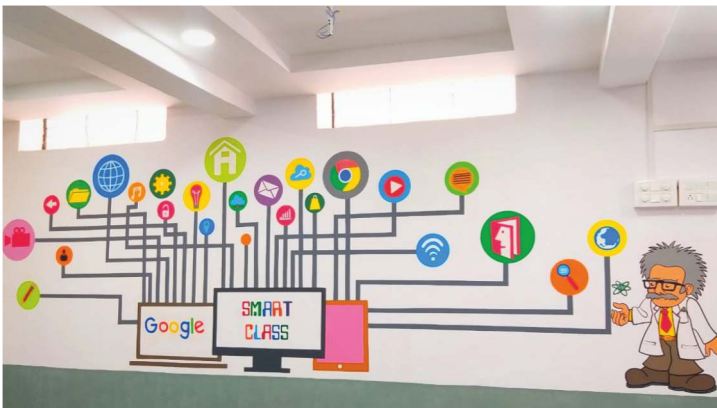
• Infrastructure Enhancements •

Comprehensive infrastructure upgrades, including vibrant educational murals, electrical improvements, and general infrastructure support, were implemented in these schools to create an environment conducive to student engagement and academic excellence. These upgrades aim to motivate students and foster a sense of pride in their educational space.



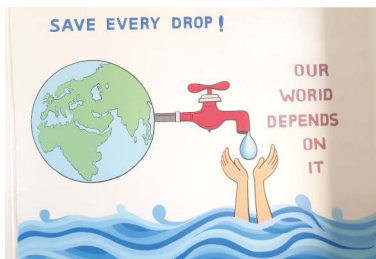
• Expansion to Rural Communities •

Recognizing the importance of accessible education beyond urban areas, a new school was constructed in Kakrdungri village, Halol Taluka, Panchmahal district. This initiative aimed to address the educational needs of rural children and provide them with quality education, helping them to realize their potential and pursue their aspirations.



ACCESS TO HEALTH

• RO Water Coolers •



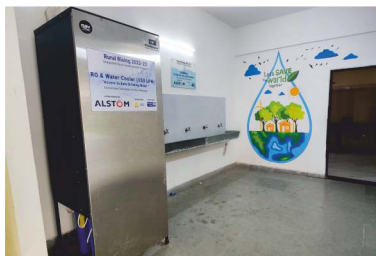
Two RO water coolers were installed at the Government Model School in Dhaneshwar (Ghoghamba) to provide students with access to clean and safe drinking water. This initiative aimed to improve student health by ensuring access to high-quality water and preventing waterborne illnesses.

• Sanitation Improvement •



Educational amenities were strengthened by constructing a new toilet block for students at Laxmipura Primary School, which greatly improved the hygiene and sanitation conditions for students.

• Water Facility Upgrades •



Essential upgrades were made at Narmadaben Khushalchand Government School in Panigate to ensure that students had access to safe drinking water, supporting their overall health and well-being.

• GendHer Campaign •



The GendHer Campaign focused on menstrual hygiene and empowerment for women and adolescent girls in Hathipura and Manjusar villages. Through educational sessions on Menstrual Hygiene Management, bodily changes, menstruation theory, symptoms, and menopause, the campaign aimed to promote health and dispel myths surrounding menstruation. As part of the initiative, **400 hygiene kits were distributed**, significantly improving health and hygiene standards in the community.



• The Renovation of the Labour Room •



Advanced healthcare provisions were introduced through the renovation of the Labour Room at CHC Padra. The improvements significantly enhanced maternal and child healthcare services, improving the overall healthcare experience for expecting mothers and newborns.

• Water ATMs •



Thirteen Community Water ATMs have been installed across various communities, each with a capacity of 250 litres per hour and 1,500 litres of storage. These ATMs provide affordable access to clean drinking water, helping reduce waterborne illnesses and improving overall community health.

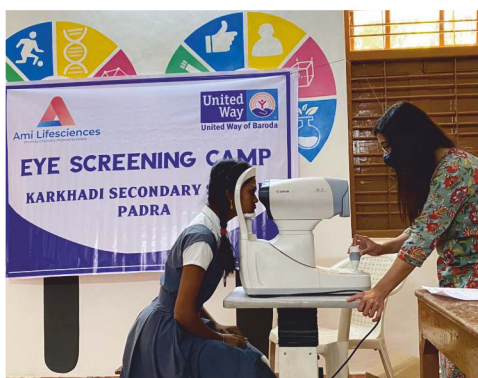
• High Mast Tower Lights •



Seven High Mast Tower Lights were installed in Ekalbara village, Padra taluka, to improve power distribution, safety, and security at night. This initiative enhanced the rural development efforts in the village by ensuring better lighting in public spaces.

• Urban Health Program •

Eye Screening Camps were organized for government school students in Vadodara district, benefiting **13,801 underprivileged students** by providing essential eye care services. This initiative aimed to raise awareness about common eye ailments and provide corrective solutions, resulting in **1,141 students receiving spectacles** and **33 students being referred for further treatment**.



LIVELIHOOD GENERATION

• Vocational Training Certificates •

Fifty women received vocational training certificates, and **140 Persons with Disabilities (PWD)** youths successfully completed skill training, qualifying for the Concepts of Computer Course (CCC) Government Exam. Among these students, **50 individuals secured campus placements**, marking a significant milestone in their professional journeys.



• General Duty Assistant Course •

Eighty girls began a three-month certificate course in General Duty Assistant, as part of the NSDC Skill India initiative. The course was designed to equip participants with essential skills to provide healthcare assistance in their communities, improving their career prospects.



• Livelihood and Empowerment Project •

The National Career Service Centre in Nizampura, supported by United Way of Baroda, aimed to empower women with disabilities (PWD) by providing resources and skill development programs. As part of the initiative, **seven industrial and eleven full shuttle sewing machines** were provided to help these women achieve sustainable livelihoods and financial independence.

• Advanced Vocational Training •

Fifty women from project villages completed a short-term tailoring course in 2022–2023 and received certificates for their accomplishments. In 2023–2024, they participated in an entrepreneurial development program that offered advanced training in tailoring, further enhancing their skills and providing them with greater economic opportunities.



• Integrated Rural Development Project •

The Integrated Rural Development Project was designed to empower communities through collaboration and skill enhancement initiatives. By promoting comprehensive development, the project fostered sustainable progress and inclusive growth, creating lasting positive impacts on individuals and their communities.



• Project Setu for Women Empowerment •

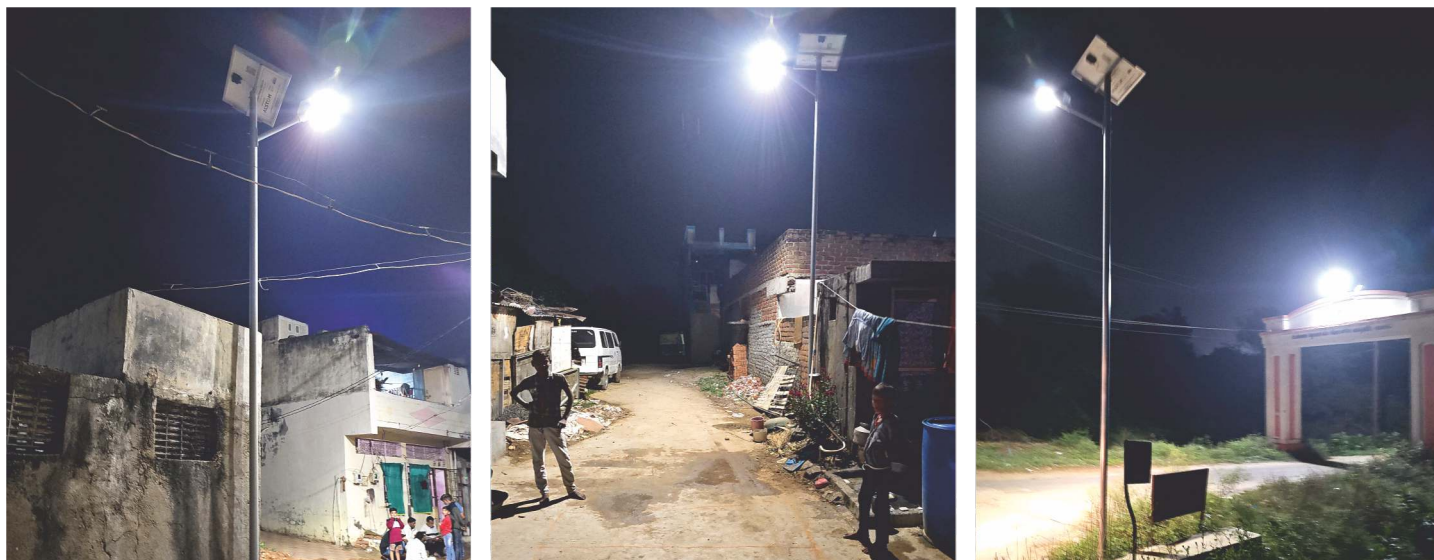
Project Setu for Women Empowerment sought to bridge the rural-urban divide through a tailoring course. Participants received **three months of hands-on training** in tailoring, culminating in certificates that equipped them with essential livelihood and financial skills.



SUSTAINABLE ENVIRONMENT

Solar Street Lights

In line with a commitment to sustainable energy, **25 solar street lights were installed** in Dhaneshwar village, providing an eco-friendly lighting solution while reducing reliance on non-renewable energy sources.



Solar-Powered Anganwadi



A new solar-powered Anganwadi was constructed in Hathipura, featuring a 2.2 kW rooftop solar system, a rainwater harvesting system, and a kitchen garden. This facility, which serves 110 children, offers a sustainable learning environment and promotes environmental responsibility.

Eco Park



An Eco Park was established in Anjesar village, transforming wasteland into a vibrant green belt. This park promotes environmental sustainability and provides a healthy space for villagers and visitors to enjoy nature.

Renewable Energy Projects



In collaboration with corporate partners, **180 solar streetlights** were installed in three villages of Anand District—Bandhani, Diver, and Kalamsar. These solar installations have improved nighttime visibility, reduced electricity costs, and enhanced energy independence in these rural communities.

• **Mega Plantation Drive** •

United Way of Baroda, with corporate collaborators, organized a "Mega Plantation Drive" at the Eco Park site in Anjesar Village. The initiative transformed **15,000 square feet of wasteland into a sustainable garden**, featuring eight solar streetlights, a two-kilowatt solar-powered borewell, and a variety of tree species and medicinal shrubs. The park also includes eco-friendly play equipment made from recycled plastic.



EMPLOYEE VOLUNTEERING

Teachers' Day Celebration

On September 22, 2023, a Teachers' Day celebration was held at Model School in Halol Taluka. **Nine employees from a corporate partner served as educators**, teaching various subjects and providing valuable insights to students about academic and personal growth. The event celebrated the contributions of teachers and provided a unique opportunity for students to engage with different teaching styles.



World Environment Month

In celebration of World Environment Month, United Way of Baroda organized a week-long Seed Ball Making campaign from June 26 to July 1, 2023. This initiative involved **80 employees from a corporate partner**, who together created **800 seed balls to promote environmental sustainability**. The seed balls were distributed among the community to help restore natural habitats.



• Employee Volunteering Activity •

As part of the College Student Scholarship Programme, employees volunteered in the interview process for selecting deserving students to receive scholarships. This initiative allowed employees to give back to the community by contributing to the development of the next generation of leaders.



• Mural Painting at a School •

As part of the Integrated Rural Development project, **ten employees volunteered** to assist with mural painting at a local school in one of the rural communities. The mural work transformed the school's environment, making it a more engaging and inspirational space for students to learn.
